WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• Closure: At 11:00, the Israeli army closed the city of Jerusalem completely for a number of hours. The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Additionally, the Israeli army combed the area alongside the apartheid Wall as a result of heated alarms of a suicide attack in the city.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (a) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (b) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (c) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

JERUSALEM

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) At 17:20, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at the checkpoint that is set up near the village of Jaba' and impeded traffic.
- Raids: At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Qalandya, searched a number of houses, arrested 3 civilians, including a military officer, and withdrew at 03:00.
- Arrests: The 3 civilians arrested in the refugee camp of Qalandya are:
- (a) Military officer Firas Assaf:
- (b) Khaled Mohammad Abu Latifeh; and
- (c) Sufyan Mohammad al-Lozi.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians

	 holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.
RAMALLAH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and impeded civilian access. At 18:20, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint completely and denied access until 18:50. Raids: At 13:40, the Israeli army raided the city of al-Bireh and patrolled it until 14:45. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Qarawa Bani Zayd and patrolled it until 02:30. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the village of Ijja, and searched civilians and vehicles until 12:30. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the village of Sanour, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jaba'. (ii) At 17:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Zebouya, arrested one child, and withdrew at 18:40. Arrests: The child arrested in the village of Zebouya is Ahmad Fathi Amarneh, 13. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to close Tayaseer checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan

	Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). At 17:00, the Israeli army denied civilians between the age of 16 and 35 access through the 'Einav checkpoint. Raids: At 08:30, the Israeli army raided the area located between the towns of Anabta and Bal'a, and set up a checkpoint at the junction of the town of Bal'a. At 09:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. At 10:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Far'on. At 12:45, the Israeli army raided the area of Badoween near the town of Allar and combed it. The Israeli army withdrew at 13:30. Arrests: At 20:30, the Israeli army arrested at al-Taybeh checkpoint civilian Ala' Suleiman Qarqish. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road that connects the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. The Israeli army continues to close with cement barricades the entrances to the village of Kfar Qaddoum, Hijjeh, Imatin, Baqa al-Hatab, al-Fundoq, and Izbat al-Tabib that connects them to the main Qalqilya-Nablus road. The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun with an iron gate. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint that is set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqilya and impede civilian access. Raids: At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the villag of Hijja, arrested one civilian and withdrew at 02:00. At 01:55, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqilya and arrested one civilian. At 04:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Qaddoum, searched a number of houses, and withdrew at 05:00.

	entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western
	entrance to the town of Kafr al-Dik.

	 (iii) At 21:50, the Israeli army closed the road connecting the town of Kafl Hares and the village of Hares with dirt barricades. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tarah checkpoints and to deny civilian access. • Flying Checkpoints: At 10:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Farkh, and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: At 03:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafl Hares, searched one house, arrested one civilian, and withdrew at 04:50. • Arrests: The civilian arrested in the town of Kafl Hares is Mohammad Youssef Abu Yacoub. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ari'el.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along al-Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. Expulsion: At 23:40, the Israeli army deported to the Gaza Strip civilian Adnan Hmeidan Shaath, a resident of Gaza city, after detaining him at the D.C.O. checkpoint that is set up at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho. The expellee works as the chauffeur to the Tunisian Ambassador.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahour and Bethlehem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. Flying Checkpoint: At 14:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of al-Shawawreh, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 14:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Salah and set up a

- checkpoint.
- (ii) At 03:50, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Aida and opened fire indiscriminately during house search. In addition, the Israeli army searched a number of houses, arrested one civilian and withdrew at 05:00.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian arrested in the refugee camp of Aida is Thaer Ibrahim Jawareesh.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.

(ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• Raids:

- (i) At 18:50, the Israeli army raided the village of al-Shoyoukh, searched one house, and arrested one civilian.
- (ii) At 22:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit 'Awwa.
- (iii) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and searched a

number of houses.

(iv) At 01:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Kharsa and searched 2 houses.

(v) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of al-Thahiriyyeh and

patrolled it until 02:35.

- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian arrested in the town of al-Shoyoukh is Mousa Younis Halayqah.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

CENTRAL GAZA	 Raids: At dawn on December 20, the Israeli army raided east of the refugee camps of al-Breij and al-Maghazi, occupied several houses and turned them into military posts. In addition, the Israeli army arrested a number of civilians, searched a number of civilian houses, opened fire toward civilian houses and agricultural land, and engaged in armed clashes with armed individuals, resulting in the death of 3 armed individuals and the injury of 7 civilians, including a child, a female civilian, and an elderly. Furthermore, the Israeli army opened fire towards an ambulance and prevented it from reaching civilian injured. Finally, the Israeli army razed agricultural land, and remains in Central Gaza until the time this report is being prepared. Deaths: The 3 armed individuals killed east of the refuge camps of al-Breij and al-Maghazi are: Jihad Jaber Seidam; Na'eem al-Arouqi; and Mahmoud al-Mishal. Arrests: The civilians arrested east of the refuge camps of al-Breij and al-Maghazi have not been identified. Palestinian Attacks: At 14:45, armed individuals fired 4 mortars towards the Israeli army near Kisofim Gate on the Green Line east of the town of al-Qarara.
