WEST BANK The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West **ALL** Bank. **DISTRICTS** Since 24:00 on May 5, the Israeli army imposed an entire closure on the West Bank on the occasion of the 60th anniversary for the establishment of the state of Israel, and denied civilian access into the city of Jerusalem and the Green Line, except for previously arranged humanitarian cases. The closure will continue until April 9. Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Agsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to (i) Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-(ii) Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

JERUSALEM

- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

allowing access to humanitarian cases.

SALFIT the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current
Intifada (Uprising).

entrance to the village of Marda and Hares. In addition, the Israeli army continues to close the eastern entrance to the village of Yassouf and the southern entrance to the village of Deir Istiyya with dirt barricades, as well as the southern entrance to the town of Kafl hares and the 2 northern entrances to the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawa Bani Hassan.

• <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tara checkpoints and prevent civilian vehicles from traveling towards the town of Kafr al-Dik. At 17:00, the Israeli army closed Za'tara checkpoint and impeded traffic upon the arrest of a civilian under the pretext of finding a suspicious object with him. The checkpoint was reopened at 17:40.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 12:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint near the junction of Burkan settlement, detained a civilian vehicle, and arrested 2 civilians.
- (ii) At 12:45, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the towns of Kafr al-Dik and Bruqin, and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:00.

Raids

- (i) at 10:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Marda.
- (ii) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bidya.
- (iii) At 17:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Iskaka and Yassouf.
- (iv) At 17:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr al-Dik and clashed with civilian during patrol. The Israeli army withdrew at 19:00
- (v) At 17:30, the Israeli army raided the villages of Iskaka and Yassouf, and patrolled t hem until 18:10.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The 2 civilians arrested near the junction of Burkan settlement have not been identified.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 07:10, a bunch of settlers from Ariel settlement stoned civilian vehicles on trans-Samaria road. At 07:45, the Israeli army evacuated the settlers.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ariel.

JERICHO

- <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road

BETHLEHEM	 (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. • Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. HEBRON	• Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in

- the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 13:30, the Israeli army set up 3 checkpoints on the town of Halhoul overpass, at the entrance to the area of al-Nabi Mousa, and at the junction of al-Fawwar, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Beit 'Ummar and impeded traffic.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up 2 checkpoints, and detained a number of civilians. The raid recurred at 19:20.
- (ii) At 00:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura, searched 3 civilian houses, and caused damage to 1 civilian house.
- <u>Arrests</u>: On May 5, the Israeli army arrested a child called Taqi Fathi al-Badawi, 16, during a raid into the town of Beit 'Ummar.
- <u>Detention</u>: At 21:45, the Israeli army detained 2 civilians in Tel Rmeideh neighborhood in the old city of Hebron. The 2 civilians were released at 22:20.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

GAZA STRIP

NORTHERN GAZA

- <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanoun (Erez) Crossing is partially open (to allow previously coordinated humanitarian access).

KHAN YOUNIS	 Raids: Since 01:00 on May 7,, the Israeli army raided the area east of the village of Abassan al-Saghira east of the area of al-Farrahin, opened fire intensively and fired tank missiles towards civilian houses, occupied civilian houses and converted them into military posts, searched a number of civilian houses. In addition, an Israeli arrested 4 civilians. Furthermore, an Israeli drone fired missiles towards armed individuals, killed 2 civilians, including 1 female civilian and 1 armed individual, and injured 11 civilians, including 10 armed individuals 3 of whom were seriously injured. The Israeli army also razed agricultural land planted with fruitful trees, caused damage to a number of civilian houses, and then withdrew at 23:00. Deaths: The 2 civilians killed east of the village of Abassan al-Saghira are: (a) Female civilian Wafa' Daghmeh; and (b) Mahmoud Walid Abu Muslem. Arrests: the 4 civilians arrested east of the village of Abassan al-Saghira have not been identified.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: (All closed) (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (al-Awdah) Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (i) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) is closed. Air Attacks: At 03:00, an Israeli drone fired 1 missile towards armed individuals near Sufa Crossing east of the city of Rafah. Palestinian Attacks: (i) In the morning of May 7, two unidentified mortars were fired towards
	Sufa Crossing on the Green Line. (ii) At 16:10, one unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line.

PRISONERS CONDITIONS

- The Israeli military court at Opher prison extended the administrative detention of 5 prisoners from Tulkarem.
- Prisoner Ahmad Abu al-Hayyat, from the city of Nablus, appealed to human rights institutions to interfere and save his life. He was transferred to Ramla jail hospital and is in urgent need for

medical treatment.
