	 <u>Wall Gates:</u> The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions at 'Azzun 'Atma Wall gate and to search civilians, including students, with a metal detector. The Israeli army continues close with an iron gate the entrance to the village of Wadi ar Rasha and to deny civilian access. The Israeli army allows residents to access the village through Gate #109. Having removed the iron gate at the entrance to the village of Ras 'Atiya, the Israeli army only allows students to cross to their schools outside the village through the Habla gate.
NABLUS	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close the roads of Till-Burin and Beit Furik-Salem; the settler bypass road connecting the village of Deir al Hatab to the settlement of Alon Moreh; the road connecting the town of 'Aqraba to the village of Osarin, and the detour road between the town of Qabalan and the village of Osarin. The Israeli army continues to close the northern entrance to the town of Qabalan; the southern entrances to the town of Janma'in and the villages of Duma and Qaryut; and the western entrance to An Naqura village opposite the settlement of Shavei Shomron. <u>Checkpoints</u>: The Israeli army continues to regulate times for crossing checkpoints set up around the city of Nablus: (i) At Tur neighbourhood checkpoint (set up on Jerzim Mount) is closed on Fridays and Saturdays as well as during Jewish holidays. On all other days, it is open for civilian residents of the neighbourhood only between 07:00 and 20:00. (ii) At 'Awarta commercial checkpoint, civilians are allowed to cross between 05:00 and 20:00, but between 05:00 and 15:00 on Fridays. All civilian vehicles are allowed to access the city of Nablus, but only commercial vehicles and ambulances can leave the city through the checkpoint. (iii) At 18:30, the Israeli army intensified restrictions and impeded civilian access at the checkpoint set up an flying checkpoint on the junction to Qusin village and searched civilians and vehicles. <u>Raids</u>: (i) At dawn on 14 October 2010, the Israeli army raided Qabalan town and arrested two civilians. (ii) At 02:20, the Israeli army raided Nablus city and Balata refugee camp and patrolled these areas until 05:00.

	Settler Violence:
	(i) At 20:00, a group of Israeli settlers threw stones at civilian vehicles travelling along the main road between Duma and Al Mughayyir villages, breaking the windshield of a vehicle and injuring civilians with the broken glass. Subsequently, the Israeli army evacuated settlers from the area.
	 (ii) At 03:10, a group of Israeli settlers raided Huwwara town and attempted to gain entry into a civilian house in order to access and attack an adjacent mosque. Civilians managed to confront and force settlers to withdraw from the area.
	 <u>Closure of Main Roads</u>: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the northern entrance to Salfit city and with cement blocks the northern entrance to the Bruqin town. The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the entrance to two detour roads connecting Marda village to respective farmland.
SALFIT	 <u>Checkpoint</u>: The Israeli army continues to intensify its restrictions and impede civilian access at the Za'tara junction checkpoint. <u>Flving Checkpoints</u>: (i) At 19:20, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint at the entrance to Deir Istiya town and searched civilians and vehicles.

BETHLEHEM	 (i) The Israeli army continues to close the roads to the village of An Nu'man, with the exception of the road leading to the Wall gate in the south-eastern area of the village. (ii) According to Military Order # 07/02/S, the Israeli army has continued since 15 September 2007 to deny civilian access to an area measuring 22 <i>dunums</i> (5.436 acres) of land in the area of Mazmuriya in the cities of Beit Sahur and Bethlehem. The land was confiscated pursuant to Military Order # 07/31/T. Closure of Main Roads: The Israeli army continues to close with dirt barricades the road of Beit Jala-Wadi Ahmad; a road east of Beit Fajjar town; and a rural road connecting Tuqu' town to Khirbet al Baq'a village. Flying Checkpoint: At 09:30, the Israeli army set up a flying checkpoint on An Nashash junction (the southern entrance to Bethlehem city) and searched civilians and vehicles. Raids: (i) At 10:05, the Israeli army raided and patrolled Kisan village. (ii) At 12:00, the Israeli army raided Khallet Abu Humid area east of Ar Rashayida village, dismantled a number of tents, and demolished four barracks belonging to Bedouin families. At 13:30, the Israeli army withdrew from the area.
	Rahhal east of Efrat settlement; and in the area surrounding Al Walaja.
HEBRON	 <u>Closure:</u> The Israeli army continues to close Ash Shuhada' Street, As Sahleh and Khuzq al Far areas, and the old gold market in the old city of Hebron. In addition to closing the entrance to Al Qeisi neighbourhood, the Israeli army continues to close the entrances to the area of Al Hisba (the fruits and vegetables market) with an iron gate and Al Laban Market with iron plates. (ii) On 05 January 2009, the Israeli army issued Military Order # 09/06/S on the closure of the area located along the Green Line south of the town of Yatta, evacuation of civilian residents, and prevention of civilian access to the area. According to Military Orders # 05/03/T and 05/04/T, land in this area was confiscated for Wall construction. Closure of Main Roads: (i) The Israeli army continues to close the entrances to As Samoa' and Adh Dhahiriya, Al 'Arrub refugee camp, and At Tuwani village.

(ii)	The Israeli army continues to prohibit Palestinian vehicles from travelling along Ash Shalala Old Street in the old city of Hebron.
(iii)	The Israeli army continues to close the road between Al Karmil and At
	Tuwani villages; all roads leading to Road # 60; and the road connecting Surif town to Al Jab'a village.

ALL DISTRICTS	 At 02:00 on 18 January 2009, the unilateral ceasefire declared by the Israeli authorities came into effect. At a later time on the same day, armed Palestinian groups announced an agreement to cease fire for a week. Later, armed Palestinian groups extended the ceasefire until 05 February 2009. The ceasefire continues to hold. <u>Violations of the Ceasefire</u>: The Israeli army opened fire from its location on the Green Line on civilian houses and property in Northern Gaza district, injuring a child. The Israeli navy opened fire on Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the Rafah district's beach.
NORTHERN GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Point</u>: Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing is partially open to previously-coordinated humanitarian cases, foreign journalists, international organisations staff, merchants, businesspeople, and civilians intending to travel to Jordan through Al Karama (Allenby) Bridge in the West Bank. <u>Attack/Injury</u>: In the morning of 13 October 2010, the Israeli army opened fire from its location on the Green Line on a number of civilians near Beit Hanun (Erez) Crossing north of Beit Hanun town, injuring 16-year-old Yihya Mahmoud az Za'anin.
GAZA	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points</u>: (i) Al Muntar (Karnei) Crossing closed. (ii) Ash Shuja'iya (Nahal 'Oz) Crossing is closed. Beginning on 04 January 2010, the Crossing has been closed upon an Israeli unilateral decision.
CENTRAL GAZA	• Events not reported.
KHAN YUNIS	• Events not reported.
RAFAH	 <u>Closure of Crossing Points:</u> Yasser 'Arafat International Airport remains closed. Rafah (Al 'Awdah) Crossing was open to allow civilians, patients, students, and civilians holding visas to depart the Gaza Strip. Access was also allowed to civilians and patients, who had received medical treatment at Egyptian hospitals. Sufa Crossing is closed. Karm Abu Salem (Karem Shalom) Crossing was partially open for transportation of food supplies, humanitarian aid, diesel designated for the Gaza Electricity Generation Plant, and cooking gas. In addition, 20 private vehicles were transported to the Gaza Strip through the Crossing. <u>Attack</u>: At dawn on 15 October 2010, the Israeli navy opened intensive fire on Palestinian fishing boats at sea off the city of Rafah's beach.
