### WEST BANK

## ALL DISTRICTS

- on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.
- Since dawn on September 26, on the occasion of the Feast of the Tabernacles, the Israeli army has been imposing full closure on West Bank districts and prevented labourers and civilians to enter the Green Line except for humanitarian cases. The closure will remain until further notice.

# • <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. The Israeli army forbade male civilians under 45 and female civilians under 35 to enter Jerusalem. It only allowed male civilians between 45-50 and female civilians between 35-40, to enter Jerusalem only after obtaining special permits. Men over 50 and women over 40 were allowed entry to al-Aqsa Mosque without permits.

### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

### • Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Rafat and Ramot checkpoints, and the checkpoint set up near the village of Jaba'a, and impeded civilian access.

### • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians

- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Land levelling for Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.

### **Closure of Main Roads:**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of al-Lubban al-Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
- (iv) On October 1, the Israeli army closed the western entrance to the village of Burqa, and the eastern and western entrances to the village of Bazarya, and denied civilian access in pretence of protecting as bunch of settlers who entered into the previously evacuated Homesh settlement, in the district of Jenin.

# • <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

- (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.
- (ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
- (iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.
- (iv) At 03:30, the Israeli army intensified its restriction at al-Badhan checkpoint and prevented a civilian to take his daughter to Nablus Government Hospital. At once an ambulance was sent for to take the child to hospital. The Israeli army also confiscated cellphones belonging to civilians.
- Flying Checkpoint: The Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the town of al-Jama'een and between the villages of Jorish and Qusra.

### **NABLUS**

### Raids: (i) At 16:25, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Qalil where clashed with civilians occurred resulting in the injury of a child. At 02:40, the Israeli army raided the refugee camp of Balata and (ii) opened fire intensively while patrolling it. At 04:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus, searched one building and arrested 3 brothers including a police officer. **Arrests**: The 3 brothers arrested in the city of Nablus are: (a) Police Officer Munir Shehadah; (b) Amjad Shahadah; and (c) Anas Shahadah. **Closure of Main Roads:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current Intifada (Uprising). (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr al-Dik. **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut (i) **SALFIT** checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr al-Dik. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara (ii) junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access. Flying Checkpoints: At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a checkpoint between the city of Salfit and the village of Iskaka. Raids: At 15:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Deir Istiyya. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish weekend in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ari'el. Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede (i) **JERICHO** civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. At 11:00, the Israeli army closed the D.C.O. checkpoint set up at the (ii) southern entrance to the city of Jericho and impeded traffic. The checkpoint reopened at 12:00. • Raids: At 12:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Marj Na'jah,

searched a house and withdrew at 03:00.
