ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: At 11:00, the Israeli army closed the city of Jerusalem completely for a number of hours. The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Additionally, the Israeli army combed the area alongside the apartheid Wall as a result of heated alarms of a suicide attack in the city.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

• <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Raids:

- (i) At 15:00, the Israeli raided the village of Qatannah and arrested one civilian.
- (ii) At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Qalandya and patrolled it until 02:50.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian who was arrested in the village of Qatannah is Ashraf Jamal Shamasneh.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
 - Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish

	weekend in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.
RAMALLAH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and impeded civilian access. At 18:20, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint completely and denied access until 18:50. Flving Checkpoints: At 23:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the village of Surda, and searched civilians and vehicles until 00:10. Raids: At 23:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Ramallah, and patrolled it until 00:10. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Beitunia, searched one house, and handed a civilian a notification to report to the Israeli intelligence. The Israeli army withdrew at 03:30. Demonstrations: At 13:00, a public march set out, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in the village of Bil'in in protest of the apartheid wall construction. Clashes broke out between the Israeli army and civilian protestors, resulting in the injury 4 civilians with rubber bullets. A number of civilians were asphyxiated as a result of inhaling tear gas. At 13:00, a public c march set out in the town of Beit Luqya and the villages of Beit Sira, Beit 'Ur al-Tahta, Beit 'Ur al-Foqa, al-Tira, Safa, and Kharbatha al-Misbah that is located to the west of Ramallah district, withy the participation of international peace activists and supporters, towards the passageway between the villages of Beit 'Ur al-Tahta and Kharbatha al-Misbah, in protest of the Israeli discriminatory policy that forbids Palestinian from traveling on road #443 that connects the village to the city of Ramallah. Clashes broke out between the Israeli army and civilian protestors, resulting in the injury of 7 civilians. In addition, the Israeli army beat a number of civilians with clubs injuring and bruising them. Wall Construc
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the town of al-Zabadeh and the village of Misliyyeh, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids:

	(i) At 14:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Rai and occupied a house and converted it into a military post. The Israeli army withdrew at 16:00.
	(ii) At 00:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and its refugee camp and opened fire indiscriminately during patrol. The Israeli army withdrew at 04:00.
	 (iii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of al-Yamoun and opened fire indiscriminately during patrol. The Israeli army withdrew at 04:30. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions
	of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Tayaseer checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). At 14:50, the Israeli intelligence investigated a number of civilians at 'Einav checkpoint. Raids: At 15:15, the Israeli army raided village of Far'on and patrolled it until 15:15. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special
	Israeli permits.
	 Closure of Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road that connects the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. (ii) At 16:30, the Israelli army closed the eastern entrance to the town of
QALQILYA	 'Azzun with cement blocks. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint that is set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqilya and impede civilian
	 <u>Raids</u>: At 08:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Kafr thulth and the village of Habla, Izbet Salman, Ras Atiyyeh and Sinirya.

	(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal

	• Wall Construction: Land leveling for Wall construction was suspended for
	the Jewish weekend in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as
	east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the
	junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei
	Shomron.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler
	bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to the settlement of
	Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of al-
	Lubban al-Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
	• Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing
	checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	(i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on
	Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other
	days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
	(ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit
	Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
	(iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the
	checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town
	of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only
	allowing access to humanitarian cases.
	(iv) At 08:00, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at the checkpoints
NABLUS	that are set up around the city of Nablus and impeded traffic.
	• Raids:
	(i) Since 01:00 on January 3, the Israeli army has been raiding the city
	of Nablus. In addition, the Israeli army imposed curfew on the old
	city of Nablus and occupied a number of buildings and converted
	them into military posts. Clashes broke out between the Israeli army
	and civilians during house search, resulting in the injury of 3
	civilians, including civilian Ahmad Mohammad Abu Hantash who
	was seriously injured. Additionally, the Israeli rmy stormed into a
	hospital and besieged the National hospital and Rafidya
	Government Hospital, and denied civilian access to them.
	Furthermore, the Israeli army set up a number of checkpoints, set
	fire to one commercial store, and damaged doors of a number of
	other stores. Moreover, the Israeli army arrested 9 civilians,
	including 2 military officers, closed the gate of the headquarters of
	the Palestinian National Forces and fired tear gas bombs towards it.
	The Israeli army remains in Nablus until the time this report is
	being prepared.
	(ii) The Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Balata and opened fire
	intensively during house search.

	Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent		
	farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land,		
	forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to		
	deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.		
	• Checkpoints:

- (ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahour and Bethlehem.
- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road.

Raids:

- (i) At 11:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Obaidiyyeh.
- (ii) At 00:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem.
- <u>Demonstrations</u>: At 13:00, a public march set out, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in the villages of al-Ma'sara and Um Salmounah that are located to the south of Bethlehem district in protest of the apartheid wall construction.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to

- al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Beit Ummar, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint near the village of al-Seemya, and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 10:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ummar.
- (ii) At 13:20, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and clashed with civilians during patrol. In addition, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint in the area of al-Mahjar and impeded traffic.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
