DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• <u>Closure</u>:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Agsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00, claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.

JERUSALEM

RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. Settler Violence: At 21:00, a group of Israeli settlers gathered near the 'Uyun al Haramiya junction, closed the Ramallah-Nablus main road, and denied civilian access. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Raid: At 20:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Nazlat Zeid. Detention: At 13:45, the Israeli army detained Mohammed Ziyad Salah, a 17-year-old resident of Al Far'a refugee camp, while he was reporting to the Israeli Intelligence agency in Salem Military Camp. At 16:00, the Israeli army released Salah. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. At 19:30, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at 20:15. Flying Checkpoint: At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Al 'Aqaba and searched civilians and vehicles until 21:00.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces: (i) At 09:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Anabta. (ii) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Kafr Zibad, took position near the village's Palestinian Police station, and patrolled the area.

	• <u>Wall Gates</u> : The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun			
	'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector.			
	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira,			
	Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.			
	• Closure of Main Roads:			
	(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit			
	Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al

	(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western

NABLUS	• <u>Checkpoints</u> : The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing			
	checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:			
	(i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed			
	on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only			
	between 07:00 and 02:00.			
	(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross			
	between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays.			
	All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but			
	only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city			
	through the checkpoint.			

	 Raids: At 10:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Badhan. At 02:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and the village of Beit Wazan and patrolled these areas until 04:40. Arrests: At 02:00 on 06 May 2010, the Israeli army arrested 3 civilians during its raid into the town of Qabalan, in addition to those reported yesterday: Ibrahim Hamed Qasem 'Aabed; Badr Salah Aqra'; and Ahmed Saleh Ahmed Az'ar.
	Closure of Main Roads:
	 (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.
SALFIT	• Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and
	 impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Attack: At 00:30, the Israeli army fired flares over the settler bypass road near the town of Kafr ad Dik.
	Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.
	Checkpoints: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.
JERICHO	(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.
	 Raids: At 11:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Marj Na'ja. At 21:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Fasayil. At 00:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Jericho, searched a number of houses, and served summonses to 2 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 01:40, the Israeli army raided the village of Al 'Auja and searched a number of houses.

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Bag'a.

• Raids:

- (i) At 12:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Husan.
- (ii) At 14:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur.
- (iii) At 15:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Al Khadr.
- <u>Demonstration/Attack/Injuries</u>: At 09:25, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Walaja in protest against levelling olive groves for completion of Wall construction. Subsequently, the Israeli army raided the village and fired rubber-coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades, injuring 4 civilians. A number of participants also sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation. The Israeli army also arrested 3 civilians, including 2 brothers.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 3 civilians in the village of Al Walaja:
- (i) Mazen Qamhiyyeh;
- (ii) Dhiya' Hasan Hamdan; and
- (iii) Nafeth Hasan Hamdan.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

• Closure:

(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.

(ii) Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

BETHLEHEM

HEBRON

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- Attack: At 19:00, Israeli troops positioned in the area surrounding the settlement of Karmei Tzur fired rubber-coated steel bullets and tear gas grenades towards civilians, while they were present on their land.

• Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Al Fawwar refugee camp and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.

• Raids:

- (i) At 08:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Beit Ula and Tarqumiya.
- (ii) At 09:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. at 17:30, the Israeli army raided the city again, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the city for the third time and arrested 2 civilians.
- (iii) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Kahil.
- (iv) At 11:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Kharsa.
- (v) At 14:50, and again at 01:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (vi) At 22:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Ummar and patrolled the area until 23:00.
- Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Hebron:
- (i) Jamal Nasser al Masri; and
- (ii) Mohammed Abdul Karim al Qawameh.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the **ALL DISTRICTS** ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property in the district of Gaza. The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory in the district of Khan Yunis. **NORTHERN** Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. **GAZA Closure of Crossing Points**: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (i) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January (ii) 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision. **GAZA** Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling: At noon on 06 May 2010, the Israeli army, including 8 armoured vehicles and 3 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft, raided 200 metres into Palestinian territory east of the area of Juhor ad Dik. While levelling agricultural land, the Israeli army opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property. CENTRAL Activities not reported. **GAZA** Attack: At dawn on 06 May 2010, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards agricultural land east of the **KHAN YUNIS** town of Khuza'a. **Closure of Crossing Points:** (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is open on an exceptional basis to allow (ii) access to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at **RAFAH** Egyptian hospitals. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for (iv) transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for

the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.

GENERAL

POLITICAL PRISONERS

• <u>Sentence</u>: The Israeli military court at Salem Military Camp sentenced Ala' ad Din Ghuneim, a resident of the city of Nablus, to 2 life imprisonments.
