WEST BANK

ALL DISTRICTS

• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.

• <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho.

• Checkpoints:

(i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.

(ii) The Israeli army intensified its restrictions and impeded civilian access at the checkpoint set up near the village of Jaba' as well as at Ramot checkpoint.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Oatanna.

JERUSALEM

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern (i) entrance to the village of Sinjil and with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. The Israeli army continues to close the settler bypass road connecting (ii) 'Assur Hill in the village of Kafr Malik to Alon settler bypass road. **Checkpoint:** The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Oaddis. **Flying Checkpoints:** The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint along the settler bypass road near the village of Rammun, searched civilians and vehicles, and RAMALLAH arrested 2 civilians, allegedly for locating live ammunition in their possession. **EL BIREH** The Israeli army set up 3 checkpoints: 1 in the area between the villages (ii) of Kafr 'Ein and Qarawat Bani Zeid and 2 at the entrances to the villages of Mazari' An Nubani and Jammala. Israeli troops positioned at these flying checkpoints searched vehicles and civilians. Raids/Detentions: At 21:00, the Israeli army raided the city of El Bireh and arrested 2 children. The Israeli army also detained 4 civilians and released them at a later time. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the city again and patrolled the area. Arrests: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up along the settler bypass road near the village of Rammun arrested 2 civilians: Ala' Muhammad Dawoud; and (i) (ii) Hammad Rateb Nayef. The Israeli army arrested 2 children in the city of El Bireh: (iii) Hussein Qar'an, 15 years old; Mahmoud Ayyub Musallam, 16 years old. (iv) Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. **JENIN** Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoints/Confiscation of Property: At 08:15, the Israeli army set up 3 flying checkpoints: between the (i) town of Qabatiya and the village of Misliya; between the town of 'Arraba and the village of Fahma; at the entrance to the village of Al Kufeir. Israeli troops positioned at these checkpoints searched civilians.

	 (ii) At 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint along the road to the village of Sanur and searched vehicles and civilians (iii) At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to
	the village of Al Jarba, searched civilians and vehicles, and confiscated a cellular telephone belonging to Fu'ad Hamdan Samarah.
	• Raids: (i) At 07:30 on 1 September 2007, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Faqqu'a.
	 (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of At Tayba. (iii) At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Rummana. (iv) At 17:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sanur. (v) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Tammun.
TULKAREM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to declare the district of Tulkarem a closed military zone and to impede civilian access to and from the district. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the Dahiyat Iktaba-Bal'a road; the entrance to the village of Saffarin; the road connecting the town of Deir al Ghusun to 'Attil's plain; the road to the town of Deir al Ghusun's plain; and the entrance to the village of 'Izbat Abu Khamish. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Jubara checkpoint (the southern entrance to the city of Tulkarem) as well as at 'Einav checkpoint (the eastern entrance to the city). Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Raid: The Israeli army raided Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarm, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
QALQILIYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun as well as the road connecting the town of 'Azzun to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction was resumed in the villages of Immatin and Kafr Laqif as well as east of the towns of Kafr Thulth and 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:00, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints at the eastern and southern entrances to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 21:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya and arrested 1 civilian. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Omar Khaled Dawoud in the city of Qalqiliya.

	• Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the Jenin-Nablus road between the
	junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and the settlement of Shavei
	Shomron.
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the settler
	bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of
	Alon Moreh as well as the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut.
	(iii) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of Al
	Lubban ash Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing
	checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
	(i) Huwwara and Beit Iba checkpoints (set up at the southern and western
	entrances to the city of Nablus respectively) are closed at 23:00. The
	Israeli army only allows civilian vehicles possessing access permits to
	cross these checkpoints. The Israeli army also searches civilians
	using metal detectors at Beit Iba checkpoint, impeding their access.
	(ii) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed
NIA DY YIG	on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all
NABLUS	other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.
	(iii) Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit
	Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.
	(iv) Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close
	the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the
	town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing,
	only allowing access to humanitarian cases.
	• Flying Checkpoint: At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on
	the junction to the settlement of Yitzhar and searched civilians and
	vehicles.
	• Raids/Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack/House Occupation:
	(i) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and Balata refugee
	camp. Having detonated an explosive device near an Israeli army jeep
	in Balata refugee camp, an armed confrontation took place between
	armed Palestinian individuals and the Israeli army. The Israeli army
	also opened indiscriminate fire in the old city of Nablus. In addition, the
	Israeli army occupied 1 house, converted it into a military post, and
	withdrew at 06:00.
	(ii) The Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Zeita Jamma'in.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	(i) The Israeli army has continued to close the main north-western
SALFIT	entrance to the city of Salfit with dirt barricades since the beginning of
	the current <i>Intifada</i> (Uprising).
	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western
	entrance to the village of Marda and, with cement blocks, the western
	entrance to the town of Kafr ad Dik.

	 Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Deir Ballut checkpoint and to deny civilian access to the town of Kafr ad Dik. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the Za'tara junction checkpoint and impeded civilian access. • Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ari'el.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Al Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting between the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, and searched vehicles and civilians.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. Wall Construction: Wall construction was resumed in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja. Flying Checkpoints: At 01:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Beit Sahur and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ash Shawawra and searched vehicles and civilians. Raids: At 13:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem and the town of Al Khadr.
HEBRON	Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with

- an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was resumed in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
- **Flying Checkpoint:** At 10:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Deir Samit and searched vehicles and civilians until 11:00.

• Raids:

- (i) At 21:50 on 31 August 2007, the Israeli army raided the town of Ash Shuyukh and arrested 1 civilian.
- (ii) At 09:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint in the area of Wadi Al Hariya, searched civilians and vehicles, detained 1 Palestinian Custom Police officer, and released him, after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO). At 10:30, the Israeli army raided the city again and searched a number of houses. At 18:10, the Israeli army raided the city for the third time, set up a checkpoint in the Abu Sneina neighbourhood, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (iii) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Yatta.
- (iv) At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Kahil, searched 2 houses, and served summons to 2 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.

(v) At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Sa'ir. While patrolling the
area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians.
(vi) At 23:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Dura.
Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Nawwaf Mousa al Halayqah in the town
of Ash Shuyukh.

GAZA STRIP

NORTHERN GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed. Only humanitarian cases are allowed access, after prior coordination. Air Patrols: At dawn on 02 September 2007, Israeli F16 and reconnaissance aircraft as well as combat helicopters patrolled the skies over the district of Northern Gaza.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Raid: At noon on 01 September 2007, Israeli Special Forces raided Palestinian territory near Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing east of Gaza city. An armed confrontation took place between Israeli troops and armed Palestinian individuals. Air Patrol: At dawn on 02 September 2007, Israeli F16 and reconnaissance aircraft as well as combat helicopters patrolled the skies over the district of Gaza. Palestinian Attacks/Israeli Attack: At 12:00, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line near Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing east of Gaza city. Consequently, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards Palestinian territory. At 15:20, 4 mortars were fired towards the Green Line. At 02:45, 3 mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
CENTRAL GAZA	 Attack: In the evening on 01 September 2007, Israeli troops fired 1 missile mortar from one of its locations on the Green Line towards armed Palestinian individuals northeast of the area of Al Qarara, while they were attempting to fire mortars towards the Green Line. As a result, 2 armed individuals sustained critical injuries. Palestinian Attack: At 11:20, 2 unidentified mortars were fired towards the Green Line.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.
RAFAH	 Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is closed.
