JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareded from the town of Ar Ram. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem. • Raids: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army raided Shu'fat refugee camp and surrounding areas in the city of Jerusalem, searched many civilian houses and commercial premises, and withdrew at 14:00. (ii) At 06:10, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Anata, searched several commercial premises, and arrested 7 civilians. • Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 7 unidentified civilians in the town of 'Anata. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAMALLAH & EL BIREH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. • Flying Checkpoint: At 14:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Beitillu and denied civilian access to and from the village until 15:00. • Attack: At 22:40, the Israeli army opened fire and fired flares near the village of Rafat. • Raids/Air Patrol/Detentions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:35, the Israeli army raided the town of Ni'lin. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. (ii) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Deir 'Ammar. (iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided the village of 'Ein Yabrud, searched an internet cafe, and withdrew at 21:00. (iv) At 22:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Sinjil. Confrontations took place between civilians and the Israeli army, while it was patrolling the area. (v) At 24:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Turmus'ayya. (vi) At 02:30, Israeli troops, dispatched 4 combat helicopters, raided Al Jalazun refugee camp, searched a number of houses, detained 6 civilians, and arrested 20 others, including 14 children. JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. • Raids/Detentions/Confiscation of Property/Air Patrol: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Birqin. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Jenin. (iii) At 13:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Jalqamus. (iv) At 16:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Al Khuljan northwest of the town of Ya'bad, set up a number of checkpoints at its entrances, and denied civilian access to and from the village. The Israeli army also searched a house belonging to Mahmoud Yousef al Khatib, a Palestinian Police officer who had stabbed an Israeli soldier at the Za'tara junction checkpoint in the district of Salfit. Israeli troops detained and interrogated Al Khatib's family members, confiscated 1 personal computer and 3 cellular telephones, and arrested 2 civilians (brothers). (v) At 16:30, the Israeli army raided the village of Rummana. While patrolling the area, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. The Israeli army arrested a child, ostensibly for throwing stones. (vi) At 22:10, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and combed the area between the towns of Ya'bad and 'Arraba. (vii) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of 'Arrana. • Arrests: The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of Al Khuljan northwest of the town of Ya'bad: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) 'Atef 'Uqab al Khatib; and (ii) Mohammed 'Uqab al Khatib. (iii) The Israeli army arrested 13-year-old Zuheir Rashed Zuheir al Ahmed in the village of Rummana. • Destruction of Property: On 07 February 2010, the Israeli army delivered a notice for the demolition of a mosque under construction in the village of Imreiha southwest of the town of Ya'bad, claiming that it was being built without the required construction licence. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas. • Raid/Air Patrol: At 22:00, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and combed the area between the villages of Al Far'a and Siris.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Flying Checkpoint: At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Kafriyat road connecting the districts of Tulkarem and Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. • Raids/Confiscation of Property: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bal'a and Dahiyat Shuweika in the city of Tulkarem. (ii) At 10:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem, arrested 1 civilian, and served summons to 2 others to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 20:10, the Israeli army raided the city again and patrolled the area. (iii) At 20:15, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Anabta, searched 1 house, and confiscated a personal computer. (iv) At 00:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Bal'a. • Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Mahmoud Khalil Yousef 'Awwad in the city of Tulkarem. • Detention: At 18:00, Israeli troops positioned at the Wall gate near the town of Deir al Ghusun detained Ahmed Zuhdi Abdul Rahman Khalil and released him at a later time. • Construction of Property: At 18:00, the Israeli army erected a military watchtower on the Ar Rabee' Mountain, which overlooks the settler bypass road south of the village of Shufa. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 08:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 09:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Habla tunnel south of the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Immatin and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<p>(v) At 19:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attack: At 20:30, Israeli troops guarding the Wall section south of the city of Qalqiliya opened indiscriminate fire and fired flares over the area. • Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces/Detentions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Hajja. (ii) At 15:35, the Israeli army raided the town of ‘Azzun, set up a checkpoint near a Palestinian National Security post, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area. At 18:15, and again at 00:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town again. (iii) At 18:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Jinsafut, set a checkpoint in the centre of the village, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also raided a gym, detained civilians inside, and released them at a later time. • Wall Gate: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of ‘Aqraba to the village of Osarin. • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At ‘Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. • Flying Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:00, the Israeli army set up 2 flying checkpoints, one on the main road in the town of Huwwara and the other on the junction to the settlement of Yitzhar, and searched civilians and vehicles.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> (ii) At 10:00, and again at 19:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the village of Deir Sharaf and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of 'Einabus and searched civilians and vehicles. (iv) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Jamma'in and the village of 'Urif and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids/Air Patrol:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of 'Asira al Qibliya. (ii) At 22:20, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided and combed the area between the villages of Al Badhan and Talluza. (iii) At 22:30, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus, set up a military post on roof of the Al Hajj Ma'zouz al Masri Girls School, and provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers, who visited Prophet Joseph's Shrine. • <u>Construction of Military Post:</u> At 15:40, the Israeli army erected a military watchtower in the military post on At Tur Mountain in the city of Nablus. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:30, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at a house belonging to Ayman Soufan in the village of 'Iraq Burin. (ii) At 21:00, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones a house belonging to Harbi Mustafa 'Umran in the village of Burin.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. • <u>Checkpoint:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 14:30, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint after it had arrested a Palestinian Police officer, who had stabbed and killed an Israeli soldier. At 15:20, the Israeli army reopened the checkpoint. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Kifl Haris and the village of Haris and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Deir Ballut and searched civilians and vehicles. • <u>Arrest:</u> Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Mahmoud Yousef Nimer al Khatib, a Palestinian Police officer. • <u>Settler Violence:</u> At 20:40, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement Kfar Tappuah threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling near the entrance to the settlement.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. At 10:00, the Israeli army installed an iron gate on the road. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. • Flying Checkpoint: At 01:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the main in the centre of the village of Al 'Auja and searched civilians and vehicles. • Demonstration: At 11:30, families of political prisoners held a sit-in demonstration in front of offices of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in the city of Jericho in solidarity with their relative prisoners. Protestors demanded that political prisoners be released from Israeli prisons.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. • Raids/Land Levelling: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 15:15, the Israeli army, including a bulldozer, raided the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur and levelled land. (ii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Tuqu'. At 23:00, the Israeli army raided the town again and served a summons to Khalaf 'Isa Abu Mifreh to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.

	<p>(iii) At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Beit Jala.</p> <p>(iv) At 02:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Bethlehem, searched 2 houses, and arrested 2 civilians, including a child.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <p>(i) At 23:00, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint arrested Yaseen Omar Banat.</p> <p>The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the city of Bethlehem:</p> <p>(ii) Omar Jalal Khalil Shalash, 16 years old; and</p> <p>(iii) Mahmoud Jamal Mustafa Masalmeh.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
<p style="text-align: center;">HEBRON</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.</p> <p>(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.</p> <p>(ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.</p> <p>(iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <p>(i) At 10:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the area of Al Fahs south of the city of Hebron and searched civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(ii) At 16:00, the Israeli army set up flying checkpoints at all entrances to the old city of Hebron, denied civilian access to and from the area, and arrested 1 civilian.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Attack:</u> At 13:00, Israeli troops positioned near the settlement of Karmeit Zzur south of the town of Beit Ummar fired sound and tear gas grenades towards a number of civilians and international peace activists, while they were planting olive seedlings on civilian land under the threat of confiscation near the settlement. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:20, and again at 14:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron. (ii) At 10:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Dura. (iii) At 13:20, the Israeli army raided the town of Idhna, searched 1 house, and withdrew at 14:00. (iv) At 02:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ummar. (v) At 02:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Yatta and patrolled the area until 02:15. (vi) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of As Samoa’. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. • <u>Violations of the Ceasefire:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory, opened intensive fire, and fired a number of tank shells towards civilian houses and property in the districts of Gaza and Central Gaza. The Israeli army also opened fire intensively from its location on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory in the district of Rafah. An Israeli UAV fired 1 missile towards armed Palestinian individuals in the district of Gaza. Israeli attacks resulted in killing of 1 armed Palestinian individual and injury of 1 armed individual as well as 2 female children. (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals opened fire and fired 3 anti-tank mortars towards the Israeli army near the Green Line.
