on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (a) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (b) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area
- (c) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint set up near the village of Jaba' and impeded traffic in both directions. The checkpoint was reopened at a later time.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The Israeli army arrested at Qalandya checkpoint civilian Ali Mohammad al-Rashaydeh.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.

JERUSALEM

RAMALLAH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Raids: At 20:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of al-Bireh and the town of Beitunia. At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Abu Qash, searched a number of houses, detained a military officer from the Palestinian National Security Forces but released him at a later time, and withdrew at 03:00. At 04:00, the Israeli army raided the city of al-Bireh, and patrolled it until 04:45. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to close Tayaseer checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Flving Checkpoints: At 08:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Arraba, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 07:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Arbounah, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the villages of al-Far'a and Siris, and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Silet al-Harithiyyeh and Jaba'. At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and its refugee camp, searched 2 civilian houses and withdrew at 05:30. At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatia and opened fire indiscriminately during patrol. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TULKAREM	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a

- closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district.
- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). At 17:00, the Israeli army denied civilians between the age of 16 and 35 access through the 'Einav checkpoint.

• Raids:

- (i) At 22:20, Israeli land-dropped infantry raided the area of Jabal al-Qa'de near the town of Beit Lid, and combed the area.
- (ii) At 22:45, 5 Israeli military jeeps raided the town of Qafin, searched 3 civilian house including that of the mayor, and withdrew at 01:00.
- Arrests: At 21:50 on October 11, the Israeli army arrested 5 civilians during a raid on the city of Tulkarem, the refugee camp of Tulkarem and the town of Deir al-Ghusun. The civilians are:
- (a) Mohannad Abdel Jabbar Badran;
- (b) Mousa Abdellatif Zeidan;
- (c) Ra'ed Ahmad Qozah;
- (d) Omar Ahmad Abu Ghazaleh; and
- (e) Youssef Bassam Malah.
- Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

• Closure of Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road that connects the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib.
- (ii) The Israeli army continued to close the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun with an iron gate.
- **Flying Checkpoints**: At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the village of Kafr Laqif, and arrested one civilian.

• <u>Raids</u>:

- (i) At 13:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Jayyous.
- (ii) At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqilya, and patrolled it until 01:40.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian arrested at the entrance to the village of Kafr Laqif is Amin Hassan Suwan.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma

NABLUS	(iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close
	the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the
	town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing,
	only allowing access to humanitarian cases.
	(iv) At 11:45, the Israeli army close Huwara checkpoint and impede traffic
	in both directions. The checkpoint was reopened at a later time.
	• Raids: At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nabous, the refugee
	camp of Balata, and the refugee camp of Ein al-Ma' and opened fire intensively. In addition, the Israeli army occupied a house and turned into a
	military post, searched a number of houses and uncured damage to house furniture.
	Furthermore, the Israeli army arrested 5 civilians and withdrew at 05:15.

	Closure of Main Roads:
SALFIT	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to
	the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current

Intifada (Uprising). The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western (ii) entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr al-Dik. **Checkpoints:** (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tarah checkpoints and to deny civilian access. At 13:10, the Israeli army closed Za'tarah checkpoint and opened it at 13:40. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the junction of the town of Za'tarah and impede traffic. Flying checkpoints: At 19:45, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the towns of Kafl Hares and Deir Istiyya until 20:30. Raids: At 08:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Kafr al-Dik, searched on (i) civilian house and withdrew at 09:00. At 18:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Bidya and patrolled it until (ii) 19:15. At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Hares and patrolled it (iii) until 20:30. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ari'el. Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along al-Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. **JERICHO** Raids: At 13:40, the Israeli army raided the village of al-'Auja, searched 2 (i) civilian houses and arrested one civilian. At 19:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Jericho and arrested a (ii) military officer from the Palestinian national security Forces. **Arrests:** The Israeli army arrested at al-Karama (Allenby) Crossing civilian (i) Khaled Salameh while he was returning home from a visit to Jordan. The civilian arrested in the village of al'-Auja is Riyad Mifleh Atiyat. (ii) The military officer arrested in the city of Jericho is Mamdouh Fahd (iii) Mahmoud al-Fuhoud. **Closure: BETHLEHEM** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An

Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.

- (ii) Since September 15, 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to the 22-dunum land that has been confiscated in accordance with confiscation order number 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmouriyyeh that is located in the cities of Beit Sahour and Bethlehem.
- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.
- <u>Checkpoints</u>: At 18:20, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Tegoa and impeded traffic.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues for the Jewish weekend in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrata; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al-Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arroub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as

well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

- (iii) At 13:00, the Israeli army closed the entrance to the town of Beit 'Ummar with an iron gate after clashes with civilians.
- <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>: At 09:30, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the area of al-Nabi Younis, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raids:
- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit 'Ummar
- (ii) At 15:40, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of al-Arroub during it imposed curfew after clashes with civilians.
- (iii) At 15:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Deir al-Assal and searched one house.
- (iv) At 17:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhoul.
- (v) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and set up a checkpoint in the area of Namra. The raid recurred at 22:30 during which the Israeli army set up a checkpoint on al-Salam Street. The Israeli army raided the city of Hebron for a third time at 02:00 until 06:00.
- (vi) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Thahiriyyeh.
- <u>Arrests</u>: At 13:00, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians near the al-Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron. The civilians are:
- (a) Usayd Ghassan al-Sharha; and
- (b) Mohammad Masalmeh.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
