# WEST BANK

Closure/Air Patrol:  (i) On 16 October 2009, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem, set up several flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Agaa Mosque compound, and denied access to civilians to perform Friday prayers at the mosque.  (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).  (ii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.  • Closure of Main Roads:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.  (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.  • Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.  • Wall Gates:  (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya.

	<ul> <li>Settler Violence: At 13:20, a group of Israeli settlers gained access to the area of 'Ein Samiya east of the village of Kafr Malik. Following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO), the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.</li> <li>Demonstrations/Attacks/Injuries:         <ul> <li>At 13:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Bil'in against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured 2 civilian participants and 1 journalist. A number of participants also sustained wounds as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>At 13:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the town of Ni'lin against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors, during which the Israeli army injured a number of participants as a result of tear gas inhalation.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of 'Abud town and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
JENIN	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.</li> <li>Flving Checkpoints: <ul> <li>At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Zububa and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>At 19:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Ti'innik and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Settler Violence/Destruction of Property: At 12:35, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to olive and forest trees on approximately 200 dunums (49.421 acres) of civilian land located behind the Wall north of the town of Ya'bad. As a result, many trees were destroyed.</li> <li>Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
TUBAS	<ul> <li>Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.</li> <li>Raid: At 11:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al Far'a.</li> </ul>

QALQILYA	<ul> <li>Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>Flving Checkpoints: <ol> <li>At 10:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the village of Jinsafut on the Qalqiliya-Nablus main road and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Physical Assault/Injury: At 22:00, Israeli troops guarding the Wall section west of the village of 'Azzun 'Atma severely beat Ahmed Isma'il Mahmoud I'mar, claiming that he had attempted to gain access to Israel for work. I'mar sustained bone fractures in the leg as well as contusion. Consequently, he was transported to hospital for medical treatment.</li> <li>Raid: At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the town of 'Azzun and searched a number of houses.</li> <li>Wall Gates: <ol> <li>Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfe Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the southern entrances to the villages of Qaryut and Duma; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh.</li> <li>Beginning at 12:10 on 27 August 2009, the Israeli army has continued to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. It should be noted that the Israeli army had removed the dirt barricade set up at the entrance to the village.</li> <li>Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:</li> </ol> </li></ul>

	<ul> <li>(i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.</li> <li>(ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Flying Checkpoint: At 12:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Settler Violence: At 12:00, a group of Israeli settlers from the settlement of Bracha threw stones at a number of civilians while they were harvesting olive crops on their land in the village of Burin. Civilians' land is located near the settlement of Bracha.</li> </ul>
SALFIT	<ul> <li>Closure of Main Roads: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.</li> <li>Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 14:40, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at a later time.</li> <li>Raid: At 00:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Yasuf and patrolled the area until 00:50.</li> <li>Provocation of Palestinian Forces: At 10:15, Israeli troops positioned at Za'tara checkpoint detained a Palestinian National Security vehicle along with 3 officers. Following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO), the vehicle was allowed to cross at 12:30.</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.</li> </ol> </li></ul>
JERICHO	<ul> <li>Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.</li> <li>Checkpoints:         <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.

## • Flying Checkpoints:

- (i) At 11:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of 'Ein ad Duyuk and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 14:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Mu'arrajat road connecting the districts of Jericho and Ramallah and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (iii) At 22:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the Dead Sea and searched civilians and vehicles.
- Raid: At 10:55, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Al 'Auja.

#### Closure

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.
- (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 *dunums* (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.
- <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 18:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles until 19:35.

#### Raids:

- (i) At 09:50, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles.
- (ii) At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Ash Shawawra, searched 1 house, and served a summons to Ghaleb Ahmed Shawawra to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. At 00:40, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 09:10, a group of Israeli settlers protected by Israeli troops gained access into the evacuated military post of 'Ush Ghurab east of the city of Beit Sahur and withdrew at 12:15.

#### • Demonstrations/Physical Assaults/Injuries:

(i) At 11:30, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Walaja in protest against land confiscation for construction of Israeli settlement projects.

#### **BETHLEHEM**

- (ii) At 12:00, a mass demonstration, including international peace activists, took place in the village of Al Ma'sara against Wall construction. Having access to the Wall construction site denied, Israeli troops severely beat protestors with clubs and rifle butts, leaving 3 participants with injuries and contusions.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

## • Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
- (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction.

#### Closure of Main Roads:

# **HEBRON**

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the area of Al Hawawir leading to the town of Halhul; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- <u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 17:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area of Wadi ash Sharq near the town of Sa'ir and searched civilians and vehicles.

#### • Raids:

- (i) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Hebron.
- (ii) At 15:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ummar
- (iii) At 18:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Ula.

• <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

#### **GAZA STRIP**

## At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. ALL **Violations** of the Ceasefire: **DISTRICTS** (i) The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its locations on the Green Line towards Palestinian territory in the district of Northern Gaza. Israeli navy boats also opened fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the districts of Northern Gaza, Gaza, and Central Gaza. Armed Palestinian individuals opened fire towards Israeli troops (ii) positioned on the Green Line.

# Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is closed. Attack: In the morning of 16 October 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the As Sudaniya **NORTHERN** beach west of the town of Beit Lahiya. Palestinian Attack/Israeli Attack: At 14:10, armed Palestinian individuals GAZA opened fire towards Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line east of the town of Jabalya. Consequently, Israeli troops opened fire intensively towards Palestinian territory. **Closure of Crossing Points:** Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. (i) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. (ii) **GAZA** Attack: In the morning of 16 October 2009, Israeli navy boats opened intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the Gaza city's beach. Attack: In the morning of 16 October 2009, Israeli navy boats opened **CENTRAL** intensive fire towards Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the beach of An **GAZA** Nusseirat refugee camp north of the city of Deir al Balah.
