WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at the checkpoint set up near the village of Jaba' and impeded civilian access in both directions.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.

JERUSALEM

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern (i) entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western (ii) entrance to the village of Saffa. The Israeli army continues to close the settler bypass road connecting (iii) 'Assur Hill in the village of Kafr Malik to Alon settler bypass road. **Checkpoint:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. Flying Checkpoint/Detention: At 18:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Rantis, searched civilian **RAMALLAH** vehicles, and detained 1 civilian. & **Raids/Attack/Detentions: EL BIREH** At dawn on 01 July 2007, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Atara (i) and arrested 1 civilian. At dawn on 01 July 2007, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir (ii) Jarir and searched 1 house. At 00:15, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided the city of El Bireh, (iii) fired flares, and raided a hall, in which a wedding party was taking place. The Israeli army also detained 2 children in Beit II military post until the morning. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city again and patrolled the area. **Arrests:** (i) Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara arrested 'Abed Mohammed Hamad Bani 'Odeh, a Palestinian Police officer. (ii) The Israeli army arrested Abdul Hadi 'Amer 'Ameereh in the town of 'Atara. Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour roads leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. **Checkpoint:** The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. **JENIN** Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoint: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Al Far'a and Al Badhan and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/Attack/Destruction/Confiscation of Property: At 16:30, and again at 04:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the (i) town of Az Zababida.

	 (ii) At 01:45, the Israeli army, including 7 jeeps and 1 bulldozer, raided Jenin refugee camp. An armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals, during which the Israeli army killed a Palestinian National Security officer (described by the Israeli authorities as a "wanted individual"). The Israeli army also destroyed a tractor and withdrew at 03:00. (iii) At 04:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Tubas and arrested 2 civilians as well as 1 Palestinian Police officer. The Israeli army also confiscated a Kalashnikov rifle from the Police officer's house. (iv) At 04:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tammun. Killing: The Israeli army killed Mohammed Omar Abu al Hayja, a Palestinian National Security officer, in Jenin refugee camp. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians and 1 Palestinian Police officer in the town of Tubas: (i) 'Utbah Faleh Abu Nasser, a Palestinian Police officer; (ii) Basem Yousef Daraghmeh; and (iii) Mohammed Yousef Daraghmeh. Palestinian Security Measure: At 19:30, Palestinian security forces requested that the Israeli army investigate a suspicious object located in the vicinity of the village of 'Anin at a distance of 300 metres from the Wall.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil plain; the road to the town of Deir al Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of Tulkarem. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoint: At 10:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Al Jarushiya and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 09:30, the Israeli army raided Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem and searched 1 house.
QALQILIYA	Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 02:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian.
- Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Rizq Waleed al Aqra' in the city of Qalqiliya.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of Al Lubban ash Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
- <u>Checkpoints/Provocation of Palestinian Forces</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- (i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to cross these checkpoints. The Israeli army also searches civilians using metal detectors at Beit Iba checkpoint, impeding their access.
- (ii) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.
- (iii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.
- (iv) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.

• Raids:

- (i) At 16:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Talluza.
- (ii) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and 'Askar refugee camp, searched 5 houses, and withdrew at 04:30.
- **Physical Assault:** At 17:00, Israeli troops positioned at Beit Iba checkpoint detained and severely beat Rami Mohammed Wahdan.

• Attack on Property: The Israeli army delivered a notice for the evacuation of an olive grove, measuring 50 *dunums* (12.355 acres), belonging to Kathem al Hallaq. The grove is located in the village of Ar Rihiya south of the settlement of Hagai.

RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed. Deaths: On 30 June 2007, Taghreed Mohammed 'Aabed, a 31-year-old female civilian, died on the Egyptian side of Rafah Crossing, after her health condition deteriorated due to extended waiting at the Crossing to enter the Gaza Strip. Taghreed was on her way back from Egypt, where she received medical treatment from cancer. On 01 July 2007, Suleiman al Abdullah Mohammed, 78 years old, died of depression on the Egyptian side of Raft Crossing due to extended waiting at the Crossing to enter the Gaza Strip. Mohammed was on his way back from Saudi Arabia, where he performed 'Umrah (minor pilgrimage) to the Holy City of Mecca. 			

• Attacks/Destruction of Property/Air Patrols/Palestinian Attack:

- (i) At dawn on 01 July 2007, the Israeli navy opened intensive fire towards and damaged Palestinian fishing boats at sea. The Israeli navy also opened fire towards fired flares over the beach of the city of Rafah. Meanwhile, Israeli combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over the area.
- (ii) At noon on 01 July 2007, and after armed Palestinian individuals fired a number of mortars towards the Green Line, the Israeli army opened intensive fire and fired several tank shells from one of its locations on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory east of the area of Ash Shuka east of the city of Rafah.

GENERAL

POLITICAL PRISONERS

• <u>Sentence against a Political Prisoner:</u> The Israeli military court at 'Ofar military post sentenced Bahjat Mahmoud Shuqeirat, a civilian resident of the village of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya southeast of the city of Jerusalem, to life imprisonment twice as well as seven years. Shuqeirat has been held in Bir as Sabe' Prison since 07 February 2007.
