ALL DISTRICTS	The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.		
JERUSALEM	Closure: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around the Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and prevented civilians from accessing the Al Aqsa Mosque to perform Friday prayers. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala,

The Israeli army raided the village of Hizma and arrested 1 civilian.

	• Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Mohammed 'Abboud Khalil, 17 years old, in the village of Hizma.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. The Israeli army continues to close the settler bypass road connecting 'Assur Hill in the village of Kafr Malik to Alon settler bypass road. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. Raids/Attacks: At 18:30, the Israeli army raided Al Am'ari refugee camp in the city of El Birch. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 19:05, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. At 23:15, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided the city of El Birch and patrolled the area until 23:30. At 23:45, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr 'Ein, patrolled the area, opened fire, fired flares, and withdrew at 00:15. Settler Violence: At 19:00, under the protection of Israeli troops, a group of Israeli settlers erected 3 tents on land belonging to the village of Al Midya. Meanwhile, Israeli troops fired sound grenades and flares over the village. Demonstration/Attack/Injuries: At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 4 civilians with rubber-coated steel bullets. In addition, a number of protestors sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.
JENIN	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour roads leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoints: At 14:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of 'Anza and 'Ajja along the Jenin-Nablus main road, searched civilians and vehicles, and impeded access.

- (ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Zububa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) The Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one on the junction to the town of 'Arraba and the other along the road to the village of Dhahr al 'Abed, and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Bir al Basha, searched 1 house, and withdrew at 20:30.
- (ii) At 01:00, the Israeli army, including 8 jeeps, raided the city of Jenin and patrolled the area until 04:00.
- (iii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Tayasir.
- (iv) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tammun.

• <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil plain; the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa; the road to the town of Deir al Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of Tulkarem.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). At 07:30, Israeli troops positioned at 'Einav checkpoint denied access to civilians between 16 and 35 years of age.
- <u>Wall Gates:</u> Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 15:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Far'un and searched civilians and vehicles until 17:00.
- (ii) At 21:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Bal'a and searched civilians and vehicles until 22:25.
- (iii) The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the southern entrance to the town of Deir al Ghusun and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 22:25, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Illar and patrolled the area until 23:25.
- (ii) At 01:10, the Israeli army, including 3 jeeps, raided the city of Tulkarem and Tulkarem refugee camp and patrolled the area until 03:30.

TULKAREM

QALQILIYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of Al Lubban ash Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to cross these checkpoints. The Israeli army also searches civilians using metal detectors at Beit Iba checkpoint, impeding their access. At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only. Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30. Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases. At 08:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus and denied access to civilians between 16 and 35 years of age. Raids/Attack: At 00:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and Balata refugee camp. While patrolling the refugee camp, the Israeli army

	• <u>Provocation of Palestinian Forces</u> : At 11:45, Israeli troops positioned at Al Badhan checkpoint detained the Commander of the Palestinian National Security forces in the district of Jenin and released him, after liaison with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).	
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current Intifada (Uprising). The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access. At 08:00, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint denied access to civilian residents of the districts of Jenin, Nablus, and Tulkarem, who are between 16 and 35 years of age. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el. Raid: At 05:30, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided the city of Salfit, set up a checkpoint on the junction to the village of Khirbet Qeis south of the city, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 06:45, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. 	
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. Arrest: Israeli troops positioned on Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge arrested Khaled Mohammed al Yamini, a civilian resident of town of 'Anata in the district of Jerusalem, while he was returning from Jordan. 	
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. 	

• <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr, northwest of the city of Beit Jala, and in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 10:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Tuqu' and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 21:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem.
- <u>Demonstration/Physical Assaults/Injury</u>: At 13:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Um Salamuna in protest against Wall construction. Israeli troops beat protestors with clubs and rifle butts, injuring 1 civilian in the head.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

HEBRON

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of Halhul and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raids
- (i) At 10:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint raided and patrolled the towns of Halhul, Beit Kahil, Yatta, and As Samoa' as well as the village of Ar Rihiya. The Israeli army also set up checkpoints and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 00:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Yatta.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 13:50, the Israeli army detained 100 civilians, after they performed Friday prayers in the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron.

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed. Only humanitarian cases are allowed access, after prior coordination. Raids/Air Patrol/House Occupations/Attacks/Land Levelling: At 11:00, the Israeli army, including 15 armoured vehicles and 4 bulldozers covered by combat helicopters and reconnaissance aircraft, raided Zammu and Al Banat Streets in the town of Beit Hanun and opened intensive fire. Later, the Israeli army carried out a further riad into Palestinian territory and took position at a distance of 100 metres from Hamuda gas station in the area of Kaff in the town. In addition, the Israeli army occupied the roofs of a number of houses, converted them into military posts, and opened intensive fire. The Israeli army also levelled agricultural land and erected dirt barricades. In the morning on 06 July 2007, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles, raided Palestinian territory northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya; the area of Abu Safiya southeast of the town of Beit Hanun; and east of the Eastern Cemetery east of the town of Jabalya. The Israeli army also levelled land. Palestinian Attack: At 18:35, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel only. Palestinian Attack: At 10:30, 2 mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.

RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing was partially open to a number of trucks transporting food supplies. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open to a number of trucks transporting food supplies.
