DISTRICT	EVENT		
ALL DISTRICTS	 Beginning on 11 November 2004, the Israeli army has imposed a total closure on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, preventing civilians and workers from crossing the Green Line, following the official announcement of the death of President Yasser Arafat. On 12 February 2005, the Israeli army lifted the closure imposed on the 		
DISTRICTS	Gaza Strip districts and allowed a number of construction workers possessing new work permits to enter the Industrial Zones and the Green Line.		

WEST BANK

JERUSALEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to impose strict restrictions at checkpoints set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and dispatched patrols to prevent civilians from other districts from entering the city. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks, preventing civilians from crossing. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat Al Aqbat, the villages of Hizma and 'Anata, the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya, near Al Quds University, the area of Ash Shayyah, and in the town of As Sawahira Ash Sharqiya. Checkpoints: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Qalandiya and An Nabi Samwil checkpoints, obstructing civilian movement. Raid: At 15:25, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Rafat. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. House Demolition: The Israeli army demolished a 300m² house under construction in the town of Beit Hanina north of the city of Jerusalem.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Budrus, Midya, Ni'lin, Deir Qaddis, Bil'in, Beit Liqya, and Beituniya. Raids: At 16:15, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Dura Al Qar', set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 08:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Dibwan, set up a checkpoint, halted school students, and examined their IDs. The Israeli army raided the town of Silwad and arrested 2 civilians. Raids: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of Silwad: Mustafa Mousa Abdul Halim; and Rami Nabil Ahmed.
JENIN	<u>Wall Gates</u> : Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians

	 granted special Israeli permits. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in Jalbun towards Al Mutilla, Raba, Al Mughayyir, Bardala and 'Ein al Beida, and towards the Jordan River. Checkpoints: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas and detained dozens of civilians for several hours. Destruction of Property: The Israeli army prevented farmers whose land is located behind the Wall from ploughing their land, thereby causing damages to civilian property.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close 'Einav gate, which controls the road between the cities of Tulkarem and Nablus, preventing civilian vehicles from crossing. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoints: At 16:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Baqa Ash Sharqiya, searched civilian vehicles, and examined civilians' IDs until 17:00. The Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints on the junctions to the town of Bal'a and the village of Zeita and searched civilians and vehicles.
QALQILYA	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the gate to the village of Kafr Qaddum and prevented civilians from entering or exiting the village, except at specific times. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flving Checkpoint: At 20:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint between the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun, searched civilians and vehicles, and obstructed civilian movement. Raids: At 20:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 21:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Baqa Al Hatab, fired sound grenades, and patrolled the area. Settler Violence: An Israeli settler attempted, during the presence of the Israeli army, to attack a number of civilians from the village of Kafr Qaddum using a sharp tool. He also verbally abused and insulted them while they were waiting at the gate set up at the entrance to the village.
NABLUS	• Raid: At 01:00, the Israeli army, including 15 jeeps, raided the city of Nablus and patrolled several neighbourhoods until 03:00.

SALFIT	 Wall Construction: (i) Land levelling for Wall construction continues in the village of Deir Ballut along the Green Line. (ii) Based on claims filed by the Municipality of Salfit, Iskaka Village Council, and land owners, the Israeli Supreme Court issued a ruling to suspend land levelling for Wall construction west of the village of Iskaka and north of the city of Salfit for a period of 21 days beginning on 10 February 2005. Land Levelling: The Israeli army levelled land parallel to the Wall in the village of Mas'ha, uprooting 40 olive trees.
JERICHO	Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of checkpoints throughout the city, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and prevented civilians from crossing. The Israeli army only permitted residents of the city of Jericho to enter the city.
ВЕТНІЕНЕМ	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the only road leading to the village of Al Nu'man, in the north-eastern Bethlehem district, isolating the village and placing it, together with the adjacent village of Al Khas, under the jurisdiction of the Jerusalem municipality. The Israeli army considers the civilian presence in the villages illegal. Wall Construction: Construction of the Wall continues north of the district of Bethlehem, along 'Ayda refugee camp, along the tunnel road (Gilo), and west of the village of Husan.
HEBRON	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Al Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh in the area of H2 in the city of Hebron with cement blocks and barbed wire, denying civilians and vehicles access. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues west of the towns of Surif, Beit Ula, Idhna, and Beit 'Awwa, in the area extending from the village of Deir Samit, Beit 'Awwa, and towards the village of Al Burj. Flying Checkpoints: At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army set up 1 flying checkpoint in the area of An Nabi Yunis and another flying checkpoint between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna, searched civilian vehicles, and examined civilians' IDs. Attack: At 11:30, the Israeli army opened fire towards, and killed, 1 child for allegedly attempting to stab an Israeli soldier in the old city of Hebron. The Israeli army detained the child's corpse. Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces/Deportation: At 10:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Surif and arrested 1

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure: Beit Hanun Crossing is partially open. Attacks: (i) At 08:20, the Israeli army opened fire from its locations at Points 40 and 52 on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory east of the town of Beit Hanun. (ii) At 09:35, the Israeli army opened fire from its location at Point 42 on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory east of the town of Beit Hanun.
GAZA	Closure: (i) Nitsareem junction remains closed. (ii) Al Shuhada Junction-Al Muntar Crossing road is closed.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	 Closure: (i) Abu Al 'Ajin road (Khan Yunis Al Sharqiya) is closed. (ii) Western road (Khan Yunis) remains closed. (iii) Al Mawasi/Khan Yunis road (Al Tuffah checkpoint) is partially open. (iv) Abu Holi road is partially open. At 07:30, the Israeli army closed Salah Ad Din road between Al Matahin and Abu Holi checkpoints and obstructed civilian movement. At 08:00, the road was reopened.

GENERAL

WORK PERMITS	 West Bank: Israeli authorities renewed 9,878 work permits to cross the Green Line. The total number of those allowed to cross is unknown. Israeli authorities restricted the issuing of work permits to civilians who are married with children and over the age of 30. Gaza Strip: Israeli authorities renewed 459 work permits for workers to enter the Industrial Zones. However, the Israeli army allowed access only to 280 workers (approximately 61% of those possessing new permits). Israeli authorities renewed 804 work permits for workers to cross the Green Line to work in the construction sector only. However, the Israeli army allowed access only to 203 construction workers (approximately 26% of those possessing new permits).
