WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continued to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

JERUSALEM

Raids:

- (i) The Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis, searched 1 civilian house, and arrested 1 civilian and confiscated from him a Kalashinkov.
- (ii) The Israeli army raided the village of Biddo, searched 2 civilian houses, and arrested 2 civilians.

Arrests:

- (i) The civilian arrested in the town of Abu Dis is called Hussein Mohammad al-Nawafleh.
- (ii) The 2 civilians arrested in the village of Biddo are:
 - (a) Mousa Ibrahim Zahran; and
 - (b) Jihad Abdel Fattah Hmeidan.
- <u>Settle Violence</u>: A bunch of settler in the old city of Jerusalem sprayed chemical substances towards the house of Fakhri Ahmad Mazro and caused burns to him and his wife.

Wall Gates:

(a) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.

(b) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through
the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the
villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-
Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to
cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using
electronic devices.

• Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Safa.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Ras Karkar.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting the villages of Ras Karkar and Kharbatha Bani Hareth, the western entrance to the village of Ain Yabroud, and the junction of Kafr Malik Ein Samiah with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and impede civilian access.

Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) at 14:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the junction of Rimonim settlement on the Mu'arajat road that connects Ramallah and Jericho district, and arrested 2 military officers.
- (ii) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of Kafr Ni'meh, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of Um Safa, and searched civilia,ns and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 22:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of al-Bireh.
- (ii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Abu Qash, and set up a checkpoint in the village center.
- <u>Attacks</u>: On May 23, the Israeil army stationed near Kiryat Sefer settlement opened fire towards a civilian called Issa Samih Darraj from the village of Kharbatha al-Misbah and seriously injured him in the head.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The 2 military officers arrested at the junction of Rimonim settlement are:
 - (a) Mahmoud Mousa Ahmed Mteir; and
 - (b) Ibrahim Sami Mteir.

RAMALLAH

	 (i) At 12:30, a public march set out in the village of Na'alin, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in protest of the apartheid wall construction. (ii) At 13:30, a public march set out in the village of Bil'in, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in protest of the apartheid wall construction. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Raids: (i) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and its refugee camp; opened fire towards civilian houses in the camp, and injured 1 civilian. In addition, the Israeli army opened fire towards a Palestinian police security forces station in the city, and besieged a hospital. The Israeli army withdrew at 05:00. (ii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatia, opened fire intensively during patrol, and withdrew at 05:00. Arrests: The civilian arrested in the refugee camp of Jenin is called Fares Abdallah Sweiti. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TOUBAS	 Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Flying Checkpoints: At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the road that connects the village of al-Far'a and al-Badhan, arrested 1 civilian, and withdrew at 12:00. Raids: The Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Bardala. Arrests: The civilian arrested between the villages of al-Far'a and al-Badhan is called Rami Na'im Salahat.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: (a) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al-Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamis. (b) At 20:00, the Israeli army closed the road connecting the villages of Ramin and Bazaria with dirt barricades. (c) At 17:00, the Israeli army closed the northern entrance to

the town of 'Azzun with barbed wires.

• <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at Einav checkpoint that is set up on Tulkarem-Nablus road and at Jubaa checkpoint.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the town of Baqa al-Sharqiyyeh.
- (ii) At 13:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the town of Bal'a and the village of Kafr Rumman.

• Raids:

- (i) At 12:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Ramin.
- (ii) At 13:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Kaf al-Lubbad and the village of Abu Khamish.
- (iii) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and patrolled it until 15:15.
- (iv) At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and the refugee camps of Tulkarem and Nour shams, opened fire during search of a coffee shop in the camp, and withdrew at 01:00.
- (v) At 00:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Zeita.
- <u>Demonstrations</u>: At 16:00, a public march set out in the village of Shofah, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters, in protest of the continuous closure of the western entrance to the village.
- <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

• Closure of Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Asla.
- (iii) At 21:00, the Israeli army removed the dirt barricades in the road that connects the town of 'Azzun and the village of Izbet al-Tabib.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint that is set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqilya and impede civilian access. At 16:30, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint before traffic and opened it at 17:45.

• Raids:

- (i) At 17:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr Thulth, searched car spare parts store, and arrested 2 civilians.
- (ii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqilya and patrolled it until 19:15.

• Arrests:

- (i) At 22:00, the Israeli army arrested at the checkpoint that is set up on the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqilya a civilian called Hassan Mansour Zeid.
- (ii) The 2 civilians arrested in the town of Kafr Thulth are:
 - (a) Akram Saleh Sweidan; and

	(iii) At 20:00, the Israeli army intensified restrictions at the gate of the apartheid wall leading to the village of 'Azzun Itmeh and impeded traffic.
	Wall Construction: Land leveling for Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of
	the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of al Lubban al-Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	(i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
NABLUS	(ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
	(iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.

	withdrew at 05:30. (a) Arrests: The civilian arrested in the refugee camp of
	Balata is called Ahmad Sa'eed Arayshi.

• <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 12:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance to the village of Wadi Rahhal.
- (ii) At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on the entrance of the village of al-Shawawreh, and searched civilians and vehicles until 22:30.
- <u>Demonstrations</u>: at 11:30, a public march set out in the village of al-Ma'sarah, with the participation of international peace activists and supporters. The Israeli army clashed with civilian protestors, injured 7 and detained 8 intentional peace activists.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 11:20, a bunch of settlers tried to enter the rubrics of Ush Ghurab previously evacuated settlement outpost east of the city of Beit Sahour.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35

HEBRON

- northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 13:50, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint in the old city of Hebron, detained 1 military officer and released him at a later time.
- (ii) At 22:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the town of Beit Awwa and the village of Deir Samet.

• Raids:

- (i) At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Kahel, and set up a checkpoint.
- (ii) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. The raid recurred at 17:50.
- (iii) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of al-Nabi Younis in the town of Halhoul.
- (iv) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Dura.
- (v) At 18:15, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of al-Arroub and opened fire and fired tear gas bombs during patrol.
- (vi) At 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of al-Simya.
- (vii) At 22:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Thahiriyyeh.
- (viii) At 00:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Sammou'.
- (ix) The Israeli army raided the town of Beit Awwa and searched a number of civilian houses.

• Settler Violence:

- (i) At 15:30, a bunch of settlers from Kharsina settlement stoned civilians in the old city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 23:50, a bunch of settlers from Hima settlement stole 60 sheep belonging to a civilian called Salameh Ali Samara when he was tending sheep near the settlement.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

In addition, the Israeli army clashed with armed individuals and killed an elderly civilian, and razed agricultural land and a number of wells. The Israeli army withdrew at 17:00.	
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: (All closed) (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (al-Awdah) Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) is closed. Raids: Since dawn May 23, the Israeli army raided east of the city of Rafah, opened fire towards civilian houses, occupied rooftops of civilian houses and converted them into military posts, clashed with armed individuals, razed land and then withdrew at 11:00.

• For the third consecutive time, the Israeli authorities extended the administrative detention of Engineer Wasfi Qubaha for 6 months.
