JERUSALEM	<ul> <li>Closure: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to AI Aqsa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li>Closure of Main Roads:</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.</li> <li>Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to close possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.</li> <li>Raid/Detentions/Attack on Property: At 20:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Abu Dis and searched a number of houses after detaining residents outside. RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	<ul> <li><u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya.</li> <li><u>Raids/Provocation of Palestinian Forces</u>: <ul> <li>(i) At 09:20, the Israeli army raided the village of Surda and patrolled the area until 10:50.</li> <li>(ii) At 20:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Khirbet Abu Falah, took position near the village's Palestinian Police station, and patrolled the area.</li> <li>(iii) At 23:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Rima.</li> <li>(iv) At 00:25, the Israeli army raided the town of Bir Zeit and arrested 1 civilian.</li> <li>(v) At 03:00, the Israeli army raided Al Jalazun refugee camp, searched 1 house, and arrested 1 civilian.</li> </ul> </li> <li><u>Arrests/Physical Assault/Injury</u>: <ul> <li>(i) At 13:05, Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up near the junction to the 'Ofar military camp arrested Ziyad 'Amr Yousef. Claiming that he had attempted to stab a soldier, Israeli troops also severely beat and injured Yousef.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army arrested Fu'ad Mohammed Washahah in the town of Bir Zeit.</li> </ul> </li> <li>(iii) The Israeli army arrested Mohammed Tayseer Zeid in Al Jalazun refugee camp.</li> </ul>
JENIN	<ul> <li><u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan.</li> <li><u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.</li> </ul>
TUBAS	<ul> <li><u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas. At 09:30, Israeli troops thoroughly searched civilians while they were crossing the checkpoint.</li> <li><u>Raids</u>:         <ul> <li>(i) At 12:20, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Beit Lid.</li> <li>(ii) At 14:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Anabta. At 02:30, the Israeli army raided the town again and arrested 1 civilian.</li> <li><u>Arrest</u>: The Israeli army arrested Marwan Ahmed Abdul Dayem in the town of 'Anabta.</li> </ul> </li> <li><u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.</li> </ul>
QALQILYA	<ul> <li><u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li><u>Flving Checkpoints</u>:         <ul> <li>At 10:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the village of Al Funduq and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(i) At 10:35, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the eastern entrance to the city of Qalqiliya and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(ii) At 15:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Jinsafut and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>(iii) At 09:35, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Azzun.</li> <li>(ii) At 00:10, the Israeli army raided the city of Qalqiliya and searched 1 house.</li> <li><u>Detention</u>: At 11:00, Israeli troops positioned at the Wall gate leading to the village of Ras 'Atiya detained Amjad 'Odeh, a Palestinian National Security officer, and released him at 11:20 after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).</li> <li><u>Wall Gate</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector.</li> <li><u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
NABLUS	<ul> <li><u>Closure of Main Roads</u>:         <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul> <li><u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:         <ol> <li>At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.</li> <li>At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint.</li> <li><u>Flving Checkpoints</u>:</li></ol></li></ul>
SALFIT	<ul> <li>station and a grocery shop near the junction to the village of Qusra, claiming that they had been built without the required construction licences.</li> <li>Closure of Main Roads: <ol> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit.</li> <li>The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik.</li> <li>Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint.</li> <li>Flving Checkpoint: At 20:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the town of Kifl Haris and the village of Haris and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> <li>Raids: </li> <li>At 10:40, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Az Zawiya.</li> <li>At 00:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Salfit and patrolled the area until 01:30.</li> </ol></li></ul>

	<ul> <li><u>Settler Violence</u>: At 10:45, two armed Israeli settlers from the settlement of Tappuah provoked civilians and obstructed access to civilian vehicles along the main road near the entrance to the settlement.</li> <li><u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.</li> </ul>
JERICHO	<ul> <li><u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.</li> <li><u>Checkpoints</u>:         <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00.</li> <li>(ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits.</li> <li><u>Flying Checkpoints/Detentions</u>:</li></ul></li></ul>

The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T.</li> <li><u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar.</li> <li><u>Flying Checkpoint</u>: At 08:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>Physical Assaults: At 01:00, Israeli troops positioned in the area surrounding Bilal Bin Rabah Mosque (Rachel's Tomb) north of the city of Bethlehem severely beat 5 civilians, including a child, leaving them with contusions. As a result, all affected civilians were admitted to hospital for medical treatment.</li> <li>Raid: At 22:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Husan.</li> <li>Detention: At 01:25, Israeli troops positioned at the As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained Mahmoud Khadher Ja'far, claiming that he held a Gaza-issued ID card. Following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO), Israeli troops positioned at the As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a Palestinian Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint detained a Palestinian Police officer riding a motorcycle and allowed access to him after coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO).</li> <li>Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.</li> </ul>
HEBRON	<ul> <li>Closure: <ul> <li>(i) The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.</li> <li>(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area.
