DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) Beginning on 16 February 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

• <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

- Raid: The Israeli army raided the village of Biddu and arrested 3 civilians.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the village of Biddu:
- (i) 'Imad Abdul Hameed Badwan;
- (ii) Hasan Khaled al Khudour; and
- (iii) 'Abbas Lafi Mansour.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

JERUSALEM

	 Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the road connecting the villages of Ras Karkar and Kharbatha Bani Harith; the entrances to the villages of Sinjil, Saffa, and Ein Yabrud; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint on the overpass to 'Atara town and impede civilian access. At 16:40, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access in both directions, and reopened it at a later time. Flying Checkpoints: At 15:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to the village of Yabrud and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Kafr Malik and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:50, and again at 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Surda and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Silwad and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Al Mazra'a ash Sharqiya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 11:20, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints as well as searched civilians and vehicles at the entrances to the town of At Tayba and the village of 'Ein Yabrud. Raids/Air Patrol: At 11:20, the Israeli army raided the Industrial Zone in the city of Ramallah, raided a food processing factory, and interrogated workers. The Israeli army also served summons to 7 workers to report to the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Birch. At 05:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Birch. 	Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Raids/Air Patrol: At 09:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled and patrolled the village of 'Arabbuna. At 19:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kufeirit. At 14:45, and again at 04:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Arraba. At 20:00, Israeli infantry troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and conducted military training in the area between the town of Qabatiya and the village of Misliya. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint in the eastern Tubas district, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Flying Checkpoint: At 20:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Tammun and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid/Attack: At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Tubas and Al Far'a refugee camp. While patrolling the refugee camp, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarm a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road and at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem). Raids: At 09:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. The Israeli army also set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and withdrew at 13:30. At 11:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Attil. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

•	<u>Closure of Roads</u> : The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks
	agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.

• <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and to impede civilian access.

• Raids:

- (i) At 17:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kafr Qaddum. The Israeli army also forced civilians to close their commercial shops and withdrew at 23:05.
- (ii) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Hajja, set up a checkpoint in the village's centre, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (iii) At 00:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya, searched 2 houses, and withdrew at 06:30.

• Wall Gates:

(i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. At 20:40, the Israeli army closed the wall gate and reopened it at a later time.

• Wall Construction:

- (i) Having completed the Wall-related infrastructure, land levelling for Wall construction ceased in the towns of 'Azzun and Kafr Thulth as well as in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif.
- (ii) Wall construction was resumed south of the town of Jayyus.
- (iii) On 22 February 2009, the Israeli army began levelling civilian land for adjustment of the Wall route near the settlement of Alfe Menashe south of the city of Qalqiliya. The new Wall route will remove the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha from the Wall-associated Closed Zone. However, it will effectively isolate land belonging to these villages behind the Wall.

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Sarra-Jit; Til-Burin; Beit Furik-Salem; the road between the town of 'Aqraba and the main road; and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya. The Israeli army also continues to close with with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Til and Madama; the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; the western entrance to the town of 'Aqraba; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the western entrance to the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh.

QALQILYA

NABLUS

- (ii) The Israeli army continues to restrict civilian daily passage along the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to Deir Sharaf village and the settlement of Shavei Shomron between 06:00 and 21:00.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
- (ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
- (iii) Beginning on 14 February 2009, the Israeli army has allowed Palestinians holding Israeli-issued IDs to access the city of Nablus by their private vehicles through all checkpoints around the city. To prevent traffic jams, the Israeli army allows vehicles to leave the city through Beit Furik and Beit Iba checkpoints. In addition, the Israeli army has allowed free access to all physicians, who are residents of the city of Nablus.
- (iv) Beginning on 15 February 2009, the Israeli army has allowed free access by private vehicles to all civilian residents of the city of Nablus, who are above 50 years of age and in company with their families, through checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus.

• Raids:

- (i) At 17:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Khirbet Tana and distributed notices for evacuation of 10 houses in order to demolish them later. The affected houses belong to:
 - (i) Mohammed Tawfeeq Adel Nassassrah;
 - (ii) Dawoud Qasem Khatatbeh;
 - (iii) Abdul Hameed Thaher Khatatbeh;
 - (iv) 'Arafat Mahmoud Nassassrah;
 - (v) Radhwan Qasem Khatatbeh;
 - (vi) Radhi Mahmoud Hanani;
 - (vii) Majed 'Afeef Hanani;
 - (viii) Fozan Mousa Nassassrah;
 - (ix) Abdul Oader Mahmoud Hanani; and
 - (x) Isma'il Mousa Nassassrah.
- (ii) At 22:45, the Israeli army raided the eastern quarters of the city of Nablus and provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers on their visit to Prophet Joseph's Shrine. At 02:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- (iii) At 00:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Agraba.
- (iv) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Badhan.

SALFIT

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and the eastern entrance to the village of Yasuf.

	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tara checkpoints and prevent civilian vehicles from heading towards the village of Kafr Ad Dik. • Flving Checkpoints: (i) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the town of Deir Ballut and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 20:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 20:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Haris and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids: At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Biddya and patrolled the area until 11:00. At 20:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan as well as searched a house, pharmacy, and workshop. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. Flying Checkpoint: At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the settlement of Vered Yericho and searched civilians and vehicles. Arrest: At 21:45, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja arrested 'Anan Mohammed an Nouri.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.

- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the two sideways east and south of Al Walaja village and the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, Talita-Nazlet as Sidr in the city of Beit Jala, Al Khadr town-Road # 60, Al Khadr town-Beit Jala housing, Wadi Rahal-Efrat and the side road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 13:55, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 14:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Tuqu' and searched civilians and vehicles until 16:30.

• Raids:

- (i) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Husan and distributed notice for demolition of 4 houses.
- (ii) At 14:20, and again at 21:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Beit Ti'immir.
- (iii) At 14:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Al 'Ubeidiya and searched 1 house.
- (iv) At 14:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Beit Jala. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians.
- (vi) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr.
- (vii) At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Bethlehem, searched 3 houses, and withdrew at 03:45.
- (viii) At 01:35, the Israeli army raided the town of Tuqu' and patrolled the area until 02:35.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

• <u>Closure</u>:

HEBRON

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prevent civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron.

(iii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to Al Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp and the village of At Tuwani.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to open the iron gate on the junction of Farsh Al Hawa, which leads to Road # 35 that leads to Tarqumiya Crossing, from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.
- (v) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the southern entrance to the town of Adh Dhahiriya.

• Flying Checkpoints:


- (i) At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near Tareq Bin Ziyad School in the old city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Dura and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Physical Assault:

- (i) At 08:30 and again at 18:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) At 16:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Surif and severely beat Bilal Mohammed al Hor, leaving him with contusions. Consequently, Al Hor was transported to hospital for medical treatment.
- (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (iv) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Nuba.
- (v) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta and searched 2 house.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area between the settlement of Eshkolot and the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta; and in the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the **ALL** ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. **DISTRICTS Violations of the Ceasefire:** (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened fire towards civilians and property. Israeli combat aircraft also carried air raids. As a result, 3 sustained injuries. Armed Palestinian individuals fired 3 mortars towards the Green (ii) Line.



Closure of Crossing Points:

Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (i)

Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis. Access (ii) was allowed into the Gaza Strip to 252 civilians, who were stranded on the Egyptian border. Also, 773 civilians, including patients, holders of residence cards in other countries, and students, were allowed to leave for Egypt.

GENERAL

RAFAH

Sentences: The Israeli military court at Salem Military Camp issued sentences against the following political prisoners: Marwan Abu Ghuneim, a resident of the city of Nablus, to 12 years (i) in prison as well as 3 years with the stay of execution. Bilal Mansour to 5 years in prison as well as 3 years with the stay of

- Ahmed Turabi to 25 months in prison, 20 months with the stay of (iii) execution, and a fine of ILS 2,000 (approx. USD 500).
- Nasser Thabet to 22 months in prison, 14 months with the stay of (iv) execution, and a fine of ILS 2,000 (approx. USD 500).
- Basem Hamayel to 16 months in prison, 14 months with the stay of (v) execution, and a fine of ILS 2,000 (approx. USD 500).
- Ali al Agra' to 4 months in prison, 10 months with the stay of (vi) execution, and a fine of ILS 1,000 (approx. USD 250).

Extension of Administrative Detention:

- The Israeli military court at Salem Military Camp extended for (i) various periods of time the administrative detention against 14 political prisoners as well as postponed trial of 8 other prisoners.
- The Israeli military court at 'Asgalan Prison extended for various (ii) periods of time the administrative detention (arrest without charge or trial) against 5 political prisoners from the districts of Ramallah, Bethlehem, and Hebron.
