JERUSALEM	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and has set up checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound.</li> <li><u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the eastern entrance to Dahiyat Bir Nabala northwest of the city of Jerusalem with cement blocks.</li> <li><u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Qalandiya and Beit Iksa checkpoints and to impede civilian access.</li> <li><u>Wall Gates</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.</li> <li><u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was resumed in Dahiyat al Aqbat, from the village of Hizma to 'Anata, along the Hizma-Jaba' road, the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, near Al Quds University, in the town of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya, from the village of Beit Surik to Biddu, in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina, around the settlement of Ma'ale Adumim, and west of the village of Al Jib.</li> <li><u>Flving Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to 'Atarot Industrial Zone in Dahiyat ar Ram and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul>

TULKAREM	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to impose a complete closure on the district of Tulkarem and to declare it a closed military zone following a suicide attack carried out on the junction to the village of Far'un. BETHLEHEM	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. The Israeli army considers the civilians' residence in the village illegal because they hold West Bank identity cards while their village is located within the Israeli-defined municipal boundaries of Jerusalem.</li> <li><u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close all roads to Road # 60 leading to the city of Jerusalem, thereby isolating the city of Bethlehem from its towns and villages located west of Road # 60.</li> <li><u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction was resumed north of 'Ayda refugee camp towards the area north of the city of Beit Jala and in the Everest area, northwest of the city of Beit Jala.</li> <li><u>Raids</u>: <ul> <li>(i) At 09:35, and again at 16:25 and at 02:50, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Bethlehem and patrolled the area.</li> <li>(ii) At 10:10, the Israeli army, including 2 jeeps, raided and patrolled the town of Al 'Ubeidiya until 13:00.</li> <li>(iii) At 15:50, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Beit Sahur and patrolled the area.</li> </ul> </li> <li>(iv) At 07:00, an Israeli army patrol raided the city of Beit Sahur and patrolled the area.</li> <li><u>Arrest</u>: At 15:10, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the "Container") checkpoint arrested Sa'eed Ali Zaqzouq.</li> <li><u>Settler Violence</u>: At 16:35, Israeli settlers threw stones at 2 civilians while they were tending sheep in the vicinity of the town of Tuqu'.</li> </ul>
HEBRON	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: <ul> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and barbed wire Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh and with an iron gate the old gold market, all in the H2 section of the city of Hebron, denying access to civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to implement a military order to close civilian commercial shops on both sides of the road connecting the settlement of Kiryat Arba' to the Ibrahimi Mosque in the old city of Hebron from 06 November 2005 until 07 May 2006. Civilian vehicles are prohibited from travelling along the road unless they possess access permits. ALL DISTRICTS	• Beginning on 16 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a complete closure on the Gaza Strip, ostensibly due to Palestinian individuals' firing of mortars towards the Green Line. The Israeli army has also prevented civilians from crossing the Green Line, only allowing access to 3,854 workers.

NORTHERN GAZA	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: Beginning at 18:00 on 28 December 2005, the Israeli army has continued to impose a buffer zone (through open fire as well as artillery and air attacks) in the area near the Green Line, including the area of the debris of evacuated settlements, in the district of Northern Gaza. The Israeli army has also warned that civilians would put their lives in danger if they enter the designated area.</li> <li><u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to foreigners, VIPs, and humanitarian cases.</li> <li><u>Attack</u>: At 10:30, the Israeli army opened fire from Point 23 on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory north of Beit Hanun Industrial Zone.</li> </ul>

WORK PERMITS	<ul> <li><u>West Bank</u>: The Israeli authorities renewed 6,894 work permits for crossing the Green Line. However, the number of permit-holding workers who were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line is unknown.</li> <li><u>Gaza Strip</u>: The Israeli authorities renewed 5,167 work permits for crossing the Green Line. However, only 3,854 workers (approximately 75% of those possessing work permits) were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line.</li> </ul>
