DISTRICT EVENTS

#### **WEST BANK**

#### • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

#### Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- Arrest: At 03:00 on 07 January 2010, the Israeli army arrested Riyadh Abdul Fattah al Faqih during its raid into the village of Qatanna, as was reported yesterday.

## • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

## Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoint: At 13:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. **Physical Assault:** At 19:20, Israeli troops positioned at the Wall gate west of the town of Habla severely beat Ahmed Abdul Magsoud at Tibi, while he was attempting to access his workplace inside the Green Line. Raid: At 13:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya. Arrests: At 23:00 on 06 January 2010, the Israeli army arrested 2 children **QALQILYA** during its raid into the town of 'Azzun, as was reported yesterday: Ahmed Abdul Latif Abu Haniyyeh, 16 years old; and (i) Omar Mohammed Sa'id Abu Hanivyeh, 17 years old. (ii) (iii) At 10:15, Israeli troops positioned near the Wall gate in the vicinity of the town of Habla arrested Mohammed Faleh Salman Mardawi. Wall Gate: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit (i) Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western (ii) entrance to the village of An Nagura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close (iii) with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: **NABLUS** At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. **Flying Checkpoints:** (i) At 09:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the town of Beit Iba on the road connecting the districts of Nablus and Tulkarem and searched civilians and vehicles.

JERICHO	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.

## **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra (i) checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint (ii) set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. **Flying Checkpoints:** At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern (i) entrance to the city of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the juncture to (ii) Road # 90 in the centre of the village of Al 'Auja and searched civilians and vehicles. Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of (i) An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has (ii) continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. **BETHLEHEM** Checkpoint: At 21:45, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at the As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access. Raids: (i) At 22:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Fajjar. At 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. (ii) **Provocation of Palestinian Forces:** At 16:00, Israeli troops positioned at the As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained 2 motorcycles belonging to the Palestinian Police and allowed them to cross at 19:20 after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO). Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja. **Closure: HEBRON** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement

blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.

(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

## • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 12:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of An Nabi Yunis near the town of Halhul (on the Hebron-Bethlehem main road) and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Attack/Injury: At 16:45, Israeli troops positioned near the junction to the village of Beit 'Einun opened fire and injured 17-year-old Majed Mohammed Jaradat, allegedly for throwing a Molotov cocktail. Consequently, Jaradat was transported to an Israeli hospital for medical treatment.

## • Raids:

- (i) At 01:30 on 07 January 2010, the Israeli army raided Al 'Arrub refugee camp, arrested 1 child, and served a summons to Nihad Khaled Balassi, a Palestinian Presidential Guard officer, to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- (ii) At 13:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Yatta.
- (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (iv) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Nuba.
- (v) At 04:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Adh Dhahiriya.

Settler Violence: At 17:15, a group of Israeli settlers severely beat 4 civilians (brothers near the village of At Tuwani, leaving them with contusions. Having evacuated settlers from the area, the Israeli army also arrested 1 civilian.

#### **Arrests:**

- The Israeli army arrested Khalil Khaled Balassi, 17 years old, in Al (i) 'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) The Israeli army arrested Mus'ab Mousa ar Raba'i near the village of At Tuwani.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

### **GAZA STRIP**

## At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. **Violations of the Ceasefire:**

## ALL DISTRICTS

- The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire (i) towards civilians and property in the districts of Northern Gaza and Gaza. From its location on the Green Line, the Israeli army opened fire and fired artillery shells. Israeli F16 combat aircraft and UAVs fired missiles on the districts of Gaza, Central Gaza, Khan Yunis, and Rafah, killing 3 civilians, including a child, and injuring 6 others. The air attacks also resulted in the destruction of a house and a blacksmith's workshop as well as damaging of buildings and a house.
- (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired 9 mortars towards the Green Line.
- Air Patrols: On 07 January 2010, Israeli combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over all districts of the Gaza Strip.

Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.

## **Attacks:**

- In the morning of 07 January 2010, the Israeli army fired a number of (i) artillery shells from its location on the Green Line towards the area surrounding Al Qarya al Badawiya north of the town of Beit Lahiya.
- At 15:00, the Israeli army fired a missile mortar from its location on the (ii) Green Line towards armed Palestinian individuals east of the town of Jabalya.

	<ul> <li>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: In the evening of 07 January 2010, the Israeli army, including several tanks, armoured vehicles, and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided 350 metres into Palestinian territory east of the town of Jabalya. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled agricultural land.</li> <li>Air Patrol: On 07 January 2010, Israeli combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the district of Northern Gaza and dropped flyers on civilians residing in the areas of Al 'Atatira and An Nada residential towers, warning them that they should keep 300 metres away from the Border Fence and not provide assistance to or deal with persons working in tunnels.</li> <li>Palestinian Attacks/Israeli Attacks:         <ul> <li>At 12:20, armed Palestinian individuals fired 4 mortars towards the Green Line. Consequently, the Israeli army opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory southeast of the town of Beit Hanun.</li> <li>At 14:35, armed Palestinian individuals fired 1 anti-tank mortar towards an Israeli army patrol along the Green Line east of the town of Jabalya. As a result, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory.</li> <li>In the evening of 07 October 2010, 1 unidentified mortar was fired</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	towards the Green Line.

The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property and levelled agricultural land.</li> <li>Air Patrol: In the morning of 07 January 2010, Israeli combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the eastern quarters of the district of Gaza and dropped flyers on civilians residing along the Green Line, warning them that they should keep 300 metres away from the Border Fence and not provide assistance to or deal with persons working in tunnels.</li> </ul>
CENTRAL GAZA	Air Attack: In the evening of 07 January 2010, an Israeli UAV fired 1 missile towards armed Palestinian individuals east of Al Bureij refugee camp.

The second air attack resulted in the destruction of the targeted house and damaging of another house belonging to Abdullah Abu Thaher.</li> <li>Air Patrol: In the morning of 07 January 2010, Israeli combat aircraft patrolled the skies over the eastern quarters of the district of Khan Yunis and dropped flyers on civilians residing along the Green Line, warning them that they should keep 300 metres away from the Border Fence and not provide assistance to or deal with persons working in tunnels.</li> <li>House Demolition: The Israeli air force destroyed a house belonging to Suleiman al 'Eimawi on the Al Kurd hill in the area surrounding Kissufim Gate northeast of the town of Al Qarara.</li> </ul>
