ALL DISTRICTS	Beginning at 23:55 on 12 July 2005, the Israeli army continues to impose a total closure on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, preventing civilians and workers from crossing the Green Line, following the suicide attack carried out in the Israeli city of Netanya.

# **GENERAL**

WORK PRMITS	West Bank:     Israeli authorities renewed 13,214 work permits to cross the Green Line. In his article, Amnon Lord attempts to describe the Palestinian President, Mahmoud Abbas, as a terrorist:

According to recent media reports, the Palestinian Islamic Resistance Movement (HAMAS) will fire missiles from the West Bank towards Israeli residential compounds. Not only do these reports assert pessimistic predictions regarding what will happen after transferring security responsibility back to the Palestinian Authority, but they also highlight the pessimism regarding the leadership of the Palestinian President, Mahmoud Abbas. Abbas's electoral campaign presented him as a democratic leader who will begin a new page and divert from Yasser Arafat's path. In the United States, Abbas is described as the 'good man' who must fight for his authority and position against HAMAS and reach a settlement with Israel. This US support of Abbas has been propagated to some extent by the Israeli media.

# ISRAELI INCITEMENT

Over recent years, and since the Sharm ash Sheikh Summit, Abbas has made various statements in which one can assume that he believes that terrorism is a tool that can be used at certain times and under appropriate circumstances.

This opinion can be extracted by analyzing texts. Contrary to HAMAS leaders' frank calls for killing, a statement made by Abbas convicts him as a terrorist. Therefore, Abbas is following Arafat's path.

From a legal perspective, Abbas's position is similar to that of Marwan al Barghouthi, except that Al Barghouthi issued clear orders to certain killers to kill Israelis. With respect to the criminal terrorist system, Abbas, as a leader, is resuming Arafat's terrorist system.

As an expert in political debate exerting influence on public opinion in Israel, Abbas's system will know how to divide powers of terror and negotiations to achieve the PLO's ultimate goal to destroy Israel bit by bit.
