JERUSALEM	 Closurc: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also continues to close the entrances to AI Açaa Mosque compound in the old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order # S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the "demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction). Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as it overlooks the city of Jerusalem. Closure of Main Roads:

RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. <u>Flving Checkpoints/Provocation of Palestinian Forces</u>: (i) At 15:05, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the overpass to the town of 'Atara and searched civilians and vehicles until 17:15. (ii) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the town of Turmus'ayya along the Ramallah-Nablus main road, searched vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian. The Israeli army also detained 2 Palestinian Police vehicles and allowed them to cross following coordination with the Israeli authorities (through the DCO). <u>Raids</u>:
JENIN	 Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. Flving Checkpoints: (i) At 13:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Sanur and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the town of Jaba' and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 23:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the detour road connecting the town of Jaba' to the village of Yasid and searched civilians and vehicles. (iii) At 23:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Bir al Basha. (ii) At 14:00, the Israeli army raided the town of Jaba' and patrolled the area until 04:00. Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	• <u>Checkpoint</u> : Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas.
TULKAREM	Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa.

	 (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road. <u>Raid</u>: At 02:000, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Tulkarem. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks
QALQILYA	 agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. Flving Checkpoints: At 17:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint underneath the overpass to the town of 'Azzun on the Qalqiliya-Tulkarem main road and searched civilians and vehicles. At 17:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Jit and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 08:15, the Israeli army raided the villages of Hajja and Al Funduq, set up a checkpoint on the junction to the village of Al Funduq, searched civilians and vehicles, and arrested a university student. At 00:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Qalqiliya. Arrest: Israeli troops positioned at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al Funduq arrested Omar Sa'do Houtari. Construction of Military Post: At 18:50, the Israeli army reacted a military watchtower along the Wall section in the vicinity of the town of Jayyus. Wall Gate: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues south of the town of Jayyus as well as near the settlement of Alfe Menashe in the villages of Ras Tira, Magharet ad Dab'a, and Wadi ar Rasha south of the city of Qalqiliya.
NABLUS	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the southern entrances to the villages of Qaryut and Duma; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh. The Israeli army has continued to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00.

	 (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 16:40, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus and impeded civilian access. Flving Checkpoints: (i) At 15:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the city of Nablus and the town of 'Asira ash Shamaliya and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 16:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the junction to the village of Bizzariya and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 16:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jamma'in. (ii) At 10:10, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jamma'in. (ii) At 23:15, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Nablus. Arrests: At 05:40 on 28 October 2009, the Israeli army arrested 11 civilians, including 4 children, during its raid into 'Ein Beit el Ma' refugee camp in the city of Nablus, in addition to those reported yesterday: (i) Ahmed Bassam Hmeidan, 17 years old; (ii) Mohammed Lutfi Abu Khanseh, 16 years old; (iv) Ayman Ali Abu Hmeidan; (vi) Anas Sameer Ali Hussein; (vii) Hussein Mohammed Abu Dawoud; (viii) Shadi Khaled Abu Hmeidan; (ix) Kareem Fawzi Abu ar Rish; and (xi) Mu'ath al 'Awartani.
SALFIT	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 14:40, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint, denied civilian access, and reopened it at a later time. <u>Flving Checkpoint</u>: At 18:00, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Deir Istiya and searched civilians and vehicles.

	 <u>Settler Violence/Destruction of Property</u>: At 23:40, a group of Israeli settlers set fire to a civilian vehicle that had been parked near the entrance to the town of Kifl Haris. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	 <u>Closure</u>: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs. <u>Checkpoints</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. (ii) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. Flving Checkpoint: At 09:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance to the city of Jericho and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Arrest</u>: At 09:00, Israeli troops positioned at Al Hamra checkpoint arrested Nidhal Abdul Ra'ouf Sabbah, a Palestinian National Security officer.
BETHLEHEM	 <u>Closure</u>: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. <u>Checkpoint</u>: At 13:40, the Israeli army intensified its restrictions at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint and impeded civilian access. <u>Flving Checkpoint</u>: At 19:40, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles until 20:10.

	 <u>Raids/Attack:</u> At 09:00, the Israeli army raided the village of Dar Salah, set up a checkpoint, and searched civilians and vehicles until 09:30. At 17:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the city of Bethlehem. At 20:30, Israeli troops in civilian uniform raided the village of Al Maniya. Claiming to be carrying out military training, Israeli troops opened indiscriminate while searching a number of houses. At 01:10, the Israeli army raided the town of Tuqu', searched 1 house, and served summons to 4 civilians to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the town of Al Khadr; northwest of the city of Beit Jala; in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.
HEBRON	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area. On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the entrance to the town of As Samoa'; the road connecting the town of Surif to the village of Al Jab'a; the eastern entrance to the village of At Tuwani, and the town of Adh Dhahiriya. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road between the villages of Al Karmil and At Tuwani and all roads leading to Road # 60. Flving Checkpoints: At 09:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the town of Idhna and searched civilians and vehicles.

	(iii) At 19:55, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on Wadi Sa'ir
	road, searched vehicles, and arrested 1 civilian.
	<u>Raids/School Disruption</u> :
	(i) At 08:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the towns of Sa'ir
	and Ash Shuyukh.
	(ii) At 11:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Hebron and surrounded
	the Ar Rashidin School, allegedly for throwing stones. At 00:25, the
	Israeli army raided and patrolled the city again.
	(iii) At 13:000, the Israeli army raided the town of Dura and delivered
	notices for demolition of 2 houses belonging to:

	(ii) Khaled Abu Muqaddam.
	At 00:30, the Israeli army raided the town again and searched a

	• <u>Settler Violence</u> : At 21:00, a group of Israeli settlers denied access to a
	Palestinian Civil Defence fire truck to extinguish fire in an uninhabited
	house in the area of the Al Laban Market in the old city of Hebron.
	• <u>Wall Construction</u> : Wall construction continues in the section of Tarqumiya
	checkpoint terminal; in the area surrounding the settlement of Eshkolot
	near the town of Adh Dhahiriya; and in the area between the villages of 'Arab ar Ramadin and Imneizil.

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. <u>Violations of the Ceasefire:</u> (i) The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire in the district of Khan Yunis. (ii) Armed Palestinian individuals fired an unidentified mortar as well as a number of mortars towards the Green Line.

NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. <u>Palestinian Attack/Israeli Air Patrol</u>: At 12:35, armed Palestinian individuals fired a number of mortars towards Israeli troops on the Green Line east of Al Maqbara ash Sharqiya east of the town of Jabalya. Consequently, Israeli reconnaissance aircraft patrolled the skies over Palestinian territory. 		
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel. 		
CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.		
KHAN YUNIS	 <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling</u>: On 28 October 2009, the Israeli army, including 3 tanks and 2 bulldozers covered by reconnaissance aircraft raided 200 metres into Palestinian territory in the area of Al Farahin east of the city of Khan Yunis. The Israeli army also opened indiscriminate fire and levelled farmland. <u>Palestinian Attack</u>: In the evening of 28 October 2009, 1 unidentified mortar was fired towards the Green Line. 		
RAFAH	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open on an exceptional basis to allow access to 150 ill civilians, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies and humanitarian aid.
