	(i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints
	located at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. The Israeli army also
	continues to close the entrances to Al Aqsa Mosque compound in the
	old city of Jerusalem and impede civilian access to the mosque.
	(ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli authorities issued Military Order #
	S/02/09 on the closure of and denial of civilian access to the
	"demarcation area" along the Wall in the area surrounding the city of
	Jerusalem. Accordingly, local residents and civilians holding permits
	can access this area through crossings and gates set up at the entrances to the city of Jerusalem. (The demarcation area is defined by a set of
	military orders relating to land confiscation for Wall construction).
	(iii) Beginning on 02 April 2009, the Israeli army has continued to impose a
	blockade and deny civilian access to a hill located in an area between
	the village of Biddu and Beit Iksa due it its geographical significance as
	it overlooks the city of Jerusalem.

	(i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt

	• Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Al 'Eizariya
	to Ash Shayyah, from Beit Surik village to Biddu; in the areas of Al
	Judeira, Bir Nabala, and Beit Hanina; west of the village of Al Jib; in the
	vicinity of the village of Qatanna; south of the village of Beit Hanina; and
	in the area surrounding the checkpoint set up at the entrance to Shu'fat
	refugee camp.

RAMALLAH & EL BIREH	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades and cement blocks the entrances to the town of Sinjil, the village of Saffa; and the junction to the villages of Kafr Malik – 'Ein Samiya. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the cities of Ramallah and El Bireh. (ii) At 00:30, the Israeli army raided the town of Beituniya, searched 2 houses as well as 1 commercial shop, and arrested 2 civilians. <u>Demonstration/Raid/Attack</u>: At 15:50, a mass demonstration took place in the village of Saffa in protest against Wall construction. Confrontations took place between the Israeli army and protestors. Consequently, the Israeli army raided the village, opened fire, and fire tear gas grenades towards civilians. The Israeli army also arrested 1 civilian. <u>Flying Checkpoints</u>:
JENIN	 <u>Closure of Main Road</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road leading to the town of 'Arraba east of the settlement of Dotan. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which affects the educational and health conditions of civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: Though allowing civilian access to the Northern Jordan Valley between 06:00 and 22:00, the Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Tayasir checkpoint east of the town of Tubas. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At 01:35, the Israeli army raided the city of Tubas and patrolled the area until 02:15. (ii) At 02:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Aqqaba.
TULKAREM	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the western entrance to the village of Shufa. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road connecting the town of Kafr al Labad to the village of Shufa. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify restrictions at 'Einav checkpoint set up on Tulkarem-Nablus main road.

	 <u>Raid</u>: At 00:40, the Israeli army raided the city of Tulkarem and served a summons to Mu'ath al Ashqar to report to the Israeli Intelligence agency. <u>Wall Gates</u>: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits.
QALQILYA	 <u>Closure of Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of 'Azzun. <u>Flving Checkpoints/Detention</u>: At 08:15, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint in the area between the villages of Kafr Qaddum and Hajja, searched civilians and vehicles, and detained a bus transporting university students. At 13:25, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint near the entrance to the village of 'Izbat at Tabib and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Raids</u> At 16:50, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Jayyus. At 03:35, the Israeli army raided the village of Jinsafut and arrested 2 civilians (brothers), including a child. <u>Arrests</u>: On 23 October 2009, the Israeli army arrested 2 civilian residents of the village of Ras 'Atiya while they had been present inside the Green Line: Naseem Isma'il Ghaleb Shawahneh; and Mahmoud Nizar Abdullah Mara'beh. The Israeli army arrested 2 civilians in the village of Jinsafut: Ala' Subhi Basheer. <u>Attack on Property</u>: The Israeli army prevented civilian residents of the village of Kafr Qaddum from accessing their land and harvesting olive crops near the settlement of Kfar Kedumim. <u>Wall Gate</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a detector.
NABLUS	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the southern entrances to the villages of Qaryut and Duma; the eastern entrance to the village of Al Lubban Ash Sharqi; the western entrances to the town of 'Aqraba and the village of Majdal Bani Fadil; the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; and the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh. The Israeli army has continued to close with an iron gate the western entrance to the village of An Naqura opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus:

	 (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 02:00. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. Raids: (i) At dawn on 29 October 2009, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the village of Qusra. (ii) At 12:25, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of 'Aqraba. (iii) At 01:00, the Israeli army raided and patrolled the town of Qabalan. Arrests: At 20:50, Israeli troops positioned at Huwwara checkpoint arrested 2 university students; (i) Mohammed Hussein 'Uthman Najeeb; and (ii) Ibrahim Musleh Ali.
SALFIT	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to the city of Salfit. The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and iron gates the northern entrance to the town of Bruqin and the western entrance to the town of Kafr Ad Dik. <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. At 14:00, the Israeli army closed the checkpoint and denied civilian access, allegedly for investigation a suspicious object. The Israeli army reopened the checkpoint at a later time. <u>Flving Checkpoints</u>: (i) At 16:50, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to the village of Iskaka and searched civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 21:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint, closed the iron gate installed at the entrance to the town of Kifl Haris, and denied civilian access. The Israeli army reopened the iron gate and removed the checkpoint at 05:00. <u>Wall Construction</u>: Wall construction continues in the area northwest of the city of Salfit, and in the village of Marda and the town of Kifl Haris north of the settlement of Ariel.
JERICHO	• <u>Closure</u> : The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between the city of Jericho and the village of Al 'Auja with cement blocks and to prevent farmers not holding Jericho Governorate IDs from reaching their land, forcing them to apply for access permits. The Israeli army also continues to deny access to the city to holders of Israeli IDs.

	 <u>Checkpoints:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at Al Hamra checkpoint set up along Al Badhan road connecting the districts of Jericho and Nablus. However, the Israeli army allows civilian access between 06:00 and 22:00. The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to the village of Al 'Auja along Al-Mu'arrajat road that connects the districts of Jericho and Ramallah, only allowing access to civilians whose IDs indicate that their place of residence of the district of Jericho as well as to others holding access permits. <u>Raids:</u>
BETHLEHEM	 Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad as well as a detour road east of the town of Beit Fajjar. Flving Checkpoints: At 10:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the village of Jannata and searched civilians and vehicles. At 10:10, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on the junction to the area of An Nashash (the southern entrance to the city of Bethlehem) and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: At 14:15, the Israeli army raided the city of Beth Jala and 'Ayda refugee camp. While patrolling the refugee camp, confrontations took place between the Israeli army and civilians. At 14:35, the Israeli army withdrew from both areas. Deportation: At 12:30, Israeli troops positioned at As Sawahira ash Sharqiya (the 'Container') checkpoint deported Brantley Jiryes Bolus 'Azzam, a female resident of Gaza city and student at Bethlehem University, to the Gaza Strip through Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing. Wall Construction: Wall construction continues in the area of Wadi Rahhal east of Ifrat settlement; and in the area surrounding the village of Al Walaja.

• (i	Closure: The Israeli army continues to close the following locales in the old city of Hebron: Ash Shuhada' Street and the area of As Sahleh with cement blocks and barbed wire; the old gold market with an iron gate; the area of Khuzq al Far near the settlement of Abraham Avino with a dirt barricade and an iron gate; and the entrance to the area of Al Khan with an electronic gate, isolating the area from Al Laban Market and the area of As Sahleh. The Israeli army also continues to install an iron gate at the entrance to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) in the old city of Hebron, thereby controlling civilian access in the area.
(i	i) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S for closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. Despite the fact that the extension period expired, the ceasefire continues to hold pending negotiations carried out by Egypt. <u>Violations of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army raided Palestinian territory and opened intensive fire in the district of Rafah. The Israeli army also opened fire from its location on the Green Line towards a number of farmers in the district of Northern Gaza.

NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases and foreign nationals. <u>Attack</u>: At 14:00, the Israeli army opened intensive fire from its location on the Green Line towards a number of farmers east of Al Maqbara ash Sharqiya east of the town of Jabalya.
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing is closed. Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is partially open for transportation of fuel.

CENTRAL GAZA	Activities not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	Activities not reported.
RAFAH	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salim (Karem Shalom) Crossing is partially open for transportation of food supplies and humanitarian aid. <u>Raid/Air Patrol/Attack/Land Levelling</u>: At dawn on 30 October 2009, the Israeli army, including 1 tank, several armoured vehicles, and 1 bulldozer covered by reconnaissance aircraft raided Palestinian territory east of the town of Ash Shuka east of the city of Rafah. The Israeli army also opened intensive fire towards civilian houses and property as well as levelled agricultural land.
