JERUSALEM	 <u>Closure:</u> On 30 April 2010, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and set up several flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound. Excluding those holding Israeli-issued ID cards, the Israeli army denied access to civilians to perform Friday prayers at the mosque. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli artny denied access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram. Checkpoints: (ii) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem. IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. (iii) At 15:00, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at Jaba' checkpoint an dhe road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp. 	(iv) At 00:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Beit Rima and Deir Ghassana.
	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
	 <u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. <u>Raids/Air Patrols</u>: At 15:30, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and combat the area between the villages of Al Hashimiya and Kafr Qud. At 17:00, Israeli troops withdrew from the area.
JENIN	 (ii) At 22:15, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and patrolled the area between the town of Jaba' and the village of Yasid. At 23:30, Israeli troops withdrew from the area. (iii) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabatiya, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian. <u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested 'Ammar Naji Kamil in the town of Qabtiya. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions
	of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. <u>Raid</u>: At 04:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Bardala and searched 2 houses.
TULKAREM	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. <u>Raid</u>: At 00:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and Nur Shams refugee camp, searched a number of houses and commercial premises, and arrested 3 civilians, including a father and son. At 04:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.

	• <u>Arrests</u> : The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the city of Jenin:
	 Arrests. The Israen anny arested 5 civilians in the city of Jenn. Sami as Safarini; Nabil Abdul Fattah Hammoudah; and 'Imad Nabil Abdul Fattah Hammoudah. Demonstration: At 14:00, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Tulkarem in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Protestors demanded that all prisoners be released from Israeli prisons. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: At 08:45, and again at 17:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of 'Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of An Nabi Elyas on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:25, and again at 21:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 21:20, the Israeli army raided the village of An Nabi Elyas, occupied the roofs of 2 houses, and converted them into military posts. The Israeli army remains positioned in the village of as 08:00 this morning. (ii) At 01:25, the Israeli army raided and combat an area near the town of 'Azzun. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

	 (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. <u>Raids:</u> (i) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Qabalan, searched a
	 number of houses, and arrested 3 civilians. (ii) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus as well as Balata and 'Ein Beit el Ma' refugee camps and patrolled these areas until 05:55. Arrests:
	 Arrests: (i) At 02:00 on 05 May 2010, the Israeli army arrested Sameh Mohammed Ali Qadous during its raid into the village of Burin, in addition to those reported yesterday. The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the town of Qabalan:
	 (ii) 'Isam Fahmi Az'ar; (iii) Majdi Abdul 'Atheem at Tabash; and (iv) Jihad Saleh Hamed.
	• <u>Settler Violence</u> : At 23:50, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along the Nablus-Jericho main road, injuring Sameer Abdullah Darwish al 'Aqqad in the shoulder. Consequently, Al 'Aqqad was transported to hospital for medical treatment.
	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.
SALFIT	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.
	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 01:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at
	the entrance to the town of Bruqin and searched civilians and vehicles.<u>Raids</u>:
	 (i) At 21:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Bruqin, searched 2 houses, and withdrew at 23:30. (ii) At 00:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Deir Istiya and patrolled
	 the area until 01:30. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north
	of the settlement of Ariel.

JERICHO	 <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. <u>Checkpoints</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Arrest</u>: At 19:45, Israeli troops positioned at Al Hamra checkpoint arrested Ali Hasan Mahmoud Tayeh.
BETHLEHEM	 <u>Closure:</u> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. <u>Flving Checkpoint</u>: At 07:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the tunnel leading to the town of Al Khadr on the road to the Al 'Arqub villages in the western Bethlehem district. Israeli troops searched civilians and vehicles and detained Rateb Hasan 'Uweineh, a Palestinian National Security officer. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At 10:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. (ii) At 01:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Tuqu' and arrested 3 civilians, including 1 child. <u>Arrests</u>: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the town of Tuqu': (ii) Ahmed Ali Sabbah; and (ii) Muneer Jamal Sabbah.

	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the
	town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi
	Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
	<u>Closure:</u>
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city
	of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement
	blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area

	the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.

GAZA STRIP

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. <u>Violation of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property in the districts of Northern Gaza and Khan Yunis. The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory in the district of Northern Gaza.
NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. <u>Attack</u>: In the morning of 05 May 2010, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards a number of workers and farmers northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya. <u>Raid/Attack</u>: At dawn on 04 May 2010, the Israeli army raided Palestinian territory northwest of the town of Beit Lahiya and opened intensive fire towards agricultural land and civilian houses.
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and animal feed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.

CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	• <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling</u> : At noon on 05 May 2010, the Israeli army, including several armoured vehicles and bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided Palestinian territory east of the area of Al Farahin. The Israeli army opened intensive fire and levelled land cultivated with wheat and malt crops.
RAFAH	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow access to 167 civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. A Kuwaiti parliamentary delegation was allowed to leave the Gaza Strip throughout the Crossing. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
