| ALL<br>DISTRICTS | Since 22 March 2004, the Israeli army has imposed a total closure over the West Bank and Gaza Strip. The Israeli army prevented civilians from crossing the Green Line and entering Jerusalem, closed crossing points to workers, and restricted movement between cities in the West Bank. |  |

The Israeli army confiscated keys to public vehicles after using the vehicles as a barrier between it and protestors.</li> <li>(ii) At 11:55, the Israeli army raided the cities of Ramallah and El Bireh, set up a checkpoint, and searched vehicles. At 19:45, the Israeli army raided the area again and patrolled the area near Al Muqata'a. At 21:15, the Israeli army raided the area again, opened indiscriminate fire, set up several checkpoints throughout the city, searched vehicles and examined passenger IDs. At 22:40, the Israeli army opened fire, injuring 2 civilians, including 1 child.</li> <li>At 20:40, and again at 22:15, the Israeli army raided Tulkarem refugee camp and took position in the area.</li> <li>At 22:55, the Israeli army raided the town of Anabta. The Israeli army claimed that civilians were throwing stones.</li> <li>Raid: At 11:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and opened fire towards civilians in the neighbourhood of Bab al Zawiya, injuring 1 child, claiming that stones had been thrown from the area. | QALQILYA | Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.  Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impede access to health facilities.  Raid/Curfew: At 12:00, the Israeli army, including a large number of tanks and jeeps and supported by helicopters, raided the city of Qalqiliya, occupied several buildings overlooking Palestinian National Security posts, imposed curfew, opened intensive fire, targeted and extra-judicially killed 1 civilian and detained the corpse for several hours. The Israeli army injured 5 civilians, including 4 children, and arrested 10 others, including 1 child. The Israeli army demolished the Veteran's Union building, damaging neighbouring buildings. The Israeli army withdrew at 16:00. At 02:15, the Israeli army raided the area again, searched several houses and arrested 3 civilians before withdrawing at 04:00.  Assasination: The Israeli army assassinated Mazin Mahmoud Yasin in the city of Qalqiliya.  Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 13 civilians in the city of Qalqiliya:  (i) Samman Hsan Zeid, 13 years old;  (ii) Na'el Muhammad Nofal;  (iii) Wa'el Nofal;  (iv) Bahjat Fathi Yamin;  (v) Asid Othman Nassar;  (vi) Hasan Ahmad Atiya;  (vii) Muhammad Ahmad Atiya;  (viii) Muhammad Ahmad Atiya;  (viii) Muhammad Hashim Khadr;  (xii) Bashir Nofal; and  (xiii) Mahmoud Muhammad Juedi.  House Demolition: The Israeli army demolished the Veteran's Union building and damaged neighbouring buildings in the city of Qalqiliya. |

#### • Raids:

- (i) Beginning at 14:45 on 17 May 2004, the Israeli army continues to isolate the district of Rafah from other districts and impose curfew in the neighbourhoods of Tall as Sultan, Al Barazil and Al Salam in the city of Rafah. The Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilians, killing 3 civilians, and raided civilian houses, including 2 in the neighbourhood of Tall as Sultan and another in the neighbourhood of Al Salam. The Israeli army injured 2 civilians, 1 of whom is in critical condition. An Israeli army helicopter fired 1 missile at a civilian house. The Israeli army levelled vast areas of cultivated land, raided several houses and ordered civilians in the neighbourhood of Al Barazil to gather in the Taha Hussein School playground. The Israeli army demolished 3 houses, destroyed 1 civilian vehicle, and arrested an unknown number of civilians.
- (ii) At 21:40, the Israeli army, including 17 tanks and bulldozers, raided 400 meters into Palestinian Territory west of the Sufa crossing, positioned itself near the Palestinian General Intelligence headquarters, occupied 1 house and converted it into a military post, and levelled 10 *dunums* (2.5 acres) of cultivated land.

#### • Killings:

The Israeli army killed 2 civilians in the neighbourhood of Tall as Sultan:

- (i) Jamal Al Assar; and
- (ii) Muhammad Ibrahim Jabr.

The Israeli army killed 1 civilian in the neighbourhood of Al Salam:

- (iii) Khaled Abu Anza.
- <u>Arrests:</u> The Israeli army arrested an unknown number of civilians in the neighbourhoods of Tall as Sultan, Al Salam and Al Barazil. Only a few of those arrested were identified, including:
- (i) Abdul Fattah Azzam;
- (ii) Jamal Husni Al Bayumi; and
- (iii) Mahmoud Husni Al Bayumi.
- <u>House Demolitions</u>: The Israeli army demolished 3 houses in Al Barazil neighbourhood belonging to:
- (i) Hasan Mikawi, a 2-storey house;
- (ii) Abdul Rahman Mikawi, a 3-storey house; and
- (iii) Ahmad Al Akhras.
