| ALL DISTRICTS | The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating northern districts from southern districts as well as the district of Jericho and Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank. At 24:00, the Israeli army imposed a complete closure over the West Bank districts on the occasion of Yom Kippur. The Israeli army also prevented civilians, including workers, from accessing the city of Jerusalem and areas inside the Green Line, only allowing previously coordinated humanitarian cases. The closure will last until the dawn of 10 October 2008. |
| JERUSALEM | Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al-Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al-Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Wall Gates: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on al-Shayyah road in the area between the villages of al-Sawahira al-Sharqiya and al-Sawahira al-Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of al-'Eizariya to al-Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of al-Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of al-Jib, in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna, and south of Beit Hanina village. |
| RAMALLAH & EL BIREH | • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil; the western entrances to the villages of Saffa and Ein Yabrud; the road between the villages of Ras Karkar and Kharbatha Bani Harith and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – Ein Samiya. |

| | Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at the checkpoint on the overpass to 'Atara town and impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of al-Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. Flying Checkpoint: At 16:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Deir Dibwan and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rammun. At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bir Zeit. At 01:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. At 03:30, the Israeli army raided Al Jalazun refugee camp and arrested 1 civilian. (v) The Israeli army raided the village of 'Ein Siniya and searched 1 house. (vi) The Israeli army raided the town of Al Mazra'a al Gharbiya and arrested 1 civilian. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested Saleh Yousef Sha'ban Safi in Al Jalazun refugee camp. The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Abdullah Mohammed Ladadweh in the town of Al Mazra'a al Gharbiya. |

| JENIN | Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to 'Arraba town, east of the settlement of Dotan. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall. Raid/Detentions: The Israeli army raided the village of Hashimiya, detained 2 civilians, and released them at a later time. Arrest: On 05 October 2008, the Israeli army arrested 'Uthman Khalil Ahmed Rashid, a civilian resident of the village of At Tayba, while he was present in an area inside the Green Line. |
| TUBAS | Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Raids/Attack/Injury/Physical Assault: At 09:00, the Israeli army raided Al Far'a refugee camp. While searching 2 houses, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 1 civilian. Israeli troops also severely the injured civilian's brother despite the fact that he is disabled. At 10:40, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Far'a and patrolled the area until 19:50. |

Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarm a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Einav checkpoint on Tulkarm-Nablus road and at Jubara checkpoint. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Raids: At 12:00, the Israeli army raided Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of (i) Tulkarem and arrested 1 female civilian. At 21:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Oaffin and arrested 2 (ii) children. At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Anabta, searched a (iii) number of houses, and served summons to 2 children to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. The Israeli army also arrested 3 other children and withdrew at 04:00. TULKAREM **Arrests:** At 02:35 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army arrested Mus'ab (i) Abdullah Saleh during its raid into the village of Shufa. The Israeli army arrested Arfalin Ahmed Sawalhah, a female (ii) civilian, in Dahiyat Dhinnaba in the city of Tulkarem. The Israeli army arrested 2 children in the town of Qaffin: Oussay 'Ayed Khaled Harasheh, 14 years old; and (iii) Nabil Ahmed Jamil Khusseib, 15 years old. (iv) The Israeli army arrested 3 children in the town of 'Anabta: Zeid Burhan Tawfiq Hamdallah, 17 years old; (v) Mohammed 'Issam Nassar, 17 years old; and (vi) Islam Abdul Karim Hussein Ali, 17 years old. **Demonstration:** At 11:30, civilians held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Tulkarem in solidarity with political prisoners. Protestors demanded that prisoners be released from Israeli prisons. <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya as well as at the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Jal'ud and to impede civilian access. **QALQILYA Wall Gates:** Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special (i) Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma (ii) Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal

detector.

- (iii) At 07:00, the Israeli army closed 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and denied civilian access, only allowing school students, allegedly for celebration of Yom Kippur.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Land leveling for Wall construction continues in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the vicinity of the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) Beginning at 02:00 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army remained positioned in the city of Qalqiliya, searched a number of houses, arrested 2 civilians, and withdrew at 10:20.
- (ii) The Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kafr Qaddum.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Qalqiliya:
- (i) Adham 'Adnan Hasan 'Uweinat;
- (ii) Basel Mahmoud Abu Suleiman.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the roads of Sarra-Jit, Tel-Burin, Beit Furik-Salem, the road between Aqraba town and the main road and the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya; and with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Tel and Madama, the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut, the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqiya, the western entrance to the town of Aqraba, the southern entrance to the village of Duma, the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan, the western entrance to the village of Majdal Bani Fadil as well as the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al-Hatab to Alon Moreh settlement.
- (ii) On 10 August 2008, the Israeli army re-opened the Jenin-Nablus road between the junction to Deir Sharaf village and the settlement of Shavei Shomron, allowing daily passage from 06:00 until 17:00.

• <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

- (i) At Tur neighborhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighborhood only.
- (ii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit Furik and the nearby village of Beit Dajan.
- (iii) At 12:15, the Israeli army closed Huwwara checkpoint so that Sanabel Bureik, a female civilian, could represent how she had splashed an incendiary material at Israeli troops at the checkpoint. The Israeli army reopened the checkpoint at a later time.

• Raids:

- (i) At 02:00 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and arrested a civilian as well as his son.
- (ii) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Badhan and patrolled the area until 19:50.

NABLUS

| | (iii) At 01:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus as well as 'Ein Beit el Ma' refugee camp and searched a number of houses. Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya: (i) Abdullah Yihya Suleiman Saleh, 16 years old; and his father (ii) Yihya Suleiman Saleh. |

| SALFIT | Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and the eastern entrance to the village of Yasuf. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrances to the town of Bruqin and the village of Qarawat Bani Hassan and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut and Za'tara checkpoints and prevent civilian vehicles from heading towards the village of Kafr Ad Dik. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kafr Hares north of the settlement of Ariel. Raids: At 10:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Kafr ad Dik and Bruqin. At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Salfit. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 21:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city again. At 21:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Az Zawiya and patrolled the area until 21:20. |
| JERICHO | Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of al-'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at al-Hamra checkpoint set up along al-Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of al-'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. At 19:35, the Israeli army closed Al Hamra checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at a later time. Raid/Detention: At 00:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Jericho. Having detained their owner, the Israeli army searched 1 house and commercial shops, claiming to be looking for agricultural chemicals. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 02:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. |

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) Beginning on 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has been preventing civilian access, according to military order 07.02.S, to an area of 22 *dunums* of land that has been confiscated in accordance with the Israeli Military Order No. 07.31.T. The 22-dunum area has been set to construct a passage in the area of Mazmuriya that is located in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the two sideways east and south of Al Walaja village and the roads of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad, Talita-Nazlet As Sidr in the city of Beit Jala, Al Khadr town-Road # 60, Al Khadr town-Beit Jala housing, Wadi Rahal-Efrat and the sideway east of Beit Fajjar town.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of al-Khadr town; northwest of Beit Jala city; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ephrata settlement; and in the area surrounding al-Walaja village.
- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 22:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids/Detentions:

- (i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the debris of 'Ush Ghurab, a previously evacuated military post east of the city of Beit Sahur.
- (ii) At 12:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr, set up a checkpoint in the centre of the town, searched civilians and vehicles, and detained a number of school students. After coordination through the DCO, the Israeli army released the students at 13:05.
- (iii) At 13:40, and again at 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tuqu'.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 02:35 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army arrested Mohammed Mousa Khalil Abu 'Ilayya in Ad Duheisha refugee camp in the city of Bethlehem, in addition to those reported yesterday.

• Closure:

HEBRON

The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: al-Shuhada' Street and the area of al-Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al-Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of al-Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from al-Laban Market and the area of al-Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of al-Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.

BETHLEHEM

(ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from traveling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of al-Samoa'; the area of al-Hawawir leading to the town of Halhoul; the area of al-Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of al-Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to al-Qeisi neighborhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to al-'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from traveling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to bypass Road # 60.
- (iv) The Israeli army continues to open the junction of Farsh Al Hawa north of Hebron city, which leads to Road # 35 that leads to Tarqumiya Crossing. The Israeli army installed an iron gate instead of the dirt barricade. The Israeli army designated the following times for the daily opening the gate: from 05:00 until 07:00 and from 09:00 until 13:00.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of al-Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.

Raids:

- (i) At 01:30 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian.
- (ii) At 13:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of Bab az Zawiya in the city of Hebron.
- (iii) At 03:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta and searched 1 house.
- <u>Arrests</u>: At 01:00 on 07 October 2008, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilians, including a university student, as well as a Palestinian Police officer during its raid into the city of Hebron:
- (i) Ahmed Omar Abu Hussein, a Palestinian Police officer;
- (ii) Saed Mohammed Salhab; and
- (iii) Hani Anwar Rweished.
- (iv) The Israeli army arrested Ahmed Khadher Abu Mariya in the town of Beit Ummar.
