WEST BANK

The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West **ALL** Bank. **DISTRICTS** Since 24:00 on May 5, the Israeli army imposed an entire closure on the West Bank on the occasion of the 60th anniversary for the establishment of the state of Israel, and denied civilian access into the city of Jerusalem and the Green Line, except for previously arranged humanitarian cases. The closure will continue until April 9. Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Agsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to (i) Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya **JERUSALEM** checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Raids: (i) At 11:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis and clashed with civilians during patrol. (ii) The Israeli army raided the village of Qatannah and arrested 2 civilians. **Arrests**: The 2 civilians arrested in the village of Qatannah are: (i) Hamadah Mohammad Mahmoud Taha; and (ii) Ziyad Abdel Salam Taha. **Wall Gates:** (a) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the

town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.

(b) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the

	villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
- (ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
- (iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.

The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. At 12:50, the Israeli army closed the road that connects the city of Beir Sahour and the area of 'Ush Ghurab with dirt barricades. Flving Checkpoints: At 13:25, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of al-Shawawreh, and searched civilians and vehicles until 14:00 Raids: At 13:10, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 13:40. At 18:30, the Israeli army raided the town of al-Khader and clashed with civilians during patrol. At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Bethlehem, searched 1 civilian house, and withdrew at 03:10.
	 Arrests: At 03:55 on May 6, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians during a raid into the city of Bethlehem. The arrested civilians are: (a) Hassan Mohammad Ali al-Wardyan; and (b) Suhaib Ibrahim Ibayyat.
	 Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.
HEBRON	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in

- the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the town of Halhoul overpass. The checkpoint was set up a second time at 20:30 and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Tarqumia, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 18:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of al-Fawwar and arrested 1 civilian.
- (iv) At 20:40, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Beit Kahel.
- (v) At 23:10, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on on main road between the town of Sa'ir and Bani Na'im

(iii) Raids:

- (i) At 12:00 on May 5, the Israeli army raided the town of Bait Awwa, clashed with civilians and injured 12 pupils during firing of tear gas bombs inside their school.

(vi) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kharsa. **Arrests**: (i) At 04:00 on May 6, the Israeli army arrested 6 civilians dur9ing a raid into the town of Beit Surif. The arrested civilians are: (a) Abdallah Abbas al-Qadi; (b) Mohammad Ibrahim al-Hih; (c) Mohammad 'Aref Hmeidat; (d) Mohammad ali Ghneimat; (e) Mohammad Ali Mousa; and (f) Mostafa Khekd Ghneimat. (ii) At 21:00, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians near Kiryat Arba' settlement in the old city of Hebron. The arrested civilians are: (a) Ala' Shaher al-Jaabari, 12; and (b) Mahdi Sufyan Abu Hannan, 17. The civilian arrested at the junction of al-Fawwar has notben (iii) identified. (iv) The 5 civilians arrested in the town of Yatta are: (a) Mohammad Salem Hassan Rashid; and his sons (b) Hazem; (c) Hassan; (d) Abdel Karim; and (e) Mahmoud. **Wall Construction:** Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route
