WEST BANK

The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank. Beginning at 24:00 on 06 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the West Bank districts on the occasion of the Jewish holiday of Passover. Only allowing access to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases, the Israeli army has prevented civilians and workers from accessing the city of Jerusalem and areas inside the Green Line. The closure will last until 24:00 on 18 April 2009.

• Closure:

- (i) Beginning on 08 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up several checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound, providing protection to Israeli settlers, who travelled to the Western Wall in the old city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (iii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Raids/Attack:

- (i) At 16:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of Samir Amis north the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) At 18:40, the Israeli army raided and combed the area of the stone quarries near Qalandiya refugee camp. The Israeli army also opened fire and withdrew at 20:30.

	 (iii) The Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis, set up a checkpoint on the junction to the Al Quds University, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. • Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish holiday of Passover in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the road connecting the villages of Ras Karkar and Kharbatha Bani Harith; the entrances to the villages of Sinjil, Saffa, and 'Ein Yabrud; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint on the overpass to 'Atara town and impede civilian access. Raids: At 13:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Turmus'ayya and patrolled the area until 15:40. At 14:10, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh and patrolled the area until 14:20. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Liqya. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beituniya, searched 1 building, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested 'Abbas Mutee' Abdul Qader Najjar in the town of Beituniya. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish holiday of Passover west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Raid: At 19:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area between the town of Qabatiya and the village of Mirka.

	Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted
	special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint in the eastern Tubas district, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Raid: At 00:45, the Israeli army raided the city of Tubas and patrolled the area until 02:30.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raids: At 19:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Qaffin. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and combed the area east of the village of Far'un. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and to impede civilian access. Settler Violence: At 15:00, a group of Israeli settlers gained access into the southern quarter of the village of Kafr Qaddum. Following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO), the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. Wall Construction: Having completed the Wall-related infrastructure, land levelling for Wall construction ceased in the towns of 'Azzun and Kafr Thulth as well as in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif. Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish holiday of Passover south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfe Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Sarra-Jit; Til-Burin; Beit Furik-Salem; the road between the town of 'Aqraba and the main road; and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya. The Israeli army also continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Til and Madama; the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; the western entrance to the town of 'Aqraba; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the western entrance to the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to restrict civilian daily passage along the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to Deir Sharaf village and the settlement of Shavei Shomron between 06:00 and 21:00.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to allow Palestinians holding Israeliissued IDs to access the city of Nablus by their private vehicles through Beit Furik checkpoint and Biet Iba iron gate. Additionally, the Israeli army allows free access to physicians, who are residents of the city of Nablus.
- (iii) Beginning on 15 February 2009, the Israeli army has allowed free access by private vehicles to all residents of the city of Nablus, who are above 50 years of age and in company with their families, through checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus.
- (iv) Having removed Beit Iba checkpoint, the Israeli army installed an iron gate near the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf along the Nablus-Tulkarem main road. The iron gate is open everyday between 05:00 and 24:00 to allow civilian access without permits.
- (v) At 12:15, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions and impeded civilian access at the Nablus-'Asira ash Shamaliya checkpoint.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint along Wadi al Badhan road (the eastern entrance to the city of Nablus) and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Attack:

- (i) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Agraba.
- (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Al Badhan, An Nassariya, and Khirbet Bani Hasan.
- (iii) At 21:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Talfit.
- (iv) At 01:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and 'Askar refugee camp. The Israeli army also opened fire and fired sound grenades and withdrew at 06:00.

- (ii) At 14:30, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions and impeded civilian access at the DCO checkpoint set up at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho.
- Raid: At 13:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Jericho and pursued a civilian vehicle.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 07:30, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat and left with contusions 2 civilians in the vicinity of the village of Fasayil:
- (i) Yousef Mohammed Jahalin; and
- (ii) Abdullah Ibrahim Ikteifat.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 19:30, a mass demonstration took place in the city of Jericho on the occasion of the Palestinian Prisoner Day in solidarity with political prisoners and demanding that they be released from Israeli prisons.

Closure

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: In addition to 2 side roads east and south of the village of Al Walaja, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; Talita-Nazlet as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala; Al Khadr -Road # 60; Al Khadr -Beit Jala Housing Project; Wadi Rahal-Efrat; and the side road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 16:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles until 18:00.

Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Security Forces:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr, took position near a Palestinian National Security checkpoint, and patrolled the area.
- (ii) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Ash Shawawra. At 22:30, the Israeli army raided the village again, searched a house, and served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (iii) At 12:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 14:20.
- (iv) At 22:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Tuqu', searched a house, and served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- <u>Demonstration</u>: At 10:00, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Bethlehem in solidarity with political prisoners and demanding that they be released from Israeli prisons.

BETHLEHEM

Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish holiday of Passover in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja. **Closure:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron. (iii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction. **Closure of Main Roads:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to **HEBRON** the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to Al Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp and the village of At Tuwani. (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street leading to the old city of Hebron. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road (iii) between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60. The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the junction of (iv) Farsh Al Hawa, which leads to Road # 35 that leads to Targumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road (v) connecting the towns of Surif and Beit Ummar. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrances to (vi) the village of 'Abda and Khirbet Karma. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks a side road (vii) along Road # 35 in the area of Wadi Qeizun near the overpass to the town of Halhul (the northern entrance to the city of Hebron).

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Kharsa and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/School Disruption:

- (i) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Khirbet Safa, raided a kindergarten, and brought down the Palestinian flag on the kindergarten roof.
- (ii) At 10:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (iii) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- (iv) At 18:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit Ar Rush al Fuqa and arrested 4 children.
- (v) At 20:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The Israeli army arrested 4 civilians in the village of Beit ar Rush al Fug:
- (i) Nadeem Mousa ad Darawish, 17 years old;
- (ii) Mohammed Omar Harbi Qashour, 17 years old;
- (iii) Mus'ab Omar Harbi Qashour, 15 years old; and
- (iv) Mu'ath Saher Harbi Qashour, 16 years old.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 18:50, the Israeli army detained 2 civilians (brothers) in the old city of Hebron:
- (i) Thaer Nidhal al 'Uweiwi; and
- (ii) Ghandi Nidhal al 'Uweiwi.
 - The Israeli army released both civilians at a later time.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish holiday of Passover in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area between the settlement of Eshkolot and the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta; and in the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold.

Violations of the Ceasefire: (i) Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea as well as towards beaches of the cities of Khan Yunis and Rafah. (ii) Armed Palestinian groups fired 1 unidentified mortar towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	 Attack: In the morning of 15 April 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea as well as towards the beach of the city of Khan Yunis. Palestinian Attack: In the evening of 15 April 2009, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed. Attack: In the morning of 15 April 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea as well as towards the area of As Suweidiya on the city of Rafah's beach.
