ALL DISTRICTS	• The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints set up on the main roads connecting the West Bank districts, thereby isolating the northern districts from the southern districts as well as the Jericho district and the Jordan Valley from the remainder of the West Bank.
JERUSALEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and prevent civilians from accessing the mosque, only allowing access to female civilians and civilians holding Israeli-issued IDs who are above 45 years of age. This Israeli measure aims to prevent civilian demonstrations against the Israeli army's levelling of Bab al Maghariba old road, which leads to Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrance opposite the junction to Dahiyat al Bareed in the city of Jerusalem with a barbed wire gate and to deny civilian access. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the road connecting Dahiyat al Bareed to the town of Ar Ram in order to complete Wall construction in the area. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the village of Jaba', which connects the village to the cities of Jerusalem, Ramallah, and Jericho. Checkpoints:

	 <u>Raids/Attack/Injury:</u> At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured Basem Jabr Wreidat, a university student. Wreidat was transported to an Israeli hospital for medical treatment. An Israeli army patrol raided the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and Ash Sheikh Sa'd and patrolled the area. The Israeli army raided the village of Um al Lahm and demolished 1 house, claiming that it was built without the required construction licence. <u>House Demolition</u>: The Israeli army demolished 1 house belonging to Fayez Mohammed Shamasneh in the village of Um al Lahm.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the eastern entrance to the village of Sinjil. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the western entrance to the village of Saffa. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and to impede civilian access. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area west of the town of 'Abud, in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin, Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis, and in the town of Beituniya. <u>Flving Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Sinjil and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Raids/Detentions</u>: (i) At 00:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the villages of Qarawat Bani Zeid and Mazari' an Nubani. (ii) At 03:00, the Israeli army, including 24 jeeps, raided the city of El Bireh and Qaddura refugee camp and searched 1 building and 1 house. The Israeli army also arrested 1 civilian in the refugee camp. At 04:45, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
JENIN	 <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the unpaved detour road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan as well as the road connecting the town of Qabatiya to the village of Misliya. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas, denying civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley, except for civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence is the Northern Jordan Valley. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.

The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus as well as on the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah.

ALL DISTRICTS	• The ceasefire agreement that entered into force at 06:00 on 26 November 2006 remains effective. However, the Israeli army and navy opened fire towards Palestinian territory on 5 occasions. The Israeli army also carried 1 raid into Palestinian territory, during which it levelled land. In addition, armed Palestinian individuals fired 3 mortars towards the Green Line, of which 2 mortars landed on Palestinian territory.
NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to foreign nationals, humanitarian cases, and VIPs. <u>Attacks</u>: At 11:20, in violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, Israeli navy boats opened fire towards the beach of the town of Beit Lahiya. At 00:30, Israeli navy boats fired 2 shells towards the area. <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: At 16:50, in an attempt to violate the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, armed Palestinian individuals fired 2 unidentified mortars towards the Green Line, but they landed on Palestinian territory.
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: At 07:00, armed Palestinian individuals fired 1 unidentified mortar towards the Green Line, thereby violating the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement.
CENTRAL GAZA	• <u>Raid/Attack/Land Levelling</u> : At 11:00, in violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, the Israeli army, including 2 armoured vehicles and 2 bulldozers, raided 1 kilometre into Palestinian territory near Points 119 and 124 on the Green Line east of Al Bureij and Al Maghazi refugee camps, opened intensive fire towards civilian houses, and levelled land. At 03:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

KHAN YUNIS	• <u>Attack</u> : In violation of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire agreement, the Israeli army opened fire from the area near Point 147 on the Green Line towards civilian houses east of the area of Al Qarara.

WORK PERMITS	 <u>West Bank</u>: The Israeli authorities renewed 6,148 work permits for crossing the Green Line. However, the number of permit-holding workers who were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line is unknown. <u>Gaza Strip</u>: Valid work permits that have been issued by the Israeli authorities for crossing the Green Line total 9. All the Palestinian workers possessing the valid work permits (9) were allowed to access areas inside the Green Line.
