#### **WEST BANK**

## • Closure:

- (i) On 11 December 2009, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound, and denied access to civilians to perform Friday prayers at the mosque.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

#### • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- Raid: At 19:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Ar Rama.
- <u>Demonstration/Attack/Physical Assaults/Detentions</u>: At 16:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in Ash Sheikh Jarrah neighbourhood in the city of Jerusalem in protest against Israeli settlers' seizure of civilian houses under protection of the Israeli army. Consequently, Israeli troops fired tear gas and sound grenades and beat a number of participants with clubs. Israeli troops also detained several protestors, including international peace activists.

## • Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

  (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city
  - Flying Checkpoints: At 08:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles.
  - Raid: At 14:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Sabastiya.

## • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.
- <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint/Physical Assaults</u>: At 09:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the village of Yasuf, searched civilians and vehicles, and severely beat 2 civilians, leaving them with contusions. Of these, a civilian fell unconscious and was transported to hospital for medical attention.
- Raid: At 09:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Yasuf. Meantime, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 10:10, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- <u>Arrest</u>: At 07:50, Israeli troops positioned at the Za'tara junction checkpoint arrested Anas Yaseen Ramadhan, a Palestinian National Security officer.

## • Settler Violence:

- (i) At 14:00, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to and made a tour on agricultural land in the town of Bruqin.
- (ii) At 14:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement Emanuel severely beat Ra'fat 'Imad Abdul Majeed Thiyab, a 13-year-old from the town of Deir Istiya, leaving him with contusions.
- <u>Demonstration/Raid/Attack</u>: At 13:00, a mass demonstration took place in the village of Yasuf in protest against a setting fire to the village's mosque and writing of anti-Arab slogans by Israeli settlers. Consequently, the Israeli army raided the village. Confrontations also took place between the Israeli army and civilians, during which the Israeli army injured 1 civilian. In addition, a number of civilians sustained injuries as a result of tear gas inhalation.

## • Raids:

- (i) At 08:05, the Israeli army raided the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur, provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers, and withdrew at 12:10.
- (ii) At 17:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Deir az Zir.
- <u>Detentions</u>: At 23:05, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a bus transporting 10 female civilians and released them after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).
- <u>Demonstration/Physical Assaults/Detention</u>: At 12:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Ma'sara against Wall construction. Having denied participants' access to the Wall construction site, Israeli troops severely beat protestors with clubs and rifle butts, leaving 2 civilians with injuries and contusions.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

## • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

## • Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.

#### **HEBRON**

## • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 09:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Fawwar junction and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 11:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the town of As Samoa' and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:20, the Israeli army set up another flying checkpoint and arrested 1 civilian.
- (iv) At 15:45, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Beit 'Einun and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (v) At 23:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of At Tabaqa and searched civilians and vehicles.
- <u>Physical Assaults</u>: At 18:00, Israeli troops severely beat 4 civilians, forced them to stand against a wall along Ash Shalala Street in the old city of Hebron, and released them at a later time.

#### • Attacks:

- (i) At 16:00, Israeli troops positioned on the military watchtower erected near Al 'Arrub refugee camp opened fire and fired tear gas grenades towards civilians at the entrance to the refugee camp.
- (ii) At 19:20, the Israeli army fired sound grenades towards a number of civilians near Tariq Bin Ziyad School in the old city of Hebron.

#### Raids:

- (i) At 09:30, the Israeli army raided the town of As Samoa', provided protection to a group of Israeli settlers, and withdrew at 11:00.
- (ii) At 16:50, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron, set up a checkpoint, searched civilians and vehicles, and patrolled the area.
- (iii) At 22:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Idhna.
- (iv) At 23:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Halhul.
- <u>Arrest</u>: Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up in the area between the towns of Tarqumiya and Idhna arrested Mohammed Ibrahim Abu Juheisheh.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

• At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt.
