WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. The Israeli army forbade male civilians under 45 and female civilians under 35 to enter Jerusalem. It only allowed male civilians between 45-50 and female civilians between 35-40, to enter Jerusalem only after obtaining special permits. Men over 50 and women over 40 were allowed entry to al-Aqsa Mosque without permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al-Bareed to the town of al-Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

JERUSALEM

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Rafat and Ramot checkpoints, and the checkpoint set up near the village of Jaba'a, and impeded civilian access.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction resumed in Dahiyat al-Bareed, Dahiyat al-Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-

	Jaba' road, the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna.
RAMALLAH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. The Israeli army continues to close the settler bypass road connecting 'Assur Hill in the village of Kafr Malik to Alon settler bypass road. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Raids: At 10:55, 6 Israeli military jeeps raided and patrolled the village of Attara. At 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Jenin. At 04:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatia, opened fire intensively in all directions, searched a number of houses and arrested one civilian. Deaths: At 04:00, civilian Ali Hassan Abu Rmeileh, a member of an armed group, was martyred in one of the Israeli hospitals affected by injuries during clashes with the Israeli army in a raid on the city of Jenin, as was made mention of in August 25 report. Arrests: The civilian arrested in the town of Qabatia is Husni Mohammad Zakarneh. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al-Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the

TULKAREM	 village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). Raids: At 10:55, 6 Israeli military jeeps raided and patrolled the town oif Bal'a. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
QALQILIYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. Flving Checkpoints: At 08:30, the Israeli army set up 2 checkpoints at the southern and eastern entrances to the city of Qalqilya. Raids: (i) At 15:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jayyous and clashed with civilians while patrolling it. (ii) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqilya and arrested 2 civilians. Arrests: The 2 civilians arrested in the city of Qalqilya are: (a) Mohammad Usama Sweilem; and (b) Ahmad Riyad. Wall Gates: (i) Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction resumed in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
NABLUS	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei Shomron. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut. The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of al-Lubban al-Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only. Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit

	Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan. (iii) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira al-Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases. (iv) At 03:30, the Israeli army intensified its restriction at al-Badhan checkpoint and prevented a civilian to take his daughter to Nablus Government Hospital. At once an ambulance was sent for to take the child to hospital. The Israeli army also confiscated cellphones belonging to civilians. • Raids: (i) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and the refuge camp of Ein Beit al-Ma', opened fired intensively while patrolling them and withdrew at 05:00. (ii) The Israeli army raided the town of Qiblan and clashed with civilians while patrolling it. • Physical Assaults: At 19:40, Israeli army at Iba checkpoint attacked civilian Ahmad Ameed Abu Omar.
SALFIT	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the main north-western entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising). The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western entrance to the town of Kafr al-Dik. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr al-Dik. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ari'el.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah.

Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. Raids: (i) At 09:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of al-Khader. The raid recurred at 17:10. **BETHLEHEM** (ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of al-Freides. At 22:00, The Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Zaatarah (iii) and the village of al-Shawawreh. The Israeli army raided the village of Deir Salah, set up as checkpoint (iv) and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area northwest of the town of al-Khader; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Ephrat; and in the area surrounding the village of al-Walaja. **Closure:** (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to (ii) implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless **HEBRON** they possess access permits. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following (i) locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Oeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp.

(ii)

In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to

prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street

that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.

• <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army set up a checkpoint at the entrance to the village of al-'Adisa, and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 12:40, the Israeli army raided the town of Bani Naeem and arrested one civilian.
- (ii) At 13:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Kahel.
- (iii) At 01:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron, and set up 4 checkpoints.
- (iv) The Israeli army raided the town of Dura and searched a number of houses.
- (v) The Israeli army raided the town of al-Thahiriyyeh and opened fire intensively in all directions while patrolling it.
- <u>Arrests</u>: The civilian arrested in the town of Bani Naeem is Mahfouz Omar al-Tarayreh.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

	• Raids: In the morning of October 6, 3 Israeli tanks and bulldozers, backed
	up by helicopters and surveillance aircrafts, raided our areas 300 meters in
	depth alongside al-Mintar Crossing to the east of the city of Gaza.
	Helicopters opened fire intensively and tanks fired missiles, and clashed
	with armed groups, and razed agricultural land.

RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (al-Awdah) Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is partially open. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open. Palestinian Attacks: At 07:30, an (unidentified) mortar was fired towards the Green Line. At 07:30, 8 mortars were fired towards the Green Line. In the morning of October 7, 3 mortars were fired towards the surrounding area of Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing on the Green Line.
