WEST BANK

The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West **ALL** Bank. **DISTRICTS** Since 24:00 on May 5, the Israeli army imposed an entire closure on the West Bank on the occasion of the 60th anniversary for the establishment of the state of Israel, and denied civilian access into the city of Jerusalem and the Green Line, except for previously arranged humanitarian cases. The closure will continue until May 17. Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Agsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to (i) Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya **JERUSALEM** checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Raids: The Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis and arrested 1 university student. Arrests: The university student arrested in the town of Abu Dis is called Jamil Mahmoud Halabiyyeh. **Wall Gates:** (a) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (b) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to

The Israeli army clashed with civilian protestors and injured 4 civilians. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Raids: At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and its refugee camp, opened fire indiscriminately during house search, arrested 2 civilians, and withdrew at 04:00. Arrests: The 2 civilians arrested in the refugee camp of Jenin are: (a) Mousa Ahmad Sa'id; and

TOUBAS	 <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. <u>Raids</u>: At 23:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Toubas and patrolled it until 04:30.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: (a) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamis. (b) At 20:00, the Israeli army closed the road connecting the villages of Ramin and Bazaria with dirt barricades. (c) At 17:00, the Israeli army closed the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun with barbed wires. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarem-Nablus road and at Jubaa checkpoint. Flving Checkpoints: (i) At 11:55, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of the villages of Bazariaq and Ramin. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the tows of Baqa al-Sharqiyye and 'Allar. (iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the eastern entrance to the town of 'Allar. (iv) At 21:10, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of the village of al-Jaroushiyyeh, and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

	• Physical Assaults: At 13:35, the Israeli army stationed at Huwara
	checkpoint physically attacked a military officer called Ahmad Turki
	Wasif Darawsheh, from the presidential guard, and injured him.
	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to
	the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current
CATEUR	Intifada (Uprising).
SALFIT	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western
	entrance to the village of Marda and Hares. In addition, the Israeli army
	continues to close the eastern entrance to the village of Yassouf and the
	southern entrance to the village of Deir Istiyya with dirt barricades, as
	well as the southern entrance to the town of Kafl hares and the 2

	northern entrances to the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawa
	Bani Hassan.
	(iii) At 21:50, the Israeli army removed the dirt barricade set up at the

	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir
	Ballut and Za'tara checkpoints and prevent civilian vehicles from traveling
	towards the town of Kafr al-Dik. At 17:00, the Israeli army closed Za'tara
	checkpoint and impeded traffic upon the arrest of a civilian under the
	pretext of finding a suspicious object with him. The checkpoint was
	reopened at 17:40.
	• Raids: At 15:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Marda and patrolled it
	until 15:40.
	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the
	city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north
	of the settlement of Ariel.
	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of
	Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent
	farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land,
	forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to
	deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and
JERICHO	impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road
	connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint
	set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along al-Mu'arrajat road
	that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah.
	• Physical Assaults: At 23:30, the Israeli army stationed at the D.C.O.
	checkpoint that is set up on the southern entrance to the city of Jericho
	attacked a civilian called Mohammad al-Hashlamun.
	• Closure:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An
	Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in
	the south-eastern area of the village.
	(ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing
	civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-
	dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set
BETHLEHEM	to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.
	 Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading
	to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem
	from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.
	(ii) At 12:50, the Israeli army closed the road that connects the city of
	Beir Sahour and the area of 'Ush Ghurab with dirt barricades.
	• Raids:
	(i) At 21:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir Salah and set

up a checkpoint.

- (ii) At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Beit Jala and searched 1 civilian house.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the town of Halhouls overpass, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of the village of Kharsa, and searched civilian and vehicles.
- (iii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the

- bypass road #35 that leads to Tarqumia crossing.
- (iv) At 12:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint near the entrance to the refuge camp of al-Arroub, arrested 1 police officer and detained his father Shaher Mousa Nabahin but released him at 17:50.
- (v) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Edna, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (vi) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of Deir Samet.

• Raids:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Kahel.
- (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Kharas, searched 1 civilian house, and arrested 3 civilians, including 1 elderly civilian and 2 of his sons.
- (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. The raid recurred at 23:15 during which the Israeli army searched 1 mosque and a number of civilian houses.
- (iv) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Nouba and clashed with civilians during house search.
- (v) At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit 'Ummar.

• Arrests:

- (i) At 02:00 on May 12, the Israeli army arrested on the entrance of the area of al-Nabi Mousa a civilian called Amjad Shafiq Hnehen.
- (ii) The civilian arrested on the entrance to the refugee camp is police officer Ahmad Shaher Mousa Nabahin.
- (iii) The 3 civilians arrested in the town of Kharras are:
 - (a) Ahmad Abdel Qader al-Hroub, 67; and his 2 sons
 - (b) Ayman; and
 - (c) Abdel Qader.
- <u>Military Posts</u>: At 17:00, the Israeli army removed the military watch tower that is set up near Tarqumia checkpoint.
- <u>Palestinian Security Measures</u>: At 18:20, the Palestinian security forces handed over to the Israeli side through the D.C.O. a settler called Yaakov Israfel who entered the city of Hebron by mistake.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
