DISTRICT	EVENT
ALL DISTRICTS	The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

WEST BANK

	of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna. • Arrest: On 13 June 2006, the Israeli army arrested Yousef Ahmed Abu Dahouk near Al Khan al Ahmar junction on the Jerusalem-Jericho main road.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to deny access to the city of Ramallah for civilians holding IDs issued in the northern districts of the West Bank. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the areas of Al Midya to Budrus, Al Midya to Ni'lin, Bil'in to Saffa, in the village of Beit Liqya, in the town of Beituniya, and west of the town of 'Abud and the village of Beit Sira. Raids/Detention: At 23:50, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided the city of El Bireh and served a summons to 1 female civilian (the wife of a political prisoner) to report to the Israeli Intelligence Service. At 02:50, the Israeli army, including 12 jeeps, raided the city again and searched 1 building, after detaining residents. At 03:40, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. At 01:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the towns of Beit Rima and Deir Ghassana and patrolled the area.
JENIN	 Closure of Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. The Israeli army also continues to install a surveillance camera in order to observe the area surrounding the checkpoint. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flving Checkpoints: At 09:00, the Israeli army set up 7 flying checkpoints: 1 on the junction to the town of 'Arraba; 3 at the entrances to the towns of Az Zababida, Tubas, and Meithalun; and 3 at the entrances to the villages of 'Aqqaba, Sanur, and Al Far'a. Israeli troops positioned at these flying checkpoints searched civilians and vehicles. At 15:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Tammun and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids/House Occupation: At 04:00 on 14 June 2006, the Israeli army raided the village of Mirka and arrested 1 civilian.

	 (ii) At 01:30, the Israeli army, including 15 jeeps, raided the city of Jenin and Jenin refugee camp, occupied 1 house, and converted it into a military post. An armed confrontation also took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals. At 05:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. • Arrests: (i) At 01:30 on 14 June 2006, the Israeli army arrested Dhiya' Ahmed Zakarneh during its raid on the town of Qabatiya, in addition to those reported yesterday. (ii) The Israeli army arrested Samer Mahmoud Khalil in the village of Mirka.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following roads: the road connecting Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of Tulkarem to the town of Kafr al Labad; the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa; the southern entrance to the town of Baqa ash Sharqiya; the Kafr Sur-Wadi at Tin road; and the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil plain. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the road connecting the town of Beit Lid to the village of Kur. Checkpoints: The Israeli army intensified its restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus road, impeding civilian access. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) and to impede civilian access. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Raids/Confiscation of Property: At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem, set up a checkpoint at its southern entrance, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 04:00, the Israeli army including 20 jeeps, raided the town of 'Attil, searched 1 house, confiscated 1 computer, and arrested 1 civilian. At 05:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Illar and the village of Seida. Arrests: At 09:40, Israeli troops positioned at Jubara checkpoint arrested Baha' Na'im Sa'adeh. The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Abdul Rahman ad Daqqah in the town of 'Attil.
QALQILIYA	Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

	(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector.
	Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in the village of Immatin and east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
NABLUS	Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus main road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades Al Badhan road, which is the north-eastern entrance to the city of Nablus. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting the city of Nablus to the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya. (iv) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the villages of Beita and Osarin. • Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing Huwwara, Beit Iba, At Tur Mountain, and Beit Furik checkpoints around the city of Nablus. The Israeli army closes the checkpoints overnight and reopens them at various morning hours. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Beit Iba and Huwwara checkpoints and to deny access to civilians between 15 and 30 years of age as well as holders of IDs issued in the districts of Jenin and Tulkarem. • Raids: (i) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and Balata refugee camp as well as searched a number of houses. (ii) At 03:10, the Israeli army raided 'Askar refugee camp, searched 2 houses, and arrested 2 brothers, of whom 1 is a civilian and 1 is a Palestinian Police officer. At 04:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. • Arrests: At 03:00 on 13 June 2006, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during its raid on the village of Beita, in addition to those reported on 13 June 2006: (i) Samer Hakam Mamdouh; and (ii) Khaled Abdul Raheem Bani Shams. (iii) At 12:00, Israeli troops positioned at Beit Iba checkpoint arrested Mahdi Mustafa Mallouh. The Israeli army arrested 1 civilian and 1 Palestinian security officer in 'Askar refugee camp: (iv) Iyad Ahmed Soudani, a Palestinian Police officer; and (v) Ashraf Ahmed Soudani.
SALFIT	Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising).

	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southeastern entrance to the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan as well as the western entrances to the towns of Bruqin and Deir Istiya and to the village of Marda. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik. • Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to prevent civilians holding IDs issued in the districts of Jenin and Tulkarem from crossing towards the southern districts of the West Bank. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues near the Green Line in the town of Deir Ballut and the villages of Az Zawiya and Rafat, northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el. • Raid: At 14:00, the Israeli army, including 10 jeeps, raided and patrolled the town of Kifl Haris. • Arrests: (i) At 10:00, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Islam Khalil Smoudi, a Palestinian National Security officer, while he was travelling to his workplace in the city of Jericho. (ii) Israeli troops positioned at Deir Ballut checkpoint arrested Rami Anwar
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho-issued IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli-issued IDs. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Al Hamra checkpoint set up on the Jericho-Nablus road, denying civilian access, except for farmers holding Jericho-issued IDs. The Israeli army also continues to install a surveillance camera in order to observe the area surrounding the checkpoint.
ВЕТНІЕНЕМ	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. The Israeli army considers the civilians' residence in the village illegal because they hold West Bank identity cards while their village is located within the Israeli-defined municipal boundaries of Jerusalem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Beit Fajjar to the village of Marah Rabah.

- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues north of 'Ayda refugee camp and in the Everest area, northwest of the city of Beit Jala.
- Raid/House Occupation/Detention/School Disruption: Beginning at 07:00 on 14 June 2006, the Israeli army remained positioned in the town of Tuqu' and continued to occupy 1 house overlooking Tuqu' Secondary School, in which high school (Tawjihi) matriculation examinations are held. The Israeli army also fired rubber coated steel bullets towards the school while students were sitting for an examination, causing panic amongst students. At 11:25, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

Closure:

- The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city (i) of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh.
- Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to (ii) implement a military order stipulating the closure of civilian commercial shops on both sides of the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron. Civilian vehicles continue to be prohibited from travelling along the road unless they possess access permits. Only Israeli settler vehicles are allowed unrestricted access on the road.

Closure of Main Roads:

- The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following (i) locales: the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; Al Baq'a junction south of the town of Beit 'Awwa; and the entrance to the village of 'Arab ar Ramadin.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron with cement blocks.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the towns of Surif and Beit Ula, south of the towns of Adh Dhahiriya and As Samoa', and southeast of the town of Yatta. The Israeli army has also completed construction of most sections of the Wall in the town of Idhna, from the village of Deir Samit to the town of Beit 'Awwa, from Beit 'Awwa to the village of Al Burj, and in the village of Ar Ramadin.

Raids/Confiscation/Destruction of Property:

- At 23:45, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ula, searched 1 (i) house, and confiscated 1 pistol licensed by the Palestinian Authority.
- At 01:35, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura as well as searched a (ii) number of houses and commercial shops after destroying their doors. The Israeli army also arrested 4 civilians.

HEBRON

- (i) Yaser Abdul Fattah 'Amr;
- (ii) Mahmoud Mohammed Abu Zneid;
- (iii) Ali Mohammed Abu Zneid; and
- (iv) Ahmed Abdullah Dodeen.
- <u>House Occupation/Detention</u>: At 17:30, the Israeli army occupied 1 house belonging to Sa'di Mit'eb, a Palestinian National Security officer, and converted it into a military post after detaining residents in 1 room.
- Attack on Religious Site: On 10 May 2006 and under the pretext of security measures, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 10/06 for the installation of bullet proof glass panels on the windows of Prophet Abraham's Shrine inside the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron.
- <u>Settlement Activity</u>: Allegedly to prevent tension between Israeli settlers and Palestinian civilians, the Israeli army constructed a 9-metre-high cement wall in the area of Al Khan arcade in the old city of Hebron, between 1 building belonging to Ash Sharabati family and the settlement of Abraham Avino.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	Beginning on 16 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the Gaza Strip ostensibly due to Palestinian individuals' firing of mortars towards the Green Line.
NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure: Beginning at 18:00 on 28 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a buffer zone (through open fire as well as artillery and air attacks) in the area near the Green Line, including the area of the debris of evacuated settlements. Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to foreign nationals, VIPs, and humanitarian cases after prior coordination. Provocation of Palestinian Forces: At 23:45, the Israeli army launched an aerostat equipped with a surveillance camera over the area opposite 1 Palestinian National Security location east of the town of Beit Hanun. Palestinian Security Measures: At 20:00, Palestinian National Security forces seized 1 mortar, after having blocked an attempt by armed Palestinian individuals to fire it towards the Green Line from the eastern quarter of the town of Jabalya. At 20:10, Palestinian security forces located and seized 1 unexploded shell that had been fired by Israeli naval boats towards the beach of the town of Beit Lahiya on 09 June 2006, where civilians were on a picnic. The Israeli naval attack then resulted in the killing of 8 civilians, including 7 from the same family. Palestinian Attacks: At 15:30, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line. At 18:30, armed Palestinian individuals attempted to fire 1 unidentified mortar towards the Green Line, but exploded in the area from which it was launched. At 20:00, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.

	 (iv) At 20:10, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line. (v) At 21:30, 3 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line. (vi) At 00:40, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Palestinian Attacks: At 21:35, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line. At 00:50, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.
CENTRAL GAZA	Palestinian Attack: At 20:50, 2 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
KHAN YUNIS	 <u>Attack</u>: At 22:30, the Israeli army fired flares from Point 164 on the Green Line over Palestinian territory east of the village of 'Abasan as Saghira. <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: At 23:00, 5 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
RAFAH	Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah Crossing is partially open in both directions to passengers holding Palestinian IDs, humanitarian cases, as well as Arab and foreign diplomatic missions.

GENERAL

WORK PERMITS	 West Bank: A total of 1,163 work permits for crossing the Green Line have been delivered by the Israeli authorities to the Palestinian Chambers of Commerce, which sequentially delivered them to the Palestinian employment offices with which the Israeli authorities had suspended contacts. However, the number of permit-holding workers who were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line is unknown. Gaza Strip: Valid work permits that have been issued by the Israeli authorities for crossing the Green Line total 10, whose holders were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line.
