WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: At 11:00, the Israeli army closed the city of Jerusalem completely for a number of hours. The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Additionally, the Israeli army combed the area alongside the apartheid Wall as a result of heated alarms of a suicide attack in the city.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the village of Nabi Samuel.
- (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army set up at the junction of the village of Hizma, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raids: At dawn on January 29, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Qalandya and arrested one civilian.

• Arrests:

- (i) The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Jerusalem. The arrested civilians are:
- (a) Anan Issa Khamis: and
- (b) Taha Mahmoud Abu Taha.
- (ii) The civilian arrested in the refugee camp of Qalandya Mohammad Nayef Abdel Rahman.

Wall Gates:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu

(ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.
RAMALLAH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close the western entrance to the village of Safa with cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and impede civilian access. Raids: The Israeli army raided the town of Beit Rima and arrested 2 civilians. Arrests: At 01:30 On January 29, the Israeli army arrested during a raid into the city of Ramallah civilian Samer Nimer Hasarneh, the \Qatari Red Cross representative The 2 civilians arrested in the town of Beit Rima are: Saddam Taha al-Asmar; and Ahmad Eid al-Halabi. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Oaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up 2 checkpoints at the junction of the town of Jaba' and the southern entrance to the town of Silet al-Harithiyyeh on Nablus-Jenin main road, and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 12:10, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the town of Arraba and impeded traffic. (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the town of al-Zababdeh and the village of al-Kfir, and impeded traffic. (iv) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the

	town of Qabatia and the village of Misliyyeh.

	of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan				
TOUDAG	Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence

	• Raids: At 15:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of al-Far'a,				
	and set up a checkpoint.				
	• Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a

	allowing access to humanitarian cases.

	(i) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Sebastia
	and opened fire indiscriminately during patrol.
	(ii) At 01:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the
	village of Burqa.
	Arrests: The Israeli army arrested at Huwara Checkpoint civilian Ramzi
	Ghassan Marmash.

	Palestinian Security Measures: At 18:00, the Palestinian forces handed
	over to the Israeli side through the D.C.O. a quantity of stolen medicine that was found in the town of Huwara and the village of Beta.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising). The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr al-Dik. The Israeli army continues to close the agricultural road connecting the village of Iskaka and the bypass road (trans-Samaria) near Ariel settlement. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tarah checkpoints and to deny civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ari'el.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. Flying Checkpoints: At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the junction of the Dead Sea (southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem), and searched civilians and vehicles.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahour and Bethlehem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road. Raids: At 21:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-

	Khader.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the
	town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi

HEBRON	Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja. • Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to
	al-'Arroub refugee camp.
	(ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to
	prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street
	that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as
	well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
	Flying Checkpoints:
	(i) At 10:15, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the
	entrance to the area of al-Fahs south of the city of
	Hebron and physically attacked a number of civilians.
	(ii) At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the
	entrance to the refugee camp of al-Fawwar, and
	searched civilians and vehicles.
	Raids:
	(i) At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron. The raid recurred at
	16.
	(ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Tafouh, searched a number of

houses, and arrested 2 civilians.

• Arrests: The 2 civilians arrested in the town of Tafouh are:

(a) Salah Salameh Irzeikat; and

(b) Mohammad Salah Irzeikat.

• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
