DISTRICT EVENT

ALL DISTRICTS

Since March 22 2003 the Israeli army continues to impose a total closure over the West Bank and Gaza Strip following the assassination of Sheikh Ahmad Yassin, the founder of Hamas. The Israeli army prevented civilians from crossing the Green Line and entering Jerusalem, closed all crossing points to workers, and restricted movement between cities in the West Bank.

	 (iv) Khader Al Rajabi; (v) Suada Abu Najma; and (vi) Nadir Beidun. • <u>Demonstration</u>: At 13:00, a demonstration took place in the village of Qatanna in protest against the continued construction of the Wall, despite an order by the Israeli Supreme Court to suspend all construction in the village. Confrontations occurred between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 11 civilians.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Construction: Construction of the western portion of the Wall continues in Budrus, Deir Qaddis, Rantis, Beit Liqya, near Beituniya and near the village of Midya. Raids: At 06:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Bir Zeit and the village of Jifna. Israeli helicopters patrolled the skies over the area. The Israeli army raided the village of Beit Ur al Tahta, searched several houses and arrested 2 civilians. The Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Ni'ma and arrested 1 civilian. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of Beit Ur al Tahta: Hamza Towfiq; and Nadi Musa. The Israeli army arrested 1 civilian in the village of Kafr Ni'ma: Muhannad Al Dik.
JENIN	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impede access to health facilities. Wall Construction: Construction of the Wall continues south of Jalbun towards Al Mutilla, Raba, Al Mughayyir, Bardala and 'Ein al Beida and towards the Jordan River. Raid: At 02:45, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Ra'i, searched 1 house and arrested 3 civilians, including 1 child. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the town of Kafr Ra'i: (i) Muhammad Miflih, 17 years old;

	(ii) Akram Zuhdi; and (iii) Anas al Sheikh Ibrahim.
JERICHO	Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing civilians from crossing.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing civilians from crossing. Wall Construction: The Israeli army continues construction of the Wall north and east of the district of Bethlehem, stretching westwards along Wadi Hulwa, the Armenian convent, the Jerusalem/Bethlehem road, and the tunnel road (Gilo); south east of Wadi Hulwa; south east of Beit Sahur and Ish Ghurab military post; and west of the town of Za'tara and Al Fureidis mountain. Raid: At 04:45, 50 Israeli army jeeps raided the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem, surrounded a psychiatric hospital and opened fire. Israeli helicopters opened intensive fire towards the 2nd floor of the hospital, causing severe damage to the building. The Israeli army arrested 17 civilians, including 8 officers from a military medical unit. The Israeli army raided the house of Dr. Isam Bannura, director of the psychiatric hospital, in Beit Sahur, severely beat him and took him to the psychiatric hospital before releasing him. Detention: At 11:40, the Israeli army detained a large number of civilians, including the mayor of Bethlehem, at Al Sawahira ash Sharqiya checkpoint.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impede access to health facilities. Attack: At 17:00, the Israeli army opened fire at civilian vehicles at a checkpoint set up near the entrance of the town of Bal'a. Raids: At 15:45, an Israeli army jeep raided Tulkarem refuge camp, searched 1 house, damaged furniture and property, and arrested 6 civilians. At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and opened indiscriminate fire towards civilians. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Al Labad and

	opened indiscriminate fire towards civilians. • Air Patrols: (i) At 09:00, Israeli combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the city (ii) At 23:00, and again at 01:00, Israeli helicopters patrolled the skies over the district. • Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 6 civilians in Tulkarem refugee camp: (i) Muhammad Hasan, 16 years old; (ii) Mahmoud Shahed; (iii) Anas Al Husari; (iv) Ayman Hijazi; (v) Omar Al Turk; and (vi) Omar Hijazi.
NABLUS	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Land Confiscation Notice: The Israeli army verbally informed residents of the village of Khirbet Tana to evacuate their homes and land within 1 week, claiming that the village is located on land designated for Israeli settlements. The area of the village is 2,500 dunums (625 acres). Raids: At 13:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Sawiya and shut down Al Sawiya Secondary School, claming that Israeli settler vehicles have been attacked by stones from the direction of the school. At 04:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and Ras El 'Ein refugee camp, occupied 1 building and converted it into a military post. The Israeli army raided the village of Urif, searched several houses and arrested 2 civilians. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested: Ra'fat Al Safadi and Zeid Al Safadi in the village of Urif. The Israeli army arrested Ahmad Hamadna at a checkpoint located between the town of Asira ash Shamaliya and the village of al Tur.
HEBRON	 Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Raids: (i) At 15:00, the Israeli arm raided the town of Dura and the village of Kurza and searched several houses. (ii) The Israeli army raided Al Arrub refugee camp and imposed curfew. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Abdul Hay Abu Rayan at a checkpoint near the settlement of Kfar Etzion.

Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians **QALQILYA** granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impede access to health facilities. Arrest: At 17:20, the Israeli army arrested Muhammad Oweinat at a checkpoint located on the Qalqiliya/Tulkarem road. **Closure:** The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing dozens of entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Raids: (i) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr ad Dik. At 22:10, the Israeli army, accompanied by a bulldozer, levelled land to close the rood connecting the village to the settlement of Peduel and **SALFIT** uprooted a number of trees. (ii) At 21:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Bruqin. At 05:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Zawiya and (iii) imposed curfew. The curfew remains in effect as of 08:00 this morning. Settler Violence: At 19:20, an armed Israeli settler opened fire while driving near the junction of Haris towards civilian houses.

GAZA STRIP

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure: Beit Hanoun crossing is partially open to businessmen over 28. At 19:15, the Israeli army closed Salah ad Din road to vehicles, stating that the closure was for security reasons north of Beit Hanoun. The road was later reopened.
GAZA CITY	• <u>Closure</u> : (i) The junction of Nitsareem remains closed. (ii) Al Mintar crossing (Karni) remains closed.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not yet reported.

KHAN YUNIS	 Closure: Abu al Ajin road (Khan Yunis Al Sharqiya) remains closed. Western road (Khan Yunis) remains closed. Al Mawasi/Khan Yunis road (Al Tuffah checkpoint) was open to pedestrians over 40 years old. Abu Holi road was partially opened. At 14:50, the Israeli army closed the road between the checkpoints of Abu Holi and al Matahin. Attack: At 17:25, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from Point 12 towards civilian houses in Al Nimsawi neighbourhood. Raid/Land Levelling: At 16:20, 2 Israeli tanks and 2 bulldozers raided Al Amal neighbourhood and searched the area with police dogs. The Israeli army levelled land west of Al Amal neighbourhood.
RAFAH	 Closure: The Gaza International Airport remains closed. Sufa crossing is open to specific cargo only. Rafah crossing is partially open. Arrest: At 18:40, the Israeli army arrested Muhammad Atiya, a Palestinian National Security officer, at the Rafah crossing.

GENERAL

POLITICAL PRISONERS	 <u>Child Prisoners</u>: Child detainees at the Benyamin Military Detention Centre near Ramallah have been subject to extreme mental duress during interrogation, medical negligence and inadequate food rations. <u>Physical Assault</u>: 6 political prisoners in Etzion and Adummim Prisons were physically assaulted and severely beaten by Israeli soldiers.
WORK PRMITS	 West Bank: 3,595 permits for workers were issued; however, no workers have been allowed to cross the Green Line since the closure imposed on 22 March 2004. Work permits for residents of Bethlehem continue to be held at the Israeli Civil Coordination Committee headquarters. Gaza Strip: 1,870 workers crossed into the Erez Industrial Zone, 38% of a total of 5,003 workers issued permits. 11,519 workers carry valid permits to cross the Green Line; however, no workers have been allowed to cross the Green Line since the closure imposed on 22 March 2004.
