| ALL DISTRICTS | The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank. Beginning in the evening on 09 September 2007, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the West Bank districts and to prevent civilians, including workers, from entering the city of Jerusalem or crossing the Green Line due to the Jewish New Year. The Israeli closure will last until the evening on 16 September 2007. However, the Israeli army allowed access only to medics as well as 1,600 civilians to harvest olive crops. | |
| JERUSALEM | Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. Wall Gates: Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish New Year in Dahiyat al Bareed, Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, west of the village of Al Jib, and in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna. | |

| RAMALLAH & EL BIREH | Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. The Israeli army continues to close the settler bypass road connecting 'Assur Hill in the village of Kafr Malik to Alon settler bypass road. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish New Year in the area west of the town of 'Abud as well as in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis. Raids/Confiscation of Property: At dawn on 12 September 2007, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Liqya, searched the offices of a charitable association, and confiscated 1 computer. At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of El Bireh. At 22:55, the Israeli army raided the town of Beituniya and patrolled the area until 23:25. At 00:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bir Zeit. |
| JENIN | Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. Flying Checkpoints/Detentions: (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Az Zababida and searched civilians and vehicles, and detained Mahmoud Sameedh Ghannam, a Palestinian security officer, claiming that he was in possession of a military uniform. (ii) At 12:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the town of Jaba', searched civilians and vehicles, and detained Mohammed Ni'man Mar'i. |

- The Israeli army continues to close the entrance to the village of Al (iii) Lubban ash Sharqiya with dirt barricades and cement blocks.
- **Checkpoints:** The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:
- At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jirzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only.
- Beit Furik checkpoint is open to civilian residents of the town of Beit (ii) Furik and the village of Beit Dajan until 17:30.

Beginning on 23 November 2006, the Israeli army continues to close (iii) the checkpoint set up in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and to prevent civilians from crossing, only allowing access to humanitarian cases.

Flying Checkpoint/Attack on Property: The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint along the unpaved detour road connecting the villages of Deir Sharaf and An Nagura, denied civilian access, detained a number of civilian vehicles, and took them to the settlement of Shavei Shomron.

Raids/Detentions/Attack:

- At 23:55, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Qalil and searched 1 (i) house, after detaining residents outside.
- The Israeli army raided the village of Qusin and opened indiscriminate (ii) fire, while patrolling the area.

At 19:45, Israeli troops positioned at Huwwara checkpoint arrested (i) Khaled Abdullah Hussein, a Palestinian National Security officer.

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60. Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish New Year in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of the settlement of Efrat; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja. Raids: At 08:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Harmala. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 14:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Beit Sahur and the town of Al 'Ubeidiya. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Beit Ta'mir and Dar Salah. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Al Khadr and searched civilians and vehicles. |
| HEBRON | Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. (ii) Although it expired on 07 May 2006, the Israeli army continues to implement a military order stipulating the prohibition of civilian vehicles from travelling along the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron unless they possess access permits. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the following locales: the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron; the junction to the area of Farsh al Hawa leading to Road # 35 northwest of the city of Hebron; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun; and the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa. The Israeli army also |

- continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron as well as the main entrance to Al 'Arrub refugee camp.
- (ii) In accordance with Military Order # 378, the Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Shalala Old Street that leads to the old city of Hebron, only allowing Israeli vehicles as well as Israeli army vehicles to travel along this street.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction was suspended for the Jewish New Year in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal, the remaining section of the Wall route that separates the settlement of Eshkolot from the village of Ar Ramadin, and near the village of Imneizil southeast of the town of Yatta.
- **Flying Checkpoints:** At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a number of flying checkpoints along settler bypass roads north and south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids/Detention:

- (i) At 11:30, the Israeli army raided the area of Bab az Zawiya in the city of Hebron, detained 1 civilian, and released him at a later time.
- (ii) At 12:00, and again at 03:00, the Israeli army the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, searched 1 house, and patrolled the area.
- (iii) At 12:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Kahil, patrolled the area, and took photographs of a number of houses.
- Arrest: At 09:00, the Israeli army arrested 15-year-old Ibrahim Naji 'Amr along Ash Shalala Street in the old city of Hebron, ostensibly for locating a knife in his possession.

• <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to humanitarian cases, after prior coordination.

• Raids/Air Patrol:

(i) At 19:00, Israeli Special Forces raided the area of Zindah northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya. An armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals.

(ii) In the evening on 12 September 2007, the Israeli army raided the area of Abu Safiya southeast of the town of Beit Hanun. An armed confrontation took place between the Israeli army and armed Palestinian individuals. Consequently, Israeli combat helicopters patrolled the area over the area.

• Palestinian Attacks/Israeli Attack/Injury:

(i) At 09:30, armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line east of the Eastern Cemetery east of the town of Jabalya. Consequently, Israeli troops opened intensive fire, injuring 1 armed Palestinian individual.
