#### Raids:

- (i) At 18:20, the Israeli army, including 15 jeeps, raided Ad Duheisha refugee camp and surrounded the National Association for Computers. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army arrested 1 civilian, and detained 3 other civilians. At 01:50, the Israeli army raided the camp again and arrested 1 female civilian.
- (ii) At 22:20, an Israeli army infantry force raided and patrolled the city of Beit Jala.
- (iii) At 01:50, Israeli army patrols raided the city of Bethlehem and patrolled the area.
- Arrest: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in Ad Duheisha refugee camp:
- (i) Rasha Al Qassas, a female civilian; and
- (ii) Suleiman Mohammed Abu 'Alieh.

# • <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.

- <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities.
- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 09:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Attil and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### Raids:

# (i) At 10:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Seida, occupied 2 houses, and converted the houses into military posts.

- (ii) At 21:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and its suburbs and opened indiscriminate fire.
- (iii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Meithalun, opened indiscriminate fire, and searched several houses.
- (iv) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatiya, opened indiscriminate fire, raided 1 sports club, and searched several houses. The Israeli army withdrew at 05:00.
- <u>Air Patrol</u>: At 14:00, an Israeli army reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over the city of Tulkarem and its suburbs.

#### <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities. Raid: At 12:10, an Israeli army jeep raided the city of Qalqiliya. At 22:30, the Israeli army, included several patrols, raided the city again, searched **QALQILYA** several houses, arrested 2 civilians, and detained 6 others. The Israeli army withdrew from the area at 00:30. **Injuries:** At 08:00, an Israeli army jeep collided with a civilian driving instruction vehicle west of the town of 'Azzun, injuring 3 individuals, including 1 officer, and causing damage to the vehicle. **Arrests:** The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Qalqiliya: 'Atif Ash Sharif; and (i) Ahmed Ad Dalu. (ii) **Closure:** The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction west of the village of Iskaka, north of the city of Salfit (around the settlement of Ariel) and in the villages of Al Zawiya and Deir Ballut remains suspended due to changes in the Wall route following an Israeli Supreme Court order. Flying Checkpoint: At 08:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Deir Istiya and searched civilian vehicles. Raids: **SALFIT** (i) At 09:30, an Israeli army jeep raided and patrolled the village Khirbet At 14:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Salfit and patrolled (ii) the area. At 00:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the towns of Haris and Kifl (iii) Haris and patrolled the area. **Settlement Activity/Land Levelling:** On 16 August 2004, the Israeli army levelled agricultural land in the village of Deir Ballut near the settlement of Peduel for expansion of the settlement. **Settler Violence:** The Israeli settler guard of the settlement of Barkan abducted Abdul Aziz Mar'i, 11 years old, as he was grazing sheep near the settlement. The Israeli guard released the Palestinian child after some time.

#### Closure:

- (i) The Gaza International Airport remains closed.
- (ii) The Rafah Crossing is partially open to civilians under 16 years old and above 35 years old only.
- (iii) The Sufa Crossing is partially open to construction cargo only.

#### Attacks

# (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its locations north and south of the settlement of Morag towards 2 civilians near the Security Line, killing both civilians.

- (ii) At 17:25, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location at Tall as Sultan checkpoint towards civilian houses in the neighbourhood of Tall as Sultan in the city of Rafah, injuring 1 civilian.
- Raid/Land Levelling: At 17:30, the Israeli army, including 2 tanks and 2 bulldozers, raided 50 meters into the neighbourhood of Yabna in Rafah refugee camp and levelled land.
- Killing: The Israeli army killed 2 civilians near the settlement of Morag:
- (i) Fadi Duhan; and
- (ii) Shadi Al Laqqan.

#### GENERAL

## HUNGER STRIKE IN ALL ISRAELI PRISONS

**RAFAH** 

Beginning on 15 August 2004, political prisoners in Israeli prisons continue to conduct a wide scale open-ended huger strike in protest against the harsh conditions of imprisonment imposed by the Israeli Prisons Services. Prisoners in all Israeli central prisons are now participating in the hunger strike, including female prisoners in Ar Ramla and Nitsan Prisons, and child prisoners in Telmond Prison. 4,000 political prisoners are currently participating in the hunger strike. Political prisoners in Megiddo and 'Ofer Prisons announced that they would participate in the hunger strike for 24 hours.

## POLITICAL PRISONERS

- <u>Israeli Measures against Hunger Strikers</u>: The Israeli Minister of Health issued directives to the Director of the Security Section in the Ministry not to receive political prisoners on hunger strike suffering from health problems. According to the Israeli Minister of Internal Security, the Israeli authorities will not respond to the demands of political prisoners, even if they die during their hunger strike.
- Activities in Support of Political Prisoner's Hunger Strike: At 12:00, a general strike was observed throughout the city of Qalqiliya in solidarity with political prisoners on hunger strike in Israeli prisons.

# (i) The for 4

- (i) The Israeli authorities renewed work permits to cross the Green Line for 4,639 workers. The total number of those allowed to cross is unknown.
- (ii) The Israeli authorities continue to refuse to renew work permits for workers in the district of Jericho to cross the Green Line.
- (iii) The Israeli authorities restricted the issuing of work permits to civilians over the age of 35, married and with children.

#### • Gaza Strip:

West Bank:

- (i) The Israeli authorities renewed work permits to cross into the Industrial Zones for 1,177 workers; however, only 623 workers, 53% of the total number of permits issued, were permitted to enter the area.
- (ii) The Israeli authorities renewed work permits to cross the Green Line for 5,125 workers; however, only 2,341 workers, 46% of the total number of permits issued, were permitted to cross the Green Line.
- (iii) The Israeli authorities permitted 1,991 workers to remain overnight inside the Green Line.
