ALL DISTRICTS	Since 22 March 2004, the Israeli army has imposed a total closure on the West Bank and Gaza Strip, prevented civilians from crossing the Green Line and entering Jerusalem, and restricted movement between cities in the West Bank.

JERUSALEM	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.</li> <li>Wall Construction: <ol> <li>Wall construction continues along the main road between Qalandiya checkpoint and Ar Ram, the area of Al Aqbat, north of the village of 'Anata, in the area between the villages of Jaba' and Hizma, the area of Ash Shayyah, and in the town of As Sawahira Ash Sharqiya.</li> <li>Wall construction in the villages of Qatanna and Biddu remains suspended following an Israeli Supreme Court order.</li> <li>Raid: The Israeli army raided the village of Al Jib, raided and searched tents belonging to the clan of Abu Dahuk, and ruined animal feed.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in Rantis, Budrus, Midya, Ni'lin, Deir Qaddis, Beit Liqya, and Beituniya.</li> <li>Raids/Curfew: <ul> <li>Beginning at 01:30 on 6 September 2004, the Israeli army remains positioned in the town of Silwad and continues to impose curfew. Classes were disrupted in 4 schools serving 1,792 students as a result of the curfew. The Israeli army searched several houses, arrested 3 civilians, and severely beat 1 child, breaking his leg. The child was later hospitalised.</li> <li>At 10:50, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Ramallah. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the city again and took photographs of 1 civilian building in the centre of the city.</li> <li>At 22:30, an Israeli army patrol raided the village of Ras Karkar and arrested 1 civilian.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

The closure continues to negatively impact education, economic and livelihood activities and impedes access to health facilities.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction continues in Jalbun towards Al Mutilla, Raba, Al Mughayyir, Bardala and 'Ein al Beida, and towards the Jordan River.</li> <li>Raids/Curfew/School Disruption:</li> <li>Beginning at 04:00 on 6 September 2004, the Israeli army remains positioned in the town of Silat Adh Dhahr, continues to impose curfew, searched several houses, and opened indiscriminate fire, injuring 1 child. Classes were disrupted in 6 schools serving 2,223 students as a result of the curfew. Classes were also disrupted in a school in the village of Al 'Atara serving 199 female students as a result of the checkpoint set up at the village's only entrance from the town of Silat Adh Dhahr. The Israeli army remains positioned in the area as of 08:00 this morning.</li> <li>(ii) At 12:50, the Israeli army raided the town of Tubas. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army surrounded the municipality building and detained over 60 civilians who were inside. At 23:30, the Israeli army raided the city again, searched 1 house after detaining its residents for 3 hours, and took photographs of them. At 01:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.</li> <li>(iii) At 21:00, the Israeli army raided the area along the main road between the city of Jenin and the town of Al Yamun. The Israeli army, supported by a helicopter, pursued a civilian vehicle along the main road and arrested 1 Palestinian National Security officer.</li> <li>(iv) At 07:30, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Arraba, arrested 2 civilians, and closed all entrances t</li></ul>

NABLUS	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army set up dozens of flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.</li> <li>Attack: The Israeli army opened fire towards 4 civilians near the settlement of Itamar, injuring them. The Israeli army then arrested the injured civilians.</li> <li>Raids/House Occupations: <ol> <li>Beginning at 22:25 on 5 September 2004, the Israeli army remains positioned in the city of Nablus and Balata refugee camp. The Israeli army continues to occupy 5 civilian buildings overlooking the camp and 1 building in the centre of the city, all of which it converted into military posts. The Israeli army withdrew from the area at 13:00.</li> <li>At 15:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Beita. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 5 civilians, including 4 children.</li> <li>Arrest: The Israeli army arrested 4 unidentified civilians near the settlement of Itamar.</li> <li>Settler Violence:</li> <li>At 20:30, an Israeli settler from the settlement of Itamar stole 29 goats belonging to 1 civilian from the village of 'Aqraba. Several civilians from the village pursued the settler and retrieved the goats, except for 2 which were slaughtered by the settler.</li> <li>A group of Israeli settlers severely beat and injured 1 journalist at Huwwara checkpoint as he was trying to report on settler violence against civilians.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
SALFIT	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing pedestrians and vehicles from crossing.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Land levelling for Wall construction west of the village of Iskaka, north of the city of Salfit (around the settlement of Ariel) and in the villages of Al Zawiya and Deir Ballut remains suspended due to changes in the Wall route following an Israeli Supreme Court order.</li> <li>Raids: <ol> <li>At 12:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Marda and surrounded the village school.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>

BETHLEHEM	<ul> <li>Closure: <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army set up flying checkpoints throughout the district, closing all entrances to the city and roads connecting towns and villages, and preventing civilians from crossing.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close the only road leading to the village of Al Nu'man, northeast of the Bethlehem district, isolating the village and placing it, together with the adjacent village of Al Khas, under the jurisdiction of the Jerusalem municipality.
