DISTRICT EVENTS

WEST BANK

• Closure:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem and to set up flying checkpoints in the old city of Jerusalem and around Al Aqsa Mosque compound.
- (i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due to its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

• Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt barricades the entrance to the village of Jaba'.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the iron gate along the Wall section, separating the area of Dahiyat al Bareed from the town of Ar Ram.

• Checkpoints:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to consider Qalandiya checkpoint a "border crossing point" and has designated a special crossing for holders of Jerusalem IDs and those possessing permits to access the city of Jerusalem.
- (ii) Beginning on 11 April 2010, the Israeli army has continued to close the checkpoint set up near the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp in the city of Jerusalem and to deny civilian access between 23:00 and 05:00. Claiming to be carrying out infrastructure works between the checkpoint and the road leading to Shu'fat refugee camp, the checkpoint will be closed for two and a half weeks.
- Raid/Detentions: On 26 April 2010, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit Iksa and detained and interrogated a number of civilians. The Israeli army also took photographs of several coffee shops.
- <u>Settler Violence</u>: At 19:00, a group of Israeli settlers attempted to seize control of a house in the village of Beit Safafa. Civilians confronted settlers.

• Wall Gates:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close the Wall gate in the town of Abu Dis with cement blocks.
- (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Ash Shayyah road in the area between the villages of As Sawahira ash Sharqiya and As Sawahira al Gharbiya, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

JERUSALEM

	Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat refugee camp.
RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. On 15 March 2010, the Israeli army issued a military order, providing that the area located between civilian houses and the Wall in the town of Ni'lin and the village of Bil'in would be a closed military zone between 08:00 and 20:00 on Fridays for a period of 6 months. To prevent weekly demonstrations against Wall construction, civilian access to the area will be denied except with a special permit. Raid: At 19:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Beit Rima and delivered a notice for the demolition of a commercial premise. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues west of the town of 'Abud; in the village of Bil'in; and in the areas of Al Midya to Ni'lin and Ni'lin to Deir Qaddis.
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flving Checkpoint: At 12:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the Haddad Tourist Village and searched civilians and vehicles until 14:00. Raids/Air Patrol/Provocation of Palestinian Forces: At 18:30, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided the area between the town of Az Zababida and the Arab American University, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles. At 20:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Misliya, set up a checkpoint at its entrance, and searched civilians and vehicles. The Israeli army also patrolled the area until 21:30. At 21:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the area of As Suweitat in the city of Jenin. At 24:00, the Israeli army raided the city of Jenin and Jenin refugee camp. Having position in front of it, the Israeli army took photographs of the Palestinian Police station in the city of Jenin. While patrolling the Jenin refugee camp, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.

TUBAS	 Checkpoint: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the city of Tubas. Raid/Air Patrol: At 18:40, Israeli troops, dispatched by a combat helicopter, raided the area between the town of 'Aqqaba and the village of Al Kufeir, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 22:50. Settler Violence: At 09:00, a group of Israeli settlers gained access into the area of 'Ein al Hilwa near the village of Al Malih, erected tents near Bedouins' makeshift houses, and hoisted the Israeli flag on a tent belonging to Fat'hi 'Ilayyan Dharaghmeh. Consequently, Bedouins quarrelled and fought with the Israeli settlers. At 19:10, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.
TULKAREM	 Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa as well as the road connecting the villages of Shufa and 'Izbat Shufa. Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. Flying Checkpoint: At 08:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Deir al Ghusun and 'Attil and searched civilians and vehicles. Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 Closure of Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flying Checkpoints: (i) At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian. (ii) At 18:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of 'Azzun and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid/Detention: At 16:00, the Israeli army raided the village of An Nabi Elyas, detained 1 civilian, and released him at a later time. at 17:00, the Israeli army withdrew from the area. Arrests: (i) At 01:35 on 26 April 2010, the Israeli army arrested 'Azzam Yousef Saleh 'Arar during its raid into the village of Ras 'Atiya, as was reported yesterday. (ii) Israeli troops positioned at the flying checkpoint set up at the entrance to the city of Qalqiliya arrested Sakhr Tawfiq Abdul 'Aziz Hannoun. Wall Gates: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfei Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.

Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit (i) Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the southern entrance to the village of Duma; and the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the western entrance to An Nagura village opposite Shavei Shomron settlement. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the southern (iii) entrance to the village of Qaryut and the road connecting the town of 'Agraba to the village of Osarin. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed (i) on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross **NABLUS** (ii) between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. **Flying Checkpoints:** (i) At 08:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles. At 16:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Al Badhan road (ii) (the eastern entrance to the city of Nablus) and searched civilians and Raids: At 22:25, the Israeli army raided the city of Nablus and searched 1 house. At 01:15, the Israeli army raided the city again, arrested 1 civilian, and withdrew at 04:00. Arrest: The Israeli army arrested Abdul Kareem Shbaro in the city of Nablus. **Closure of Main Roads:** The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern (i) entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates (ii) the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. **SALFIT** Checkpoint: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. Flying Checkpoint: At 23:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the towns of Bruqin and Kafr ad Dik and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 23:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Kafr ad

	Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoints: At 11:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the juncture of Road # 90 in the centre of the village of Al 'Auja and searched civilians and vehicles until 11:45. At 13:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the Dead Sea and searched civilians and vehicles. At 05:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Fasayil and searched civilians and vehicles. Raid: At 19:45, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Fasayil. Arrest: At 16:30, the Israeli army arrested Falah Mohammed Falah Abu 'Abileh near the village of Al Jiftlik.
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 dunums (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of the town of Beit Fajjar; and an agricultural road connecting the town of Tuqu' to the village of Khirbet al Baq'a. Flying Checkpoint: At 22:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the northern entrance to the city of Beit Jala and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids:

- (i) At 10:15, the Israeli army raided the village of Beit Ta'mir and patrolled the area until 10:30.
- At 23:55, the Israeli army raided the town of Al 'Ubeidiya and served a (ii) summons to Shadi Mohammed Kayed Khalifeh to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency.
- Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.

Closure:

- The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city (i) of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Laban Market with iron plates, the Israeli army continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, controlling civilian access in the area.
- Having evacuated civilian residents and denied civilian access, the (ii) Israeli army continues to close the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta.

Closure of Main Roads:

- (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of Kharsa; the entrance to the Al Qeisi neighbourhood in the old city of Hebron; as well as the entrances to Al 'Arrub refugee camp, the area of Al Hawawir, the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya.
- The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from (ii)travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
- (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60.
- Flying Checkpoint: At 15:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.

Raids/House Occupation/Detentions:

- At 10:15, and again at 18:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the (i) city of Hebron.
- 00:15, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and searched 1 house. (ii)
- At 08:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Kharsa, occupied 1 (iii) house, and converted it into a military post, after having detained residents in a single room.

HEBRON

- <u>Arrests</u>: At 05:10 on 26 April 2010, the Israeli army arrested 3 civilians, including a female civilian, during its raid into the town of Beit 'Awwa, in addition to those reported yesterday:
- (i) Maysoun Abdul Jaleel as Suweiti, a female civilian;
- (ii) Ahmed Abdul 'Aziz as Suweiti; and
- (iii) Abed Ahmed Abdul 'Aziz as Suweiti.
- <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

GAZA STRIP

At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. Violation of the Ceasefire: The Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards civilians and property in the district of Khan Yunis.

NORTHERN GAZA	Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open for previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals.
GAZA	 Closure of Crossing Points: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is partially open for transportation of wheat and malt crops. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Attack: In the morning of 26 April 2010, Israeli troops positioned on the Green Line east of the area of Al Farahin east of the town of 'Abasan al Kabira opened fire towards participants in a demonstration against seam zones along the Border Fence. The Israeli army prevents farmers and landlords from accessing or attending their land in this area.

• Closure of Crossing Points: (i) Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. (ii) Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed. (iii) Sufa Crossing is closed. (iv) Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Station, and cooking gas.
