WEST B	ANK
ALL DISTRICTS	The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.
JERUSALEM	Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, in the old city of Jerusalem, and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Ameer Omar Abu Kaff in the village of Sur Bahir.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western

entrance to the village of Saffa.

The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western

- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede access to the city of Ramallah for civilians holding IDs issued in the northern districts of the West Bank.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud, in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin, Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis, and in the town of Beituniya.

• Raids:

- (i) At 23:25, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided the town of Beituniya and arrested 1 civilian.
- (ii) At 04:30, the Israeli army, including 5 jeeps, raided and patrolled the cities of Ramallah and El Bireh.
- <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Ahmed Khalil Hassan in the town of Beituniya.

• <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan as well as the road connecting the town of Qabatiya to the village of Misliya.

- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley.
- Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints: between the town of Al Yamun and the village of Al 'Araqa; between the villages of Al Hashimiya and Al 'Araqa; and between the villages of Al Kufeir and 'Aqqaba. Israeli troops positioned at these flying checkpoints searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) The Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints at the entrances to the town of 'Arraba and the village of Zububa and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Attack:

- (i) At 02:30, the Israeli army, including 5 jeeps, raided the city of Jenin and Jenin refugee camp. While patrolling the refugee camp, the Israeli army opened indiscriminate fire.
- (ii) At 05:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Tubas, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 female civilian.

• Arrests:

- (i) At 00:40 on 02 January 2007, the Israeli army arrested Mahmoud Amin Makhlouf during its raid on the town of Birqin, in addition to those reported yesterday.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Sa'idah Hafeth Sawaftah, a female civilian, in the town of Tubas.

TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road, the entrance to the village of Saffarin, the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil plain, and the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city) and Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city). Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Raid: At 15:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested 'Ammar Mohammed Shteiwi in the city of Tulkarem.
QALQILIYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to cross these checkpoints. At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only. Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30. Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing,

	 only allowing access to humanitarian cases. Raids/Attack/Injuries/Palestinian Attack/House Occupation: At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and Balata refugee camp and opened fire, injuring 3 civilians, including Dhiya' Mohammed al Bahjawi. The Israeli army also arrested 3 civilians, including 2 brothers and an injured civilian. After armed Palestinian individuals detonated explosive devices near Israeli army patrols, an armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals. In addition, the Israeli army occupied 1 house in the refugee camp and converted it into a military post. At 07:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. Arrests: On 31 December 2006, the Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the village of Osarin: Haytham Mizyed 'Udeili; Mohammed 'Abed Shihadeh 'Udeili; and Haytham 'Abbas Turki. The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the city of Nablus and Balata refugee camp: Ala' Hasan Kassab, an injured civilian; Murad Hasan Kassab; and Hasan Ali Shteiwi.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current Intifada (Uprising). The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el. Raid/Attack: At 19:15, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided the village of Marda. While patrolling the area, the Israeli army opened fire and fired sound grenades. At 20:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
JERICHO	Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.
BETHLEHEM	Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr, north of 'Ayda refugee camp, northwest of the city of Beit Jala, and in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat.
- Physical Assault: Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the "Container") checkpoint beat Shayma' Ibrahim 'Amarneh, a female civilian, leaving her with contusions. At 17:30, Shayma' was admitted to Bethlehem Public Hospital for medical treatment.
- Raid: At 00:45, the Israeli army raided the city of Bethlehem, searched 1 house, and served a summons to a civilian to report to the Israeli Intelligence Agency. At 01:40, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh.
- Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to (ii) implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

Closure of Main Roads:

- The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following (i) locales: the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to (ii) prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Targumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
- Raid: At 20:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.

HEBRON

ALL DISTRICTS	• The ceasefire agreement that entered into force at 06:00 on 26 November 2006 remains effective. However, the Israeli army carried out 1 raid into Palestinian territory. In addition, Israeli F16 combat aircraft patrolled the skies over Palestinian territory. Israeli navy boats also arrested 3 Palestinian fishermen. Additionally, armed Palestinian individuals fired 3 mortars towards the Green Line, of which 2 mortars landed on Palestinian territory.
NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open only to foreign nationals, VIPs, and humanitarian cases. Raid: At 15:20, the Israeli army, including 2 armoured vehicles, raided 30 metres into Palestinian territory near Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing on the Green Line north of the town of Beit Hanun, thereby violating the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement. Air Patrol: In violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, Israeli F16 combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the northern area of the district of Northern Gaza. Palestinian Attacks: In violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, armed Palestinian individuals fired 3 mortars towards the Green Line, as follows: (i) At 18:40, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line, but it landed on Palestinian territory. (ii) At 20:30, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line, but it landed on Palestinian territory.
GAZA	Activities not reported.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed. Arrests: At 10:15, in violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, Israeli navy boats arrested 3 Palestinian fishermen, including 2 brothers, at sea opposite the city of Rafah's beach: Isma'il Jamal Bassaleh; Sameer Jamal Bassaleh; and Ayman Ali al Jbour.
