JERUSALEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at checkpoints located at the entrance to Jerusalem city, set up several flying checkpoints on the main road leading to the city entrance and the entrance to the Old City. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the ‘demarcation area’ along the Wall in the area surrounding occupied East Jerusalem and restricts access to local residents as well as to civilians holding special permits. (iii) The Israeli army continues to impose a blockade and deny civilian access to a hill between Biddu and Beit Ikksa villages. • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks and dirt mounds the entrance to Jaba village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the gate along the Wall section separating the area of Dahiyat Al-Bareed from Al-Ram town. (iii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the eastern entrance to Beit Ikksa village and forces civilians to access Jerusalem city through Qalandia checkpoint. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> Israeli authorities continue to consider Qalandia checkpoint a “border crossing point” and designate a special crossing lane for holders of Jerusalem IDs and another for those possessing permits to access Jerusalem city. • <u>Raid:</u> At 02:00, Israeli forces raided Anata, detained a resident, and confiscated the identification cards of Rashid Al-Salaimeh, Shaker Al-Salaimeh and Fawaz Al-Salaimeh. • <u>Detention:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On October 24th 2011, Israeli forces detained Fadi Abu Lafi and Oday Khoweis after storming their homes in Jabal Al-Tur neighbourhood in Jerusalem. (ii) Israeli forces detained Mohammad Salaimeh during their raid into Anata. • <u>Wall Gates:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with cement blocks the Wall gate in Abu Dis town. (ii) The Israeli army continues to deny civilian access through the Wall gate on Al-Shayyah road in the area between Al-Sawahira Al-Sharqiya and Al-Sawahira Al-Gharbiya villages, only allowing civilians holding Jerusalem IDs to cross, after subjecting them to thorough searches using electronic devices.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the areas north and south of Qalandia village; south of Al-Zaayem village; and in Wadi Al-Eizariya west of the illegal settlement Maale Adumim.
RAMALLAH & AL BIREH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to Sinjil village as well as the junction to Kafr Malik and 'Ein Samiya villages. • Checkpoints: At 20:30, Israeli forces closed "Al-Mahakama" checkpoint near Bit El settlement, north of El-Bireh city and impeded the free flow of traffic, allegedly to work on road maintenance near the checkpoint; the checkpoint was reopened it at 06:00. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 02:00, on October 24th 2011 Israeli forces raided Ramallah, stormed a home and confiscated the identification card of Ashraf Samamra. (ii) At 00:10, Israeli forces raided El-Bireh city and stormed 3 homes. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area west of 'Abud town in the area surrounding the illegal settlement 'Ofarim and north of Al-Lubban Al-Gharbi and Rantis villages.
JENIN	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road leading to the town of Arraba east of the illegal settlement Dotan. • Raid: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 14:30, Israeli forces raided Maythaloun and Saris village, stormed an olive oil press in Saris village until 16:15. (ii) At 18:25, Israeli forces raided Al-Hafira until 20:00. • Wall Gates: Passage through the Wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits, which undercuts the access to education and health services for civilians living behind the Wall.
TUBAS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to restrict Palestinian access to the Northern Jordan Valley through the Tayasir checkpoint to between the hours of 06:00 and 22:00.
TULKAREM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the road connecting Kafr Al-Labad town to Shufa village. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the detour road leading to Ramin village along the Tulkarem-Nablus main road. • Checkpoints: Since 15:00 on October 23rd 2011 the Israeli army has closed Palestinian access at Einav checkpoint on the Tulkarem-Nablus, allegedly for road maintenance; the checkpoint is said to be closed until November 1st 2011. • Flying Checkpoints: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 12:10 and again at 16:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Bazaria junction, north of Anabta, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 14:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Ramin village junction, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raids: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 10:15, Israeli forces raided Al-Shuweika neighbourhood in Tulkarem. (ii) At 11:25, Israeli forces raided Tulkarem and set up a flying checkpoint. • Wall Gates: Passage through the wall gates is restricted to civilians granted special Israeli permits. • Wall Construction: Land levelling for adjustment of the Wall route resumed in the area surrounding Jubara village. According to an Israeli High Court decision,

	the new Wall route will be constructed west of the village.
QALQILYA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces continue to close with cement blocks agricultural roads east of the town of Azzun. (ii) In addition to closing the gate installed since the outbreak the second <i>Intifada</i>, the Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the eastern entrance to Kafr Qaddum village. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Izbat Al-Tabib village, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Jit village junction, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 11:55, Israeli forces raided Jinsafout village. • Wall Gates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to restrict access at ‘Azzun ‘Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, using a metal detector. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi Al-Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the gate at the entrance to the village of Ras Atiya; the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in Kafr Laqef village north of Karnei Shomron settlement; in Immatin village northeast of Emanuel settlement; and east of Kafr Thulth town near Maale Shomron settlement .
NABLUS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of Aqraba to the village of Osrin; and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osrin. (ii) The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to Qabalan town; the southern entrances to the town of Jamma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut. • Checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open between 07:00 and 02:00 (ii) At Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are only allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, and between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All vehicles can access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 10:50, Israeli forces increased restrictions at Huwara checkpoints, impeding the free flow of traffic. (iv) At 21:00, Israeli forces increased restriction at ShaviShomron” checkpoint, impeding the free flow of traffic. • Flying checkpoints: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Sarah village junction (on the Nablus-Qalqilya), searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 10:30, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Deir Sharaf junction

	<p>searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(iii) At 11:15, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Burin village junction.</p> <p>(iv) At 13:10, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Burqa village junction and detained a university student.</p> <p>(v) At 15:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Sabastia village junction, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <p>(vi) At 16:20, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint under Madama Bridge, searching civilians and vehicles.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Raids: At 03:00, Israeli forces raided Nablus until 03:35. • Detention: <p>(i) At 20:15, on October 23rd 2011, Israeli forces detained, Khaled Hussein during their raid into Sarah village, mentioned in the previous report.</p> <p>(ii) Israeli forces detained Hamam Atili near Burqa village junction.</p> • Temporary Detention: At 21:15, Israeli forces positioned at Huwara checkpoint detained Mohamad Awad, a Palestinian security officer, Ilham Awad and Baraq Awad and released them after intervention of security coordination at 22:00.
SALFIT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Roads: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close with dirt mounds the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to its farmland.</p> <p>(ii) Since 14 November 2010, the Israeli army has opened the northern entrance to Salfit city to civilian buses only. The entrance had been closed for seven years, and at 11:00, Israeli forces closed the entrance and impeded the free flow of traffic.</p> • Checkpoints: The Israeli army continues to increase its restrictions on access at Zatara checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • Raid: At 03:00, Israeli forces raided Marda village, detained 2 residents and withdrew at 03:30. • Detention: Israeli forces detained, Izat Suliman and Mohammad Matok during their raid into Marda village. • Wall Construction: Wall construction resumed in the area north of Deir Istiya town southeast of the illegal settlement Emmanuel.
JERICHO	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Main Road: The Israeli army continues to close Road # 90 between Jericho city and Al-Ouja village with cement blocks. • Checkpoints: <p>(i) Israeli forces continue to restrict access through Al-Hamra checkpoint set up along the road connecting Jericho and Nablus Districts, only allowing access to residents of Jericho District and the Jordan Valley area.</p> <p>(ii) Israeli forces continues to intensify its restrictions at the checkpoint set up on the junction to Al-Ouja village, only allowing access to residents of the Jericho District and others with access permits.</p> • Flying Checkpoints: At 18:00, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the southern entrance of Jericho city, searching civilians and vehicles. • Raid: At 21:45, Israeli forces raided Al-Oja village.
BETHLEHEM	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure: <p>(i) The Israeli army continues to close roads to An Numan village, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village.</p> <p>(ii) Since 15 September 2007, the Israeli army has prevented civilians from</p>

	<p>accessing or staying on 22 <i>dunums</i> of confiscated land in Al Mazmuriya area in Beit Sahur and Bethlehem cities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Closure of Main Roads:</u> The Israeli army continues to close the Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmed road; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; the road connecting Tuqu town to Khirbet al Baqa village; and the detour road connecting Wadi Fukin and Al Jaba villages. • <u>Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 09:20, the Israeli army closed “Gilo” checkpoint north of Bethlehem and impeded the free flow of traffic until 10:25. (ii) At 17:05, Israeli forces intensified its restrictions at “Container” checkpoint and impeded the free flow of traffic. • <u>Flying Checkpoints:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 13:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint near Dar Al-Salah village located at the eastern entrance of Beit Sahour,, searching civilians and vehicles. (ii) At 17:05, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance of Al-Shawawrah village and physically assaulted 2 residents after detaining them then released them after the military coordination office intervened. (iii) At 20:40, Israeli forces set up a flying checkpoint at Al-Nashash junction, searching civilians and vehicles. • <u>Raids:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) At 02:00 on October 24th 2011, Israeli forces raided Beit Fajar, searched several homes and detained 2 residents. (ii) At 03:00 on October 24th 2011, Israeli forces raided Um Salamonah, stormed a home and detained a resident. (iii) At 12:50, Israeli forces raided Um Al-Rakaba area in Al-Khader village and served Mohammad Salah demolition notices for 2 barracks for allegedly not having the required licensing; they withdrew at 13:50. • <u>Detention:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Israeli forces detained Nihad Taqatqa and Ridad Taqatqa during their raid into Biet Fajar. (ii) Israeli force detained Khaled Hajajrah during their raid into Um Salamonah village. • <u>Wall Construction:</u> Wall construction resumed in northwest of Beit Jala town .

At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire. The ceasefire has been further renewed on 10 August 2011 at 21:00. • Israeli forces broke the ceasefire agreement as it raided and opened fire towards North Gaza and Rafah while Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah.
<p style="text-align: center;">NORTHERN GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Point: Beit Hanun (Erez) is open to previously- coordinated patients, foreign journalists, staff of international organizations, merchants, business people and civilians travelling to Jordan through Al-Karama (Allenby) bridge in the West Bank. • Attack: At 17:30, on October 23rd 2011, Israeli forces positioned at the Green Line opened fire towards several civilians in Beit Hanoun crossing.
<p style="text-align: center;">GAZA</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) Al-Muntar (Karni) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 02 March 2011, the Crossing has been effectively closed following a unilateral Israeli decision. (ii) Al-Shija'iyah (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed following a unilateral Israeli decision.
<p style="text-align: center;">Khan Yunis</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aerial Surveillance: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On the morning of October 24th 2011, Israeli aircraft surveyed the skies of Khan Yunis district. (ii) On the evening of October 24th 2011, Israeli helicopters surveyed the skies of Al-Qarara village.
<p style="text-align: center;">RAFAH</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Closure of Crossing Points: <u>Yasser 'Arafat International</u> Airport remains closed. • Rafah (<i>Al Awdah</i>) Crossing is closed • Sufa Crossing is closed. • Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing is open for the transportation of food supplies, goods, humanitarian aid and cooking gas as well as 30 imported vehicles and construction material designated to internationally funded projects. • Al Awda crossing – Rafah is open for patients, students and civilians with permits. • Raids: On the morning of October 24th 2011, Israeli forces escorted several bulldozers and raided an area east of Al-Shoakeh, opened fire towards fields as they levelled a plot of land. • Attack: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (i) On the morning of October 24th 2011, Israeli naval vessels opened fire towards Palestinian fishermen off the shores of Rafah. (ii) On the morning of October 24th 2011, Israeli forces positioned at the Green Line opened fire towards an area north Al-Shoakeh, east of Rafah. (iii) On the evening of October 24th 2011, Israeli tanks positioned at the Green Line fired artillery shells towards Yasser Arafat International Airport located east of Rafah.
